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# ***SUMMARY OF THE ANNUAL REPORT 2018-19***

While writing the report, I couldn't help but note that there were so many firsts this year. This year was the first time the Deenabandhu school children awaited their SSLC public examinations results! This was the first time, Teacher Resource Center (TRC) activities spread out beyond Chamarajnagara, as they leaped from 200 government schools here to 40 schools in the district of Davanagere! Science Chariot started its operations and started reaching remotest schools in the district! It was the 26<sup>th</sup> year of Deenabandhu and yet we had so many firsts! We are proud that there so many more to come!

More of our children, both boys and girls, are becoming economically self reliant and living independently! However, they do not forget their roots and come here to celebrate festivals and spend time with us here. Their confidence, their joy! Makes all the efforts of all the staff and supporters of Deenabandhu worthwhile! We do have some disappointments, we truly wish couple of children blossomed better!

Pondering about all these brings a lot of joy and gratefulness. Generosity of all the people who have stood by us overwhelms me. Sri Dr Krishna Chivukula, Smt Dr Jagadamba Chivukula and the whole team of Indo-MIM, without whose steady support probably Deenabandhu high-school would still have remained a dream! Out of 84 students at our high school, 81 are from Below Poverty Line (BPL) families, including 21 from destitute backgrounds. Given the economic background of the children, education is the only way out for their economic self sufficiency. Without the support from Indo-MIM, reaching out to these children would not have been possible!

Yoga Gives Back is providing scholarships to 80 children who have completed their studies at our school. Chandrashekhar Desai goudar foundation is trying to harvest the science talent in the rural schools of our districts through Science Talent award projects along with their scholarship program. Along with Oracle, Deenabandhu Teacher Resource Center got generous support from ASHA for Education, USA and Adobe foundation.

Many individual donors have stood by us for many years. Many eminent resource persons have been guiding us. It can be guiding us with dealing with children, with creating new resources for science and mathematics, coming up with new projects to reach more and more deserving children! Oh how our supporters have laid the canvas for us! They are inspiring us, pushing us to extend our vision with new aspirations and new ideas!

Also, our staff who work with utmost commitment and dedication are the reason for Deenabandhu being so strong yet so warm! They are the reason why we could even think of including many more activities year after year. They are reasons why we are now able to reach thousands of children in rural government schools throughout the state through various outreach programs.

With this feeling of gratefulness I want to present this Annual report of the year 2018-19 to you all.

# 1. Deenabandhu Children's Home

## 1.1 BOYS' HOME:



There are 37 boys in the boys' home. All the children are attending their schools and colleges regularly.

This year Dhanush, Nanjunda, Chethan completed their 10<sup>th</sup> Std public examinations successfully. Chethan was exempted from writing the exams for English, Hindi, Mathematics and Science based on assessment by Speech and Hearing Institute, Mysore. However he had to take up other three subjects related to social science. He was given extra coaching with those subjects.

Sandeep completed three years of diploma from Govt. Tool room and Training Center (GTTC) and is now undergoing apprenticeship at Bangalore. Surya and Sachin now in the final year of his GTTC diploma at Gundlupet. Shayma is in final year of his engineering degree and preparing for the campus placements in to IT companies. Chandan is in second year of Bachelors in Arts course at Maharaja College, Mysore. Based on his 12<sup>th</sup> marks, he got

admitted in to the hostel in Mysore. Further he wants to pursue Masters after graduation. He continues to train himself in Cricket in Mysore. Naveen opted to major in photography from his third year of his five year Diploma at CAVA (Chamarajendra Academy of Visual Arts), Mysore. Currently he is in the fourth year of his course.

All the children who are staying away from Deenabandhu keep visiting us during weekends, festivals and other holidays.

## 1.2 GIRLS' HOME:



There are 35 Girls in the Girls' home. Bharatanatya classes are going on regularly at the girl's home and our teacher, Smt. Usha, continues to come every Sunday from Nanjanagud. She is teaching our kids this form of dancing since 14 years.

Pallavi, Vandana and Deepika completed 10<sup>th</sup> standard successfully this year. Pallavi scored 82% and Vandana scored around 70%. Both Pallavi and Vandana opted Science for 1<sup>st</sup> pre-university college at JSS college Chamarajnagara. Both of them are attending tuitions for physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Biology after college hours. They are also attending CET coaching classes.

