4. Community development activities, if any (apart from education).

Alok Charitable Trust and Diksha Foundation are implementing Prarabdh village Improvement Project. ACT has been working in the village for the last 20 years and has been engaged in community development in the areas of health, women empowerment & agriculture. Please find below a brief snapshot of the activities undertaken.

Vocational training under "Earn while you Learn programme"

While the trust encourages the community to enrol children in the education programme, livelihood remains a matter of concern, directly impacting the chances of receiving education for the child. The 'earn while you learn' programme seeks to combine vocational training with the mainstream education. Apart from the curricula classes approved by the UP education board the children/ young adults undergo a series of training in candle and chalk making, sewing and embroidery, book binding, agricultural management, crop care, etc. The products developed out of the training hours are sold in the market and the proceeds are re-distributed amongst the students. Thus, ensuring a constant flow of income (even though restricted by number of hours of production in order to maintain a balance), additional skill training and contextual relevance to education received.

Youth Initiative

In order to involve the youth in the region in constructive development activities, Yuvak Mangal Dal (YMD) was championed by the Trust. The YMD organizes the youth

in the region in a coherent group with a mandate of introducing development initiatives of local relevance in the villages. The young adults part of the YMD receive constant knowledge support through interactive workshops on local emerging concerns of health and hygiene, active citizenship, infrastructural development for the benefit of the community and volunteerism.

The YMD has actively engaged in campaigns on 'Clean Communities', Waste Management, Against Alcoholism, Education for all, Clean Energy for Living in the last few years at the village and Block levels. Volunteers of YMD supported the Trust through voluntary labour services in the construction and expansion of the school.

Agri-support services

ACT has constantly believed in making education relevant to the local context. The trust has facilitated several training programmes and one to one services through agri-experts to the farmers of Bulandshahar district through training in crop care, improved agri-techniques for increased productivity, Dairy and animal husbandry. ACT in collaboration with PARAG DAIRY has improved the breed of cattle in the region as well as upkeep of the cattle. Gangagarh village (Pahasu Block) under the programme had been declared the second largest milk producing village in whole district (as per government records).

<u>Health and Hygiene</u>

ACT has designed numerous interventions in collaboration with UNICEF, VHIE, and DAVP towards maintaining exemplary health and hygiene standards in the local communities. Some of these include village sanitation initiative (in collaboration with UNICEF), RADHA (Rural Action For Development And Health Avenues) reaching out to 1000s of women in the Bulandshahr district, UPVHA training of high school students and teachers from village schools in the region for health and hygiene training as youth health workers.

- 13. Expansion plans for the future.

Future plan for expansion:-

- We are currently working with 69 children; we plan to increase our capacity to 100 children.
- A computer lab is to be established with 5 computers. This will help us incorporate ICT based teaching methods in our day to day activities with the children. In the evening the lab will be utilized for computer training of youth. There is a high demand for manpower equipped with computer skills, especially for data entry jobs.
- We plan to become an Information Centre sharing details of different schemes of Government for the community and helping them in documentation, etc for availing the schemes.
- Mini- library for the children and their parents.
- 14. Number of other schools in the project area and the range of classes offered by them.

There is a Primary School run by the Local Government 2 kms from the centre; it falls under the Lalunagar area. The primary school operates class-1 to class-5. There is another Government Upper Primary School is situated. that comes under Khajpura area, which is around 3 kms away from the centre. There are also some private schools in the area but they cater to relatively well off children.

15. Differences in the program provided at your school(s) to other schools in the project area.

The KHEL Model (Knowledge Hub for Education and Learning) envisages establishing open learning spaces for socially and economically disadvantaged children and youth. KHEL does not limit itself to helping the child acquire basic literacy but focuses on holistic learning so that the child grows intellectually and not mechanically as often happens in the context of schools/institutions serving the underprivileged.

We believe that education is the greatest tool to empower children and to help bring about transformation in the society. Our target community has limited access to educational resources, our KHEL centre offers them holistic learning. The project is a bottom-up intervention led jointly by the children and the facilitators.

The project includes supplementary/remedial education to address the issue of basic literacy and adoption of child friendly methods of learning and context specific education to enhance their intellectual well being. For the children's intellectual growth focus is on use of creative arts - learning through theatre, drama, music, group discussions, movie screenings, and book clubs. The centre also plans to offer the youth skill development training in areas of their interest.

17. Brief description of the type of education provided and teaching techniques employed (syllabus, vocational training etc.)

The goal of the KHEL (Knowledge Hub for Education and Learning) project is to create a self-sustainable learning eco-system which helps children become educated and empowered citizens.

