3. Briefly describe the motivation for starting this group.

Digambarpur Angikar was established since 2000 by a group of dedicated social activist of Sundarban region with a view to undertake relief and rehabilitation as well as development initiatives for empowerment of women and children and other vulnerable sections of socio-economically backward SC/ST/OBC/Minority communities. Since inception the organisation has been involved in the rural development and social action programmes for establishing women and child rights in the Sundarban region.

4. Briefly describe the aims of your group.

Vision:

Digambarpur Angikar visualizes an egalitarian society where people irrespective of caste creed religion can enjoy their basic human rights with equal access to resources for quality in life and livelihood.

Mission:

It is our mission to strengthen the empowerment process of the most vulnerable women and children so that they can realize and protect their basic human rights.

Goals:

Develop the livelihood status of disadvantaged people in rural communities;

Promote empowerment of women and child rights;

Strengthen care and protection of vulnerable children;

Mobilize community people and make them aware of education, health and livelihood opportunities;

Provide access to health services and promote the adoption of better health practices;

Facilitate sustainable livelihoods development through training on agriculture, animal husbandry and handicrafts;

Strengthen self help groups and other community based organizations;

To stop discriminating factor based on caste, creed, sex, clan and colour.

Our organisation has no political and religious affiliation.

6. What non education-related community development activities is your group involved in?**a) Child Care & Protection:-**

Homes at Digambarpur for 50 destitute girls under Cottage Scheme and 150 CNCP Girls under JJ Act has been functioning. The Directorate of Social Welfare, Child Rights & Trafficking, Government of West Bengal has been providing support.

Running 24 hours ChildLine sub centre at Canning sponsored by CHILDLINE India Foundation;

b) Health:-

Running TI project to prevent and control HIV/AIDS/STDs among 420 flying and brothel based Female Sex Workers at Canning, Ghutiary Sharif and Sashan Baruiipur, sponsored by the West Bengal State AIDS Prevention & Control Society;

Running programmes of RNTCP at Gosaba, Basanti, Canning I & II blocks sponsored by District Health & Family Welfare Samiti, South 24 Parganas District .

c) Water and Sanitation:-

With the financial assistance of District Sanitation Cell (Swachha Bharat Mission Gramin) South 24 Parganas 20660 house hold latrines has been constructed.

184 tube wells have been installed and renovated, 750 Household water line connection has also been implementing at Patharpratima block and about 300000 people get safe drinking water. Water for People, USA has sponsored the activities.

d) Livelihood:-

The project Socio Economic Empowerment of 11000 Tribal families has been running by the organization at Sandeshkhali I Block in North 24 Parganas District with the financial assistance from Bharat Rural Livelihood Foundation, New Delhi.

1. Angikar Kishalaya Niketan, a Upper Primary level education centre for 162 students at Digambarpur, Patharpratima, South 24 Parganas
2. Four Creches for 100 babies at Digambarpur GP, Patharpratima, South 24 Parganas
3. Pre primary schools (3) for 180 Infants at Canning & Ghutiary Sharif and Mallickpur, South 24 Parganas
4. Pre primary school for 30 infants at Ghutiarysharif, South 24 Parganas

We have been providing education to the target CNCP girls from Class I to XII by enrolling them in the school of the organisation and local public schools for higher education.

1. Angikar Kishalaya Niketan - 721 children are enrolled in the local public schools for continuing higher education.
 2. Creches for babies - 600 Elderly children are enrolled in SSKs / Primary schools
 3. Pre Primary School for infants of CSWs - 88 are enrolled in SSKs / Primary schools
- Moreover we arrange education for our girls of Homes by enrolling in the local public schools.

19. Do you help your students with their future education efforts after they have passed out of your school?

We help our students to admit in public school for continuing education. We have also provide library facilities for them. We sponsor some children for education materials support and continuing education. CNCP girls of our Home enrolled in public schools for continuing higher education.. Last year 5 CNCP girls passed the Madhyamik examination.

20. Are there any other schools (Kindergarten/Balwadi, Elementary school, High school) in the area? If so, please list the schools and the range of classes each of them offers.

There are SSK, primary school and high school in the area from class I to X. The list is given below.

21. Is your program different from that provided at these schools? Please explain.

Our programme is different from other schools. In our proposed programme there will be provisions for education materials and coaching for 100 girls and vocational training. Girls will be coached by private tutors to prepare their lessons and upgrade their knowledge. Vocational training will be provided to equip 50 girls with skills and upgrade their capacity for quality production and income generation. These facilities are not available in other schools.

22. Why are the children in your school/s not attending government/other schools in the local area?

There is no such infrastructure and facilities for education of CNCP girls in the government school. These girls are referred from Government Social Welfare department to our home for shelter and care.

23. Do you try to involve the parents of the children in the running of the school (e.g. in setting the syllabus etc.)? Please specify.

There is no opportunity to involve parent of the CNCP girls in proposed activities as they belong to different areas and lack of capacity to involve.

24. What are your expansion plans for the future (e.g. adding more classes or schools)?

It is a new programme and at present we have no expansion plan for the future.

25. Do you have any suggestions on how Asha can be a positive influence in changing the education scenario in India?

Asha's support will establish the Rights to Education and Childhood Development for the CNCP girls in backward Sundarban region of South 24 Parganas district.