Deepika opted to study commercial practices at JSS Polytechnic college for women, Mysore. Her stay has been arranged at her college hostel itself. Usha is now in her second year of engineering diploma course in Electronics and Communication Engineering in the same college and stay in the same hostel.

Durga completed her second year of Pr-university studies and is now studying Bachelor of Arts at Maharani's college, Mysore. She has chosen to study History, Philosophy and Economics. Arrangements have been made for her stay in her college hostel itself. Tulsi is in her third year of GTTC diploma.

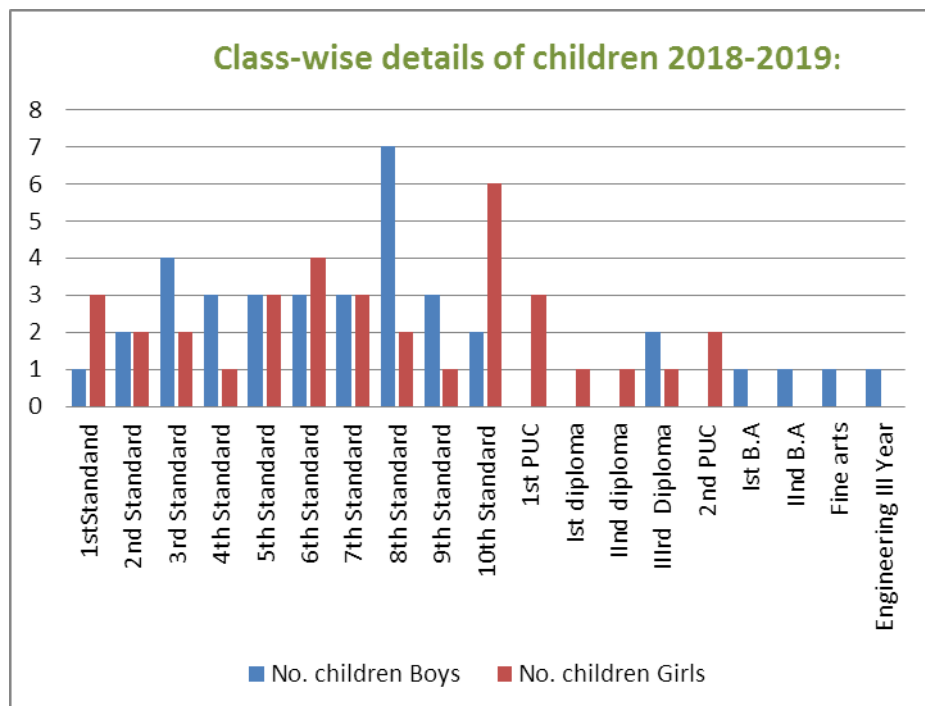

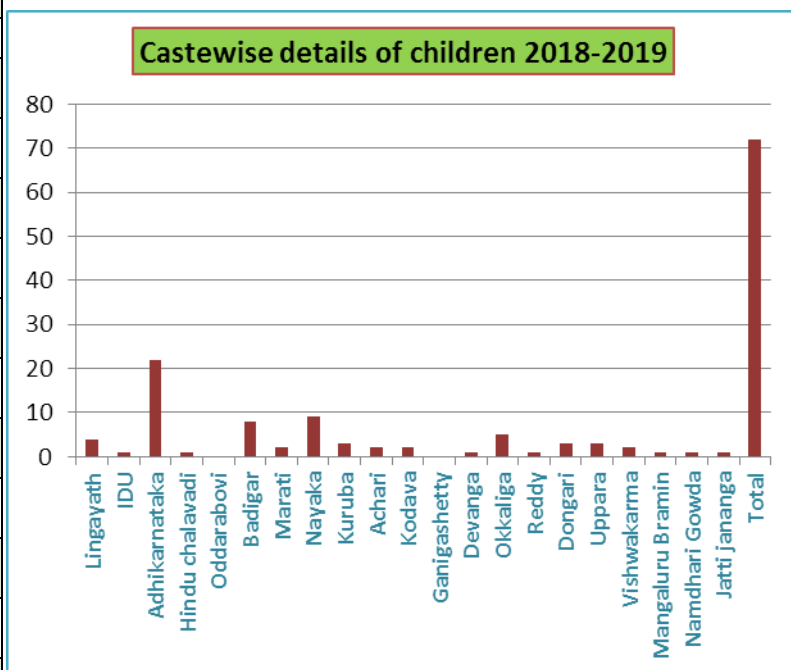

## 2. Deenabandhu Primary and High School

We are very grateful to INDO-MIM for the munificent financial support. INDO-MIM is entirely funding the expenditures like salaries of the school staff, administrative expenses, computer and chemistry lab maintenance expenses, school day function expense, purchasing of sports materials and midday-meal for 250 children. Currently, the midday meal is provided for 361 children for class from 1<sup>st</sup> standard to 10<sup>th</sup> standard. From LKG to 10<sup>th</sup> standard total strength for the year 2018-19 is 437. On Saturdays, all the 437 children will get the breakfast. However, the expenditure is exceeding in head of mid-day meal above approved budget, we are incurring from our own source.



In the academic year 2017-18 our Deenabandhu kannada medium High School got 79% result in S.S.L.C examination. We had 28 children in 10<sup>th</sup> class. Grade wise details of our school result is 13 First grade, 8 Second grade, 1 Third grade and 6 students failed. In our neighbor kannada medium high schools are giving education for same background children. They got S.S.L.C result like C.R.Balarapattana High School 49%, J S S Boys High School 35% and J S S Girls High School 63%. Compare to other schools we gave good education and result. With your financial support and love we are doing good work.



You gave grant for capital investment. We used that grant for paintings of school building. Now our school building looking beautiful. We are very grateful to your support .  
The School reopened on 29<sup>th</sup> May 2018. Out of the total strength of 437, 229 are boys and 208 are girls.

## **School program and activities-2018-19**

127<sup>th</sup> Jayanthi of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar was celebrated on 14-04-2018. Children and Teachers shared stories from the life of Dr.B.R.Ambedkar. They narrated the incidences from his childhood, about his education and also spoke about his responsibility in framing the Indian Constitution. Few songs about Dr.B.R.Ambedkar were also performed by the children. Later sweets were distributed for all the children and the staff.





On June 5th 2018, 'The world environment day' was celebrated. Teachers and children prepared colorful posters and charts with message related to environment. Teachers gave information about how to control pollutions and human activities related to environment for 4th to 10th standard children. After discussion all staff members and students cleaned the school campus.



