3. *Briefly described the motivation for starting this group.*

BASUNDHARA

BASUNDHARA is a Voluntary Organization registered under the Society Registration Act 1860. It was established in the year 1985 and has been working restlessly to achieve its purpose since that. Working as an ideal rehabilitation center for the children, women and elders in distress, their care, shelter and long-term rehabilitation is its prime concern.

The VISION of the Organization is creation of a Just Society where every child will enjoy the right to a dignified life. The model of which must base on equality and justice. The MISSION is introducing the orphan, abandoned and destitute children into the main stream of life and the empowerment of the destitute and distressed women through self help packages and professional trainings.

Basundhara provides educational sponsorship to the poor, slum & unprivileged meritorious students. It provides the talented stagnated and dropout students a new lease of opportunity for shaping their future. Basundhara also runs an emergency Childline Help that people can reach out to, if they find a child in a difficult situation. The Helpline is a toll-free phone service that runs round the clock to provide timely assistance to children in difficult circumstances. The project is the brainchild of the CHILDLINE India Foundation, Mumbai and subsequently implemented by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India in 39 major cities of our country.

SAIS Basundhara

At Basundhara, the home for the orphaned, abandoned and wronged children – the volunteers deeply felt the need for a school with the specific ambience of abundant empathy and infinite love. Besides, the inflow of other needy and abandoned children at Basundhara is a regular phenomenon and it happens all through the year. Hadn't Basundhara taken these children under her wings, they would have ended up living a life of torture and deprivation - working as house maids, hotel boys and street beggars, though they do have so called parents and relatives. Some children come at a very late age and in almost all cases they don't have any educational experience. In order to engage such children in any vocation, it is necessary that they should be provided with the requisite training, which in turn needs basic academic qualification i.e. the trainee has to produce the certificate of passing at least class -VIII before joining any training programme. As mainstream schools do not admit overage children into primary classes and it is also problematic to admit children with slight physical and mental disabilities in regular schools - it became a pressing situation for Basundhara to start a school in its own campus, so that it can cater to the needs of such children. This led to the creation of SAIS Basundhara, a residential school for these kids and its prime objective is to provide a

descent and normal childhood (as far as possible), along with qualitative teaching to the children of Basundhara (who due to various reasons can not get adopted).

4. Briefly described the aims of your group.

BASUNDHARA

- Our consistent effort is to safeguard child rights and their rehabilitation through the best alternative approaches.
- To provide the children a secure and healthy environment, which values and upholds the rights of the children. Social reintegration of the children in the family and Community.
- Our long-term goal is to initiate capacity building processes among women in need for undertaking sustainable life support system.

SAIS Basundhara

- The prime objective of our school is to provide qualitative education not only to the children residing at Basundhara and the children affected by abject poverty who would otherwise remain deprived of a decent education, but also to children from all over the state who wish to benefit from the ambient learning atmosphere offered by us.
- We believe that God created all children in the true reflection of His self, which goes beyond the social and economic barriers that society tends to enforce on us. Hence, we strive to give an equitable education and environment for the holistic development of all the children of our school, whatever their background may be.
- Deprived as most of these children are, of normal parental love and care, special attention is given to each child by teachers and other members of the staff who work here with the blessed awareness of their noble duties. The school has adopted the pedagogical method propounded by Sri Aurobindo that seeks to achieve development for the ultimate evolution of the individual into beauty, power, knowledge and love.

5. Does your group have any religious or political affiliation? If yes, please describe the type of affiliation and the reason for it.

No, the group does not have any religious or political affiliations.

6. What non education-related community development activities is your group involved in?

Since it is a residential school, the entire upbringing of the children is borne by the organization. This includes not just financial expenses for food, shelter and daily expenses, but also health, moral education, care and providing a loving and safe family environment for the kids. The school has a girls hostel and a boys hostel, where the kids are provided with basic essentials and good living conditions. There is a doctor who also visits regularly for health care and maintenance. There are few auto services hired to take the kids out when needed. Apart from education, the kids are also trained in various extra curricular activities such as sports, yoga, music, singing, tailoring, gardening, arts and crafts etc. They observe the local festivals and social functions such as Rajo, Saraswati Puja, Holi, Independence Day etc. They also participate in district level competitions in music etc. and have won several prizes. The kids are given a fulfilling childhood experience so that they would be able to gel in well with the society and outer world.

The school provides primary basic education to all the children enrolled. This includes holistic education in all subjects up to Grade VIII, required for the Odisha state board syllabus. It also provides vocational training such as typing, tailoring etc. along with training in arts, music, dance, yoga, sports etc.

10. Please tell us about your teaching techniques (conventional vs. alternative).

Since the children come from various backgrounds, the classrooms are not very conventional and have kids from various age groups in the same class, depending on their need and skill levels. The teaching methods are conventional classroom education, and the teachers try to incorporate the teaching and testing methods followed by Matrubhaban school (Odisha State Board). Children who need help with homework or additional assistance are also give help after school in the hostel, during study hours.

11. What is the literacy rate in the local community?

The children mostly come from illiterate background, but it is difficult to track that in most cases. The community around, though is mostly literate.

12. Describe the socio-economic background of the children and their parents (e.g. education, occupational). If any of your students are employed, please tell us about that as well.

All the students are orphaned or abandoned by family or wronged and harassed who have found shelter at Basundhara.

Yes, the organization is responsible for the entire care of the students including food, healthcare, accommodation, clothing, daily living expenses, school supplies etc,

- e) The proposal should be for the **2013 to 2014 fiscal year (India)**. Funds have to be disbursed to the projects before March 2014. No exceptions. If funds are not disbursed in that duration, they will be used to support other WAH12 projects that did not meet their budget. (We will discuss this deadline again during WAH calls if there are any concerns)
- f) Chapters should only **put forth budgets that they are willing to support** if the funds from WAH13 does not come thru for any reason.
- g) If a project of your chapter is nominated in WAH 2013, you **must definitely have a WAH volunteer who will help the WAH team** on a need-by basis. Failure to communicate with the WAH team for all project needs (Jun 1 - Sep 15) may result in elimination of the project.
