

Introduction

Name of the Organization : Alok Charitable Trust & Diksha Foundation

Project Title : KHEL (Knowledge Hubs for Education and Learning)

Project Area/location : Slum area of Tesh-Lal-Verma Nagar, Lalu Nagar, Khajpura, Rupaspur,

and Ashiyana More near Jagdeo Path, Rukanpura and Ara Garden.

Introduction about the Project

Knowledge Hubs for Education and Learning (KHEL), Patna project is an after school supplementary education program. It focuses on the economically and socially backward communities. It was started in



December 2010. We have successfully completed three years and nine months. There are 91 children belonging to the age group of 4-16 years as first generation learners, 17 peer group students, and 36 young girls of 16-25 years of the age group as computer trainees who are regular at our KHEL Centre. In March 2012 Asha Prude supported in setting up computer lab at KHEL centre, Patna. Fully funded by Asha for Education since January 2013 KHEL Project continues to receive funds from Asha with Gaurav

Nanda as Anchor from Asha for the KHEL Project. We would like thanks to our donors, friends and well-wishers to their continuous support.

Our Education Center intends to develop basic learning skills (reading, writing, and arithmetic), and life skills important for the child's growth & development. These competencies represent levels of learning in a particular subject comprising basic knowledge, understanding, abilities, interests, attitudes and values.

Area profile

The community members of Tesh-Lal-Verma Nagar, Lalu Nagar, Khajpura, Rupaspur, and Ashiyana More near Jagdeo Path, Rukanpura and Ara Garden are illiterate & socially backward and have migrated from rural areas. A majority of them are daily wage earners working as construction workers, cooks, carpenter, and are in other petty trades.

Patna KHEL Center Profile

In our centre facilities relating to teaching-learning processes such as maps, library books, globes, teaching learning materials, display board, suggestion box, sports materials, musical Instruments, computers and newspaper are available. Infrastructural facilities i.e. chair, mats, blackboard, chalk and duster, filter, electricity, safe drinking water is also provided.




To enhance learning environment for inclusive, quality and child-friendly education for children coming from the most marginalized communities.

Classroom Teaching-Learning Processes -

Our teaching learning process starts with the Morning assembly where prayers are recited, the pledge for national integration is taken and children give vent to creative thinking through, poems, stories & songs. Newspaper reading & quiz questions are an integral part of the assembly for general awareness.





We try to create learning & child friendly learning environment in the class room. The teacher-student ratio is 1:25 respectively.

In the Class room teaching learning materials like library books, maps, globe etc. are used to create activity based learning. Flash cards for language and mathematics are used in the Classrooms to enable teachers to handle multi grade and multi-level classroom. Teacher, Ex- Volunteers &peer groups help the weak students.

Every class enjoys 15 min of Play for Physical, Lingual, Socio-emotional, & Cognitive development. Every Sunday Theatre, drama, music, group discussions, movie screenings organized.

English Learning Experiences of Group A

The last Quarter (July to September) saw a lot of Colour based activity where in students identified objects matched them with the alphabet and Colored them as per their imagination. Rhyme and rhythm gave the kids musical wings to soar high. They learnt alphabet and matched pictures with their names learned word families and placed various animals, birds, and fruits in their families. They also enacted simple actions and did pictures reading.

English Learning Experience of Group B

Children learnt to follow simple clear instructions. They were given tasks in easy Language to ensure clarity. Activity based experience and tasks were given to enhance the scope for classroom interaction .A wide range of fun activities like word grids & puzzles were given to get insight into the child understanding of the parts of Speech explained in the second quarter (which included noun, verbs, adjective, prepositions & conjunctions.

English Learning Experience of Group C

Children were exposed to a number of words which helped them in constructing simple sentences. They were guided to plan, think and execute their thoughts through simple sentences. Oral exercises helped them in raising questions & extracting answers from their colleagues.

In Vocational Training Classes written & oral test are organized from time to time.

Assessment and Examination of Students

We do continuous oral and written assessment. Marks are not allotted; only remarks are given for their assessment. We keep a watch on every child's academic growth. Assessment reports are discussed with parent's parents meeting & during community visit.

Health & Hygiene Awareness program

We know Health is an important determinant of the quality of life that people lead. From time to time teachers brainstorm the students on health related matters. Preventive health care measures related to Anaemia, Malnutrition, Immunization and building public toilets are discussed. Health hazards such as Cigarette smoking & alcoholism & bringing about a change in social norms to ensure greater equity and access to good health for Children is discouraged

Twinkle kumari prepared power point presentation about AIDS Awareness & Prevention .She shared about the component of AIDS with the students.

Ministers of Balsansad related to health (Shubham Kumar & Rakesh Kumar) do weekly check-up of nails, hair, tongue and overall cleanliness.

Celebration and Events

This quarter witnessed celebrations like Independence day and Teacher's Day. Various activities like music, dance and Quiz sessions were held.





On 22nd Aug 2014, a Health Awareness session on AIDS was taken by Nandani Mazumdar from Naaz Foundation.



Community Visit

Ten community visits have been organized in this quarter and the initiative taken by the teachers and Bal sansad members has helped in increasing the attendance of the irregular children .Parents were mobilized to keep track of their child's progress and participate in parents teacher meeting.

Extracurricular Activities and Innovation

Open House meeting

Open house meeting is organized every month, is chaired by the prime minister of Bal Sansad who reviews previous work & focuses on the progress of Math, Computer, English, and Hindi. Further future planning includes discussing problems at the centre & finding solutions. Suggestions and complaints are dropped in the suggestion box and followed up by students in every open house meeting.



Formation of Bal Sansad

September saw hectic activity with Bal sansad Candidates filing their Nomination papers for various ministerial Posts . Elections were held on the 5th of September & the 2nd Bal Sansad took their oath on 7th of September 2014. With dissolution of the 1st Bal sansad on 2nd of September all newly elected candidates geared themselves for future activities.
