# Samarpan Foundation

- A charitable non-profit entity established in September 2006 in New Delhi that works to provide global support and assistance where there is humanitarian, ecological, environmental and welfare need
- Programs for prisoners
  - **Goal: the prevention of the circle of crime**
- Programs for prisoners' families and disadvantaged families
- Results of these programs in Tihar Jail:
  - families have opened bank accounts and started to save money
  - education has benefited children and helped breadwinners support their families




# Additional Programs

Rations for all of the families to get nutritional meals

Tuition fees for all students to attend school and purchase supplies

Students encouraged to take other classes such as piano, guitar, computer

### **Academic Tracking**

Attend all student report card distributions and track financial stability and academic performance

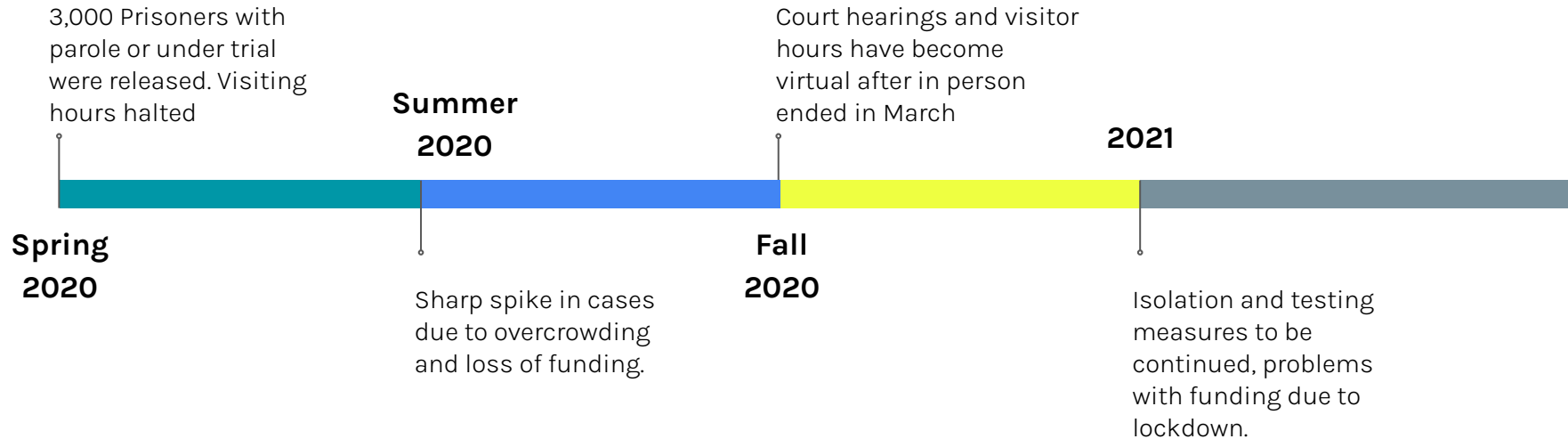
### **Prison Classes & Programs**

# Plans & Goals

- Continue providing nutritional, educational, and medical support to families of inmates
  - Introduce **new vocational and skill development courses** in various jails
    - Dance
    - Theatre
    - Music
    - Soft skill trainings
    - Literacy
  - Annual free medical camp and cultural evening for all jails
- **Expansion**
    - Include all prisons in Tihar complex - currently supporting 4 out of 10 prisons
    - Support more families
  - **Commissioned assignments**
    - Source of income for families
    - Move towards inmates being able to support themselves

1. What are the project's short-term goals? (1-2 years) -

Short term goals of the project are:

- a) To educate the children of the families
- b) To ensure the family isn't malnourished
- c) To take care of the medical needs of the old and ailing
- d) To support the children to pursue their passion
- e) To uplift the living conditions of the families
- f) To increase the number of families being supported
- g) To provide skills to the inmates inside the prison that helps them when they are outside

2. What are the project's long-term goals (3-5+ years)

Long term goals of the project are:

- a) Spreading the support to all 1300 inmates of Tihar Jail
- b) Liasing up with corporates to enable the inmates to get jobs once they complete their sentence
- c) Liasing up with corporates/ individuals/ training institutes to ensure children get jobs/ trainings
- d) Supporting the medical cases like operations etc where needed, in large numbers
- e) Setting up camps - health, nutrition, music fests etc inside the prison
- f) Setting up with corporates that can provide exposure and income to the inmates while they're serving their sentence
- g) Replicating the project across India
- h) Spreading the idea to schools to bring the kids forth to support and not judge





One of our youngest volunteers distributed blankets, sweets and savories to labourers' children who are affected the most by Delhi's harsh winters. This act brought joy to the little hearts.

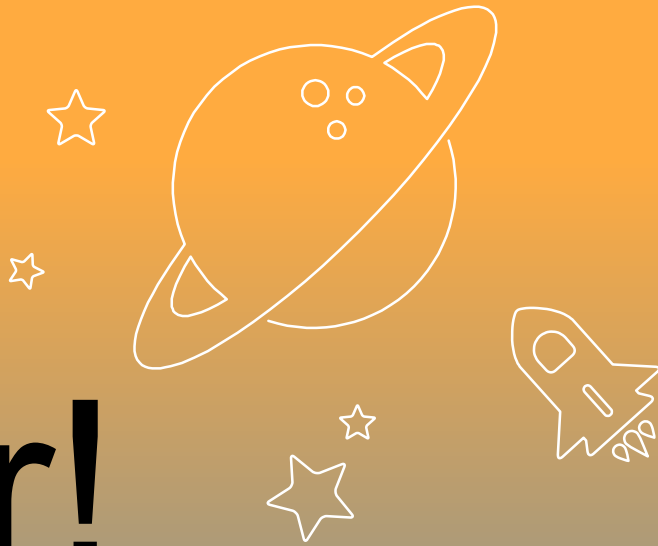

# Additional Considerations

- **Are the initial goals of the project met or not?**
  - Original Goals = We locate the families of inmates, pay their house rent, place the children in schools, provide rations and offer skills training to the womenfolk so that they can be independent. By working over a period of months with the families of inmates, we are able to build bridges with the inmates themselves and, having gained their trust, are able to help them learn a trade enabling them to lead honest lives upon release.
  - The goals are being met (currently supporting 100 families), and Samarpan is looking to expand their efforts
- **Responsiveness of the project partner - communicative?**
  - Very responsive, replies to emails and Whatsapp messages fairly quickly
- **Leadership structure moving forward**
  - Roohi is the point of contact, Samarpan Foundation is entirely volunteer run
  - Multiple regions in India, strong foundation to continue working with if Roohi leaves
- **Stewards' Recommendation:**
  - Status A: Long-Term - they are not reliant on our funds, and our funds are the only ones directly supporting the children's education