Elements of the KHEL Model

- Remedial class/supplementary education for the children of the target area (student profile enclosed).
- Computer training to youth of the area
- Mini-library for the children and community members

We offer supplementary/remedial education to address learning needs of children who have never been to school or have dropped out of school .Gradually the children are encouraged to enrol in school. We have developed a relationship with the Local Government School and some of our children have taken admission there. Our class timings do not clash with the timings of the local school - so children can attend both simultaneously. There are multiple schemes linked with the government schools - like mid-day meal, uniforms, some scholarships which the children are able to avail. Gradually we plan to expand our influence on the Government School through teacher & parents training programmes.

The teaching methodology adopted in KHEL is child friendly. We believe that Learner and Teacher are interchangeable roles- in our Hilsa Centre; Ms. Sudha Kumari teaches children Maths and Hindi in the morning sessions and attends computer

classes as a student in the evening sessions. Teachers are flexible and they try to build a healthy environment for learning-the focus is on reducing fear and anxiety among children.

The children are divided into small groups of 5-6 children each, each group sits around a round table. The student-teacher ratio is maintained at 1:20 - so that the teacher can focus attention on each group. Various teaching aids are used- games, role plays, movies, etc. An experiential learning visit to the Patna Science Centre and Golghar (Granary) was organized recently.

Children are assigned to groups on the basis of their proficiency level in the subject. So the same child might be attending classes for Level 3 for Maths but Level 1 for English- this is a typical scenario as most children face difficulty in English. In the supplementary education - children are taught Hindi, English, Maths, Computers and Creative Arts.

Beginners who are not familiar with English alphabets, numbers, word recognition etc. attend classes for Level 1. In English, they are taught alphabets both capital as well as small, in Math they are taught counting between 1 to 100 and basic numeric problems of addition and subtraction and in Hindi, recognition of words and alphabets are taught. Thus, the course for Level 1 is to strengthen their basic learning.

Level 2 comprises of children who have the basic knowledge of recognizing letters and word in both English and Hindi. They have an understanding of addition, subtraction and multiplication on math subject. They are taught other numeric problems with the help of a text book. In English and Hindi poems, word meanings and grammar are taught with the help of text books. Thus, the syllabus of Level 2 is designed as per the level of their understanding.

Most children coming to the Centre attend classes in Level 1 and 2. Some older children are divided into Level 3 and above -and they are taught accordingly. One day in the week is dedicated to co-curricular activities which include sports, drawing, quizzes, group discussion; movie shows etc. so that children are able to achieve their creative potential.

All books, copies and stationary are provided free of cost to the children. We use NCERT text books for teaching English, Maths and Hindi. The details of the content for each book can be accessed at the following link http://www.ncert.nic.in/NCERTS/textbook/textbook.htm Books from other publishers like Eklavya, Digantar- are used as reference books.

Computer Lab-We seek to combine the existing teaching methodology in the centre with computer based learning through on-line and off-line computer games, films, puzzles, songs and poem. The use of games in computer education will also generate interest and raise the comfort levels of students towards using the ICT tools. The same facility will be utilized to offer computer training to the youth of the target

area. The proposed training would include use of Windows as an Operating System, MS Office, and basic Internet and web based applications. We have tied up with Microsoft and will be using the Microsoft Unlimited Potential Programme curriculum for the same- details of the curriculum can be accessed at the below link-

18. Parental involvement in school operations (setting school syllabus etc.)

Parents are regularly updated about their children's progress through community visits. Typically, two community visits are organized every month -where the teachers visit the children's home and discuss the progress of the wards in meeting with the Community Leaders/Elders. This has helped in ensuring good attendance levels.

19. Future education/employment possibilities of children in your school(s) and the related involvement of your group.

One of the goals of our Supplementary/Remedial Education Programme is the mainstreaming of children into government schools. We have established a relationship with the Government Primary School in the project area, and some of our students have taken admission there. We continue to support the students through classes before/after school hours.

We help the students of the Computer Training Programme in applying for jobs. Bihar Government has a high demand for data entry operators well versed in Hindi typing. We have incorporated Hindi typing in our curriculum so that students might get a chance for jobs. In the future, we plan to set up a dedicated Placement cell for the students of the computer training programme.

20. Source of your motivation to be involved in the project.

Alok Charitable Trust has been established in the memory of Late Lt. Alok Gupta. The trust has been serving the serving for the last 20 years. Our work derives its primary motivation from the love and commitment shared by Alok towards the society and the country.

We are also motivated by our association with the Honey Bee Network, Prof Anil Gupta, Founder- Honey Bee Network, is a member of the Trust and actively supports us in bringing out the creativity and innovation amongst children.

The project has also received immense support from Youth Collective. We would specially like to mention the work being done by Mr. Ravi Gulati and his organization Manzil (www.manzil.in) .The KHEL Model is inspired by the work being done at Manzil, and incorporates many of the elements of Manzil's learning programmes.

The state of Bihar where the project is being executed has one of the lowest levels in the country. But in the past few years, the scenario has drastically improved on all development parameters. Thus, there exists a safe and conducive environment for the initiative, with the Local Government keen to achieve development of the people.
