

Program Highlights

Friends of children came into being with the vision of empowering youth through education. Over the years, this basic ideal has blossomed from just handing out scholarships, to various projects, all coming under the same umbrella.... to strengthen the foundation of assisting youth secure their dream job.

Nurture Merit

This program is the very crux of the organization, where we provide sponsorship to meritorious, needy students. The program has been successfully running for the past eighteen years and 4690 deserving students have been beneficiaries to date. This year we further fine-tuned the program to specifically reach out to children affected by Covid and have lost a breadwinner, or in many cases, both parents. With over 790 children in Maharashtra being orphaned, we chose to reach out, in a small way, through our volunteers to such children who would otherwise forego continuing their studies.

Ujala (Light) One time off scholarships to Covid affected children

Under this project we located children who would need help with their college fees as they had lost the breadwinner in the family to Covid 19. We received many applications, and every student was interviewed extensively with their family, the need was gauged and a fixed amount of Rs. 20000 was given to defray their college fees for the year. Some children out of this group were absorbed under our annual Nurture Merit program. These students would be supported by FoC till they complete their education and would be sponsored every year till their course is completed.

With the assistance of a formed group of our Alumni volunteers, we also created a space where any student could reach out and avail of information on various schemes, both private and Govt aided, for Covid affected families. Our Alumni volunteers assisted them at every level, handholding them thru the process of applying for funding etc.

Umeed (Hope) - Monthly Workshop Program

The Umeed program continues to focus on "Holistic Development" through a large array of workshops. Currently in its eleventh year, the program has evolved over time into a rigorous curriculum, equipping students with the essential life skills and soft skills to grow as individuals. Spearheaded by **Anupama Ganu**, who is a trained counsellor herself, the program has become the fulcrum of FoC's activities.

The topics are chosen such that they are most relevant to the student audience for their personal growth. With attendance to all workshops being mandatory, our students have shown great eagerness to use this platform and further their soft skills. Our professional trainers continue to volunteer their personal time and expertise to drive Umeed forward and several of them have had a long association with FoC. We are very thankful for their contribution.

Our students are required to attend a minimum of 5 workshops being held for their class and region, each year, to remain sponsored by FoC. All workshops continued to remain online this year and students exhibited great enthusiasm in participating and volunteering to troubleshoot making every workshop a success with full attendance.

Unnati (Progress) – Recruitment Skill Program

The Unnati program in its eighth year, focuses in its entirety on Recruitment skills, helping our final year students prepare themselves for interviews and securing their dream job. Spearheaded by **Manoj Sharma** and ably assisted by an Alumni team and a large array of corporate volunteers, the program provides a framework to help the students with their interviewing skills which would improve their chances to get through campus placements, or even for job opportunities beyond their college campus.

Aptitude tests were conducted every month, alongside quizzes. Students were given their scores, tips to improve along with online feedback. Mock interviews and Mock group discussions were conducted every two months, again with online and hard copy feedback to the students. All panel members for the sessions are from various corporates who volunteer with us and willingly give their time for this project. A very big Thank you to all of them!

Due to Covid 19, all modules continue to function online successfully.

Uday (Rising) - Spoken English Program

In its third year and managed by **Sujata Deshpande**, this initiative was launched to help strengthen the Spoken English skills of our final year students, helping them gain confidence and fluency in spoken English, as they transition from their college campus into the Corporate World. Volunteers would have "twice a week" telephonic conversations with assigned students to enable him/her to improve their grammar, vocabulary and conversational skills. The students in turn can choose different topics to converse with their assigned volunteer.

Volunteers often guide the students by introducing them to various sources like Newspaper, Television News, books, movies to help them improve command on the language. This program has helped our students gain confidence during their interview process, especially around Group Discussions and Face to Face interviews, turning out to be a runaway success!

All interaction between volunteers and students were over phone and most have not even seen each other ever!

SEP – Spoken English Program for penultimate year students

This program, spanning over six months of rigorous sessions, has been set up for students in the penultimate year of college. It works as a precursor to the Uday program in setting the foundation and basics of Spoken English. Spearheaded by **Sujata Rege** and ably assisted by three more volunteers, SEP in its second year, has been a huge success. Besides gaining the confidence to speak and learning the basics of English grammar, students were well prepared for Project Uday which they would be part of in their final year. Online sessions were held every alternate weekend and students were allocated to four dedicated groups, headed by volunteers who took on steering the students through Rules of Grammar, pronunciation, and basic conversation in Spoken English.

