PART E: Comments

I had visited the PACT centre near IIT market. The manager (Satyam) and the other volunteers there gave a brief overview of the ration distribution services offered through the centre. They asked me go through the health check process like any other community beneficiary. My details were registered on the system and temperature/BP/SP02 were measured and recorded. I was shown the medicines/vitamins/sanitary pads/oxygen cylinders that were stocked for distribution. They also demonstrated the process used for telemedicine. It was good to see that this project had specific goals based on the immediate needs of the local community and their efforts seemed focused on those. The other noteworthy aspect of the operation was the young volunteers who were running the show. They are all local residents and most of them have passed through the Asha education programs. They seemed confident and quick learners - this project has imparted computer/soft skills (interacting with/interviewing different people, maintaining data/accounts etc)