On June 21st, we celebrated 'World Yoga Day'. Ayush Department of the central government arranged yoga program in District Police ground, Chamarajanagara at 6 o' clock in the morning. They taught yoga for school children. From our school, 150 children from 6th to 10th grade along with teachers participated in the program.



On 27th June 2018, the whole school celebrated the Birthday of Dr. Krishna Chivukula Sir. Deenabandhu children and staff wished him a very happy birthday. We served special lunch for all 437 children. On the same day, a program was arranged to welcome 72 children who joined us this year. Teachers presented them with flower bouquet. Many cultural programs like dance, drama and songs were performed by other kids from 1st to 10th standard.



On 11<sup>th</sup> July 2018 ‘World Population Day’ was celebrated at the school. It was assigned as a project to 9<sup>th</sup> standard students. They explained about the problems the world is facing because of over population. They also provided various statistics and had prepared various charts and posters to convey their understandings. All the students from 4<sup>th</sup> std to 10<sup>th</sup> std attended the event. Sri.C.R.Harisharadhya (Deenabandhu High School Headmaster) guided the students with this project.



We celebrated 71<sup>st</sup> Independence Day on 15-08-2018 at 8 in the morning. National Flag was hoisted by Sri. Dr.R.S.Nagarjun ( Joint Secretary of Deenabandhu Trust). Stories and incidences from our freedom struggle and stories from the lives of our freedom fighters were shared by students and the teachers. Quiz, Drawing, Essay and Poetry writing competitions was also organized for the children from 5<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> standard. Children also performed a cultural dance on the occasion. A special breakfast was served for all the students and the teachers.



On 30-08-2018 marked the 9<sup>th</sup> annual “Science day” which was held at the school premises. This day also marks the birthday of the founder of Deenabandhu Prof. G.S. Jayadeva. Sri. Lakshmipathi (Block Educational officer), Sri. Kumar (Coordinator of Education) graced the occasion as guests. Our Program was inaugurated by Sri. Lakshmipathi by launching a plastic-bottle rocket which uses air-pressure. He admired the works of Deenabandhu and its impact on the community around. Prof. G.S. Jayadev also address the gathering. He expressed his gratitude to Sri Dr Krishna Chivukula and INDO-MIM for enabling us to reach out for the community. Over 3000 children and teachers from 50 schools mostly from rural govt. Schools from Chamarajanagara district participated. Deenabandhu school children from 4<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> standard had prepared and explained over 100 Science experiments to all the visitors. Lunch was served for all visitors.