Umang (Joy)- Alumni Participation Program

FoC has always believed that the students who pass out are the ones who would remain the backbone of FoC. Having been nurtured thru their important years in college by FoC, each one of them senses the immense need to" Pay it forward"! The Umang program was launched precisely to accomplish this, where our Alumni students come together with a spirit to contribute back to FoC with donations and participate in sustaining its journey.

Umang has increased our network of students, with Alumni remaining connected to FoC through various activities. Our Alumni network has been growing exponentially and in the year 2021-22, **they contributed a notable of Rs. 3.82 Lakh to FoC. Over 127 Alumni contributed** amounts as small as Rs 1000 to a portion of their month's salary making this effort a huge success!!

Besides their monetary contribution, our Alumni play a crucial role in every project undertaken. A few of the areas where they have taken on responsibilities are, administrative work, selection and mentoring of students, second level management of projects, remaining connected to volunteers and bringing in new volunteers.

Uttam (Excellence) Enabling Academic Toppers achieve excellence

Uttam has completed a year and has made a commendable start.

Spearheaded by **Harshad Joshi,** the program involved dedicated mentors allocated to groups of students aligned to their career streams, providing them exposure to various industry trends and personal mentorship and guidance. The one-to-one interaction and the mentorship imparted additional grooming for these hand-picked students over and above their scheduled FoC programs.

Monthly 1–2-hour sessions were conducted by the mentors with their allocated groups with the total program spread over 7 months. The focus was on Technical, organizational & management skills and Life skills. FoC alumni inclusion to share their experiences and help tailor the program topics and structure further improved the effectiveness of the program

A gamut of problems was addressed like inability to attend online sessions, unable to pay for data on phones, not having a smartphone, family problems causing anxiety to name a few.

When any student remained absent for sessions, these volunteers took charge of finding out the reason why and offered help accordingly

This was an imperative need of the hour and our 6 dedicated Alumni and students worked tirelessly through the year.


Fatima Wadiwale

Proposed Plans for 2022 -23

Udaan (Flight) Student volunteer residential program

After a long hiatus of three years, we propose to restart the student volunteer camp this year. This program basically encourages students who are sponsored by FoC, and are interested in contributing more, thereby learning how FoC functions. Over a span of a weekend, around 30 students come together and learn how the organization works and functions. Based on their skill sets, they then take on responsibilities within their region and help with the various activities therein. Be it organizing, co ordinating or scheduling and managing a session, the students are handheld by senior volunteers who guide and mentor them.

Udaan has been a part of FoC for over 8 years and has been instrumental in bringing in many needy students from remote regions. We hope that it continues to achieve the success it has in the past

Alumni Interaction

We generally have one gathering of Alumni every year and the time is spent in great bonhomie with a sense of home coming. We also share achievements and details of work undertaken by the Alumni for FoC.

This year, we intend to engage with them in a more constructive way, perhaps thrice through the year. Guest speakers, online sessions which would hold value to them, mentorship and learning more about how they have moved ahead in their lives. With many of them being an integral part of every project undertaken, we hope that this continued interaction would bring forth more support and ideas from our Alumni

Include more Active volunteers in the management of FoC

Being completely volunteer driven, having a continuously committed group of volunteers has always been a challenge. We presently have over 110 dynamic volunteers and would actively look at keen and committed members within the group to participate in the day to day running of FoC.


Restart Residential programs







Annexure 1: Identification Process, Selection and Monitoring Criteria

Identification Process

- In every case, fee disbursement was done only after rigorous process of identification and verification by physically visiting the home units of shortlisted students.
- Applications received from school contacts, volunteers and well-wishers.
- Volunteers interviewed all shortlisted candidates and visited every shortlisted applicant's household.
- Final selected new student beneficiaries inducted in FoC for the year.
- Detailed documentation of each deserving case with photo shoots of house/applicant prepared.

Selection Criteria

We have followed two different modules for selection of students in the city and villages. The criteria which has driven us to follow this particular pattern is as follows:

- Cost of living is much higher in the city
- More general awareness in the city compared to villages
- · Availability of resources, mainly volunteers
- This year, all interviews, interaction with students and their families were conducted online with detailed notes and videos being taken to substantiate data collected (due to Covid 19)

Monitoring Criteria (renewal of sponsorship on an evolved credit system)

- Students are expected to keep up their mark scores to the required percentage and renew their sponsorship each year.
- Attendance to workshops/residential programs is mandatory
- Extracurricular activities and extra academic projects are given extra weightage
- Self Supporting students and orphans are given preference
- Students are encouraged to volunteer for FoC within their regions or volunteer in any organization of their choice.
