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PART A: Particulars about the organization and its environment

Saugaht Foundation is run by an Executive Committee (EC) elected for 3 years by their General Body (GB). There are 21 members in their GB, who elect 5 members in their EC. The President of the organization (Mr. Jitendra Kumar Pandey) is the chief functionary, who is assisted by the Secretary (Mr. Uday Pratap Singh) of this NGO. At the grass root level there are 32 workers functioning as project staff in various levels for various projects. In addition to that a good number of local community volunteers extend their support for this organization.

PART B: The organization and the community it serves

1. Approximately how many families live in the area? Approximately there are 200 families, residing in the area (in and around Patt village)

2. What do the parents do for a living? (Agricultural worker, Daily wage laborer etc.)

Most of the parents are daily wage labourers, working under labour contractors for various construction projects within the block area. Some male members seasonally go outside the area, in nearby city to earn livelihood. Apart from these, some parents are also engaged in agriculture and animal husbandry in very small scale. Most of them go to forest regularly to collect various types of forest products and many of them have expertise in identifying medicinal plants. They collect those herbs from forest to sell those items in nearby markets and earn some money. However most of them don't have any steady source of income. The overall pattern of livelihood is very feeble and unstable.

3. At the time of enrolment, does the school ask for the names of both parents?

4. How often do the teachers meet the parents?

Teachers meet the parents monthly in group. Apart from that sometimes parents come to meet the teachers individually.

5. How do the parents participate in the organization's activities? (e.g. by contributing their time, money or labor in the school's activities etc.)

As such the parents don't participate in the organization's regular activities in the school; however during special events on special days, for example, in the national flag hoisting ceremony on Independence Day/ Republic Day cultural events of the school etc, some of the enthusiastic parents also participate.

7. If yes, how far are the Government Schools from the community?

There are 2 Government Schools in Phakiradih Panchayat. One primary school (Std 1 - 5) is located at a distance of about 2 kms from the project school and one Middle - High school is located more than 4 kms away. But there is no government pre-primary school (Anganwadi School) in this area in and around Patt village.

8. Why did the parents choose this school over the Government School?

Since there is no preschool (government anganwadi) in the area , the parents didn't have any other option but to admit their children in this project school.

9. When you visited, how many children were present in the class?

During my visit 43 children were present in two sections of the school

What is the regular class strength?

The regular roll strength is 50 children

Comments: During the day of my visit it was raining in the morning. Some students might not have come due to bad weather condition. However the roll call register shows good number of daily present children.

10. Do the children seem to enjoy coming to school?

Yes, response from the children was really appreciable during my interaction with the children . It seems that the teachers follow joyful learning method and children enjoy that teaching technique and they are keen to come to school regularly.

In the beginning of the project (about 4 years ago) the organization conducted an orientation program for the project teachers where one experienced teacher (trainer) was invited from a city (Daltonganj) based KG School. The teachers were given training on the methodology of non conventional joyful learning. The project holder mentioned that the teachers and the supervisor are also sent for exposure visits to other Nursery Schools /KG schools in Daltonganj town.

10. How much is the staff paid?

Comments: According to Mr. Pandey (the project holder), due to price hike the cost of midday meal for children has been increasing day by day and the budget, which was approved in the last year has become insufficient in the current year.

3. Is there anything you think should be added or removed from the budget?

If you recommend any changes to the budget, please explain your reasons for this.

It is felt that the project is giving insufficient amount of salary to all the project staff. The teachers expressed their dissatisfaction about the salary amount. They mentioned that in comparison to government schools of same levels they are getting less than half of amount, the govt. Anganwadi teachers get in Jharkhand. It is felt that increment of salaries of all staff should be made, which is being recommended for consideration. This salary enhancement will be helpful to improve the motivation level of the project staff to do better work.

Regarding the cost of children's midday meal, in view of the market price hike, slight budget enhancement is also recommended, which will enable the project holder to continue with providing proper nutritional support for the children.

It is recommended that some budget provisions should be made separately for cultural and sport activities for the children. This will help for all-round development of the children from their early childhood.

4. Did you discuss the proposed changes with the project? If so, please describe their response.

Yes , I discusseed the proposed changes with Mr. Pandey, the project holder. In fact the project holder raised these issues during the site visit and requested me to recommend the proposed changes .