Department of Education organized cluster level inter-school sports competition for school children on 02-08-2018 and Taluk level sports competitions on 10-08-2018. Both girls and boys teams won the Kabbaddi trophy at the cluster level and got selected for the taluk level competition. Children also participated in Relay, Shot-put and other running competitions and won several prizes. Our 10<sup>th</sup> std student Darshan participated in 3000m running race and stood 2<sup>nd</sup> at the taluk level.



10<sup>th</sup> students organized Teacher's day on 05-09-2018. They had also prepared flower buckets for all the teachers and non-teaching staff. Sunil M. (Coordinator of TRC) organized drama and dumb-charade competition for teachers. All the children and the staff enjoyed the whole day thoroughly.



World Literacy day was also assigned to 9<sup>th</sup> std. students as a project. The event was started with a song about literacy. Many topics related to literacy like, what is literacy? What is the important of literacy? Various statistics were shared by the students. All the children from 4<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> std participated in the event. After the presentation children asked many question and the answers were discussed in the presence of teachers.



We Celebrated 149<sup>th</sup> Gandhi Jayanthi on 2<sup>nd</sup> oct 2018 at 8 in the morning. All the children from 1<sup>st</sup> std to 10<sup>th</sup> std. joined the celebrations. Many stories from the life of Gandhiji was shared. The stories from his childhood brought smile on the faces of these young children. Discussion continued about the values Gandhiji upheld, about his social concerns and yes ofcourse about our fight for freedom. A special breakfast was served to all the children. After breakfast only the children from 7<sup>th</sup> std to 10<sup>th</sup> std were retained and discussion continued along with the stories from the book 'Gatanegalalli Gandhiji' (Gandhiji in the midst of events) authored by Prof. G.S.Jayadev.



We celebrated 63<sup>rd</sup> Kannada Rajyothsava program on 1<sup>st</sup> Nov 2018. Special breakfast was served for all the children and the staff. District level program was organized by the Zillapanchayath of Chamarajanagara . All the children from 5<sup>th</sup> standard to 10<sup>th</sup> standard which totaled up to 185 children performed wonderful dance in the program which was organized in the open stadium. Children prepared for this presentation for almost a month. They won third prize for this beautiful presentation. Sri. C. Puttarangashetty, MLA awarded the prize to the children. Smt. Manjula, Deputy Director of Public Instruction exclusively appreciated the performance of Deenabandhu children in her speech.



On 14<sup>th</sup> Nov-2018 we celebrated children's day. Teachers planned series of special events for all the children. The competitions were structured differently for different age groups. Games like ball in the bucket, Lemon on the spoon, Catch the snack, Musical chair, Coin in the glass etc were part of the program. Special meal was served for all the students and the staff.

Meal were arranged by Sri. Venugopal, who voluntarily teaches mathematics to our 10<sup>th</sup> std children. He is very renowned and popular mathamatics teacher in the district.





Fancy dress competition for all the children from L.K.G to 10<sup>th</sup> standard children was organized on 23<sup>rd</sup> of November 2018. Over 130 children participated. They wore beautiful costumes. The little ones received guidance from their teachers and the parents. They did not just dress up, they also performed couple of dialogues and few even acted a small script. The most popular ones were Krishna, Radhe, Bheema, Hanumantha, Kitturu rani Chennamma, Freedom Fighters, Magicians, Rama, Seetha, Shiva, Soothsayer, artists, dances, folk artists etc.



On 26<sup>th</sup> November 2018 Constitution day was celebrated. This was assigned to 7<sup>th</sup> Standard students as the project. The students presented their understanding about 'Indian Constitution'. They displayed colorful charts, posters and explained very well. The project included information about Preamble, Features of Constitution, Fundamental Rights, Fundamental duties and Citizenship etc. Children from 4<sup>th</sup> standard to 10<sup>th</sup> standard along with all the teachers were present in the program.



