As per request of my Sister Rinku Jain (Seattle volunteer), I visited the Samarpan Foundation on Saturday, August 8, 2020, at 2:00 PM with my brother Amit Jain. Due to COVID-19, the school was not in session, and some maintenance was going on. I met Meenakshi, one of the coordinators, and five other members of families who get help from the organization. It seems that Meenakshi is new to the organization, joined it in January and could not provide much information except that the organization supports the education for 300 -400 children, along with rations and counselling. She invited 4-5 families to come to the school and speak with us. There was one couple, and 1 member from each of the other families came. According to them, the organization supports them with education for their children, and money for medical bills and rations. Volunteers provide healing therapies in the Tihar prison and guidance for their better future. In the facility they have 3-4 small rooms and 1-2 bathrooms. Children come in batches. Most of the queries were unanswered. We asked for the facts and data sheets, which Meenakshi will send to Shruthi (Berkeley project steward) soon.