We celebrated 20<sup>th</sup> School day program on 22<sup>nd</sup> December 2018. A very special lunch was served for all the children from L.K.G. to 10<sup>th</sup> standard and staff. School day program started at 6.30 pm in the evening. Shri. Dr. R. S. Nagarjun (Joint secretary of Deenabandhu Trust), Smt. Chukki Nanjundaswamy (Secretary of State Farmer Association and also a parent), Sri. Revanna (Block Resource Person, Department of Education), Sri. Siddaraju (Cluster Resource Person, Department of Education), Sri. Prakash.V (Member of Municipality), Sri. Channanjaiah (Chairman of Ramasamudra Village), Sri. Venugopal (Maths Teacher who volunteers at Deenabandhu school), Sri Raghu.B (Master Resource Person of Deenabandhu Teacher Resource Center) and Sri. Prakash.S (Head Master of Deenabandhu School) were the guests. This year the topic for the school day was "History of Karnataka". Children from L.K.G. to 10<sup>th</sup> standard gave various cultural performances about this topic on the stage. Prizes were also distributed for the students who won in various intra-school cultural and sports competitions organized in the month of November and December.



On 29-12-2018 a special project on Geometry was organized. Students from 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> standard participated in the program. They were made into teams and the teams drew various shapes with colorful Rangolies in the school playground related to their geometry syllabus which included, Three dimensional shapes, Concentric circles, Characteristics of circles, Construction of triangles, Construction of similar triangles, Construction of tangent to outer point of circle, Construction of tangent on circle while  $60^\circ$  angle between tangents etc. We evaluated their constructions and distributed prizes to students.



Swamy Vivekananda's Jayanthi was celebrated on January 2019. High-school children narrated stories from the life of Swami Vivekananda. They also shared stories about his speech at Chicago's World Religion Conference. Children inspired us all by narrating the stories of Vivekananda which showed his love and concern for the people of this nation. Essay and Drawing competitions were also organized for the children on this occasion.



69<sup>th</sup> Republic day was celebrated on 26<sup>th</sup> Of January 2019. The National Flag was hoisted by Sri. Sunil. M (Coordinator of TRC). Stories about our freedom struggles, about our constitution were shared by the children and the teachers. Drawing and Essay competition was organized for the children.





28<sup>th</sup> of February which is marked as the National Science Day was celebrated at the school premises. The program was named as 'Practical learning of Science-A View'. Sri. Prof. S.M.Shivaprasad (Director of Karnataka State Higher Education Academy), Sri. C.L. Anand (Additional District Commissioner ), Smt. Savitha Patil (KSTEP Engineer), Smt.Bharathi (Principal of District Institute of Education and Training), and Sri Prof. G.S. Jayadeva (Secretary of Deenabandhu) graced the occasion as guests. Teachers Resource Center (TRC) is working rigorously with over 200 govt schools. Science and Maths teachers from these schools were invited for the function. The works of Deenabandhu school and TRC was shared during the program. Prof. Jayadev also expressed his gratitude to Indo-MIM for supporting the school in enormous way. He also thanked Oracle, Tata trusts, Adobe, Asha for Education for standing strong by us since many years and supporting our outreach programs through TRC.



A unique project as part of mathematics learning was conducted for the children of 6<sup>th</sup> standard. It was a month-long project on the growth of Pongamia tree leaves from 9<sup>th</sup> Feb to 14<sup>th</sup> March. Pongamia tree starts to grow new leaves in the month of February. Children started to sketch the leaf on a graph sheet. They continued to mark the growth of the same leaf on different graph sheets for over a month. By tracing the leaf on the graph sheet, they will be able to measure the area of the leaf on that particular day. Children realized how fast the leaf grows. They noted that a completely grown leaf of Pongamia has a minimum 40 sq.cm area and Maximum 70 sq.cm area. They also marked their finding on a bar graph where they marked the number of days against the area of the leaf.



This is a yearlong project where the children observe the angle of the sunrise and the time every month on 21<sup>st</sup> or 22<sup>nd</sup>. Through this we want them to understand how the seasons are formed? How the inclination of the earth is causing the seasons? How the sunrise, sunset and the day length varies? And many aspects based on this. On 21<sup>st</sup> or 22<sup>nd</sup> of every month they assemble at 6:15 in the morning and measure the angle of the sun-rise in the set-up exclusively constructed for the project. It started this year on 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2019 which happens to be one of the equinox day. 8<sup>th</sup> std kids were part of this project and the project continues throughout their 9<sup>th</sup> standard.



A project on farming was started this year in the school. Interested children from 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> standard both boys and girls were involved. 20 different varieties of vegetables were grown using only organic manures and process. No other chemical fertilizers or pesticides were used. The farming was done on a half an acre land in the premises of science park. Drip irrigation method was used for the purpose.

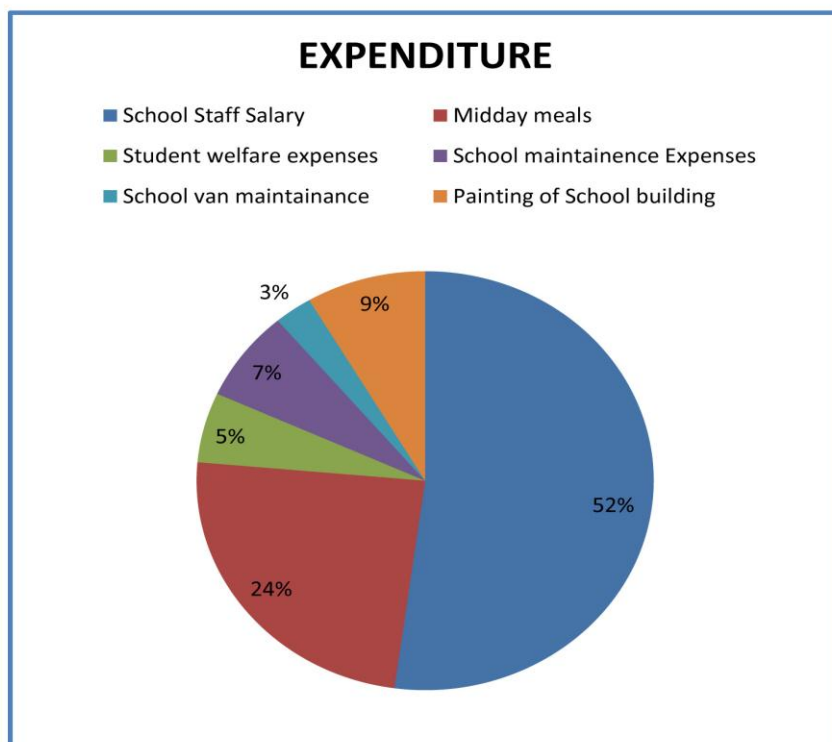
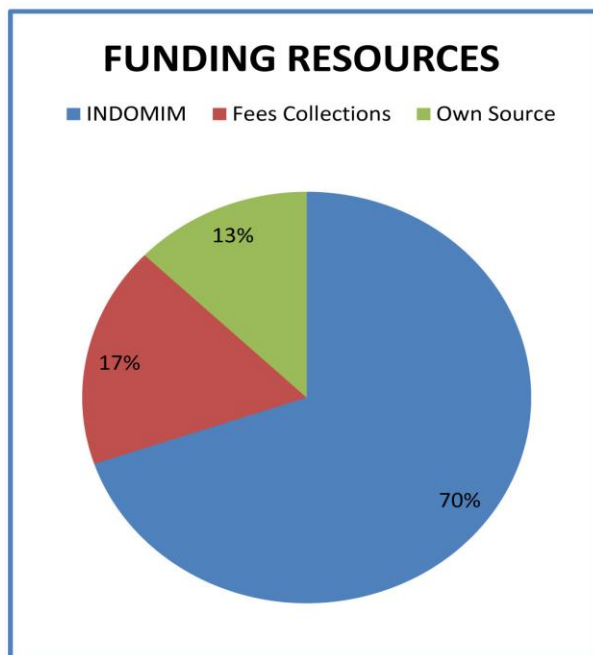




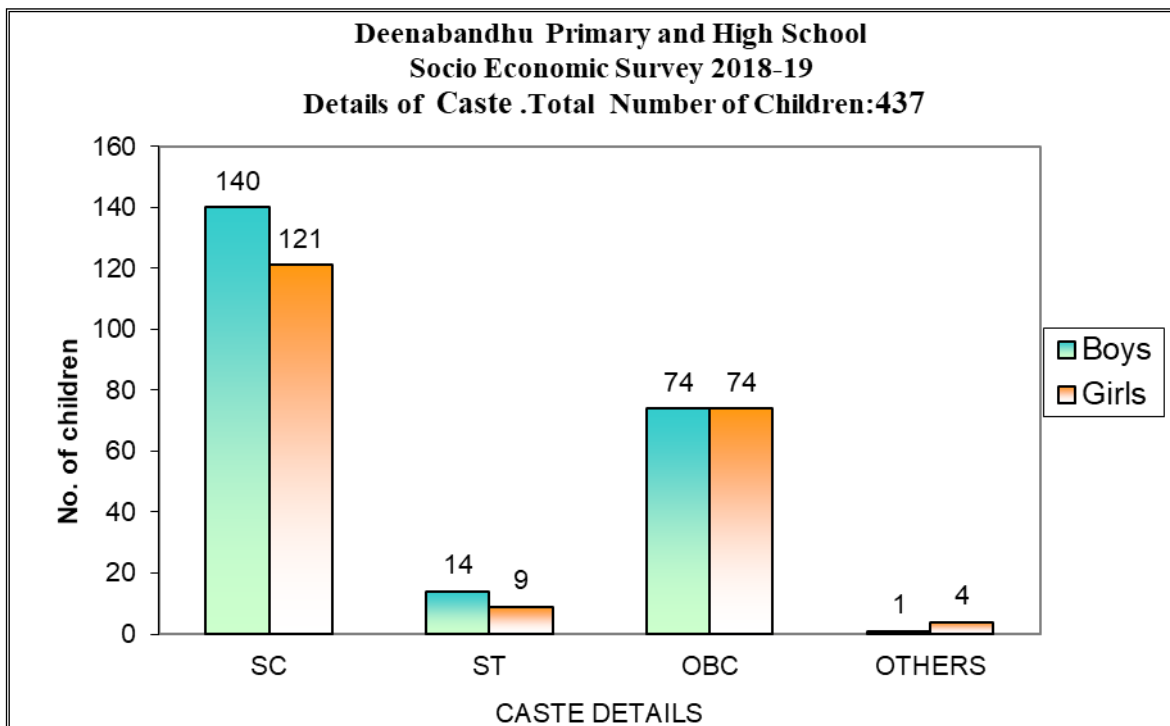
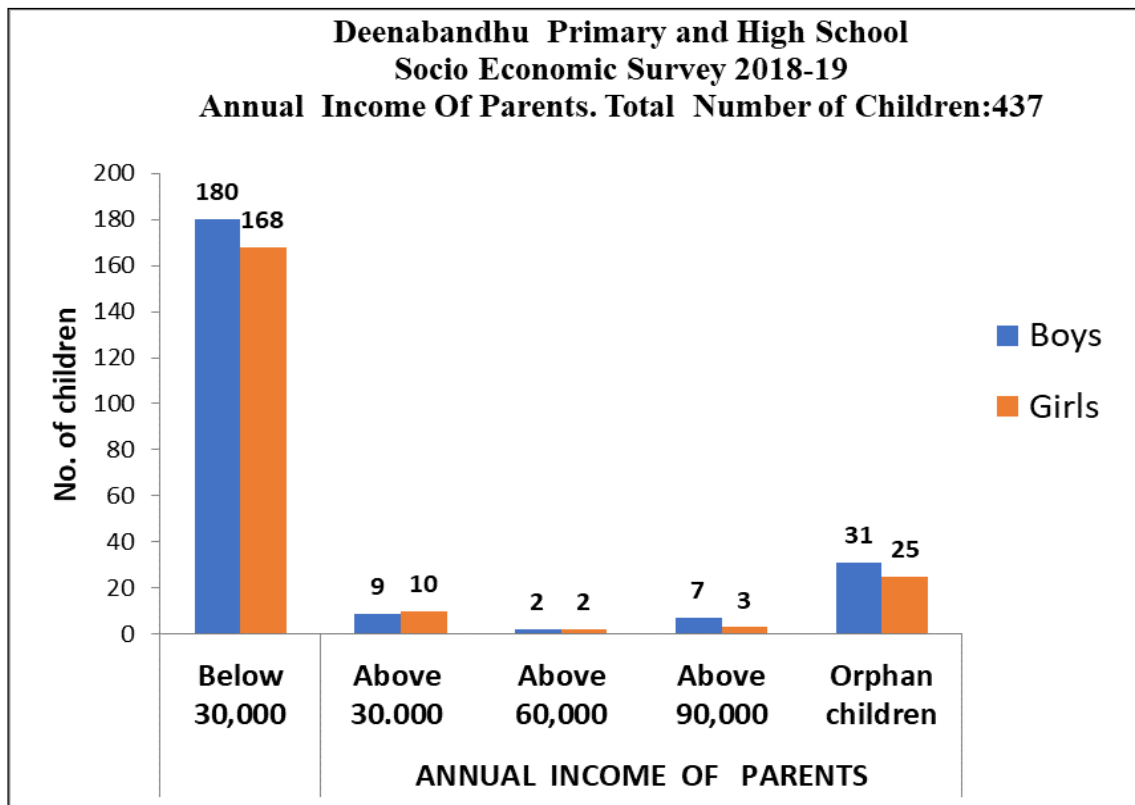

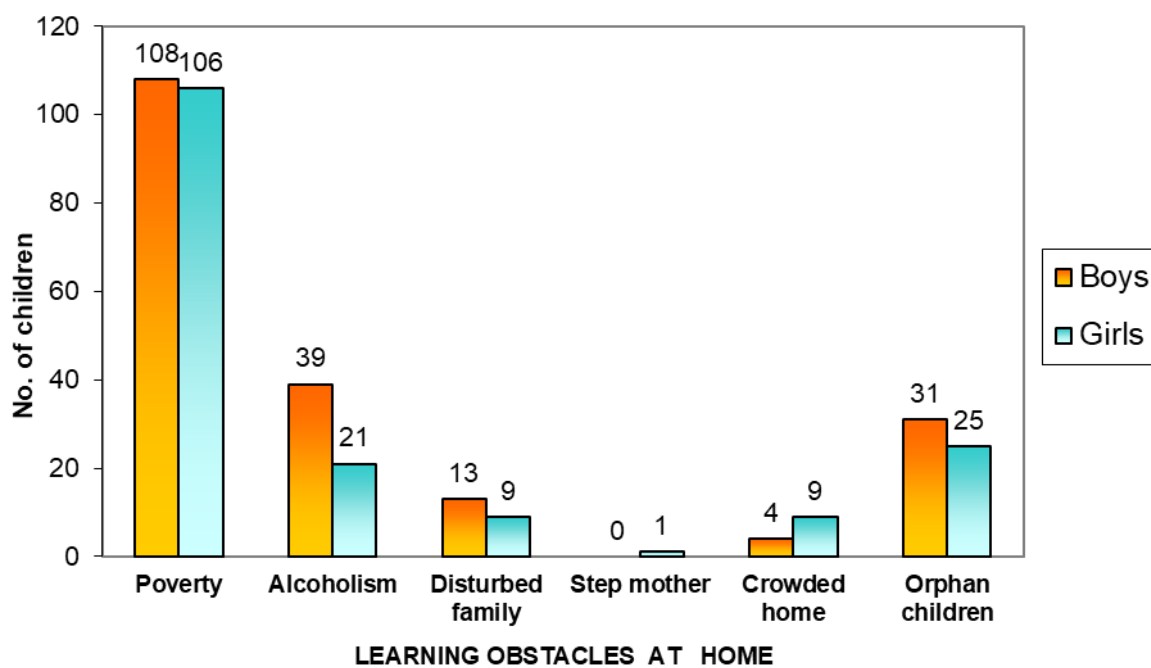

### 3. Deenabandhu Teacher Resource Center (TRC)

Deenabandhu TRC has been consistently working towards promoting experiential science and mathematics education in Government schools in Karnataka. Over the years, the TRC has benefited thousands of children and teachers through its various programmes and activities. In 2018-19, a number of projects were accomplished through support from multiple donors.

#### Oracle funded activities

With funding support from Oracle, the TRC has organized workshops (total of 16, 4 per teacher) for 202 'very interested teachers' from 182 schools. Additionally 21 TLM making workshops for children were conducted this year. The monthly newsletter 'Anubhava' is reaching 250 0+ subscribers and over 350 online readers. Two educational films in Kannada on the topic 'Electromagnetism' were produced. All films produced by the TRC are freely available on YouTube. Around 50 new TLMs were designed by the TRC this year; these new TLMs are used during training/workshops, and also reach schools and children through other programmes.







## Learning Corners

In many rural Government schools, the science teachers are very eager to use activity-based methods in the classroom, however they lack the resources to implement them in the school. Deenabandhu TRC aimed to address this problem by setting up Learning Corners (LCs) in a few selected number of schools. The LC is a room filled with 43 important TLMs along with charts and other resources. Additionally, a resource person (RP) regularly visits these schools to interact with the children and teachers. The school with LCs become nodal centers for around 5-6 neighbourhood schools, and they can borrow resources from LC schools.

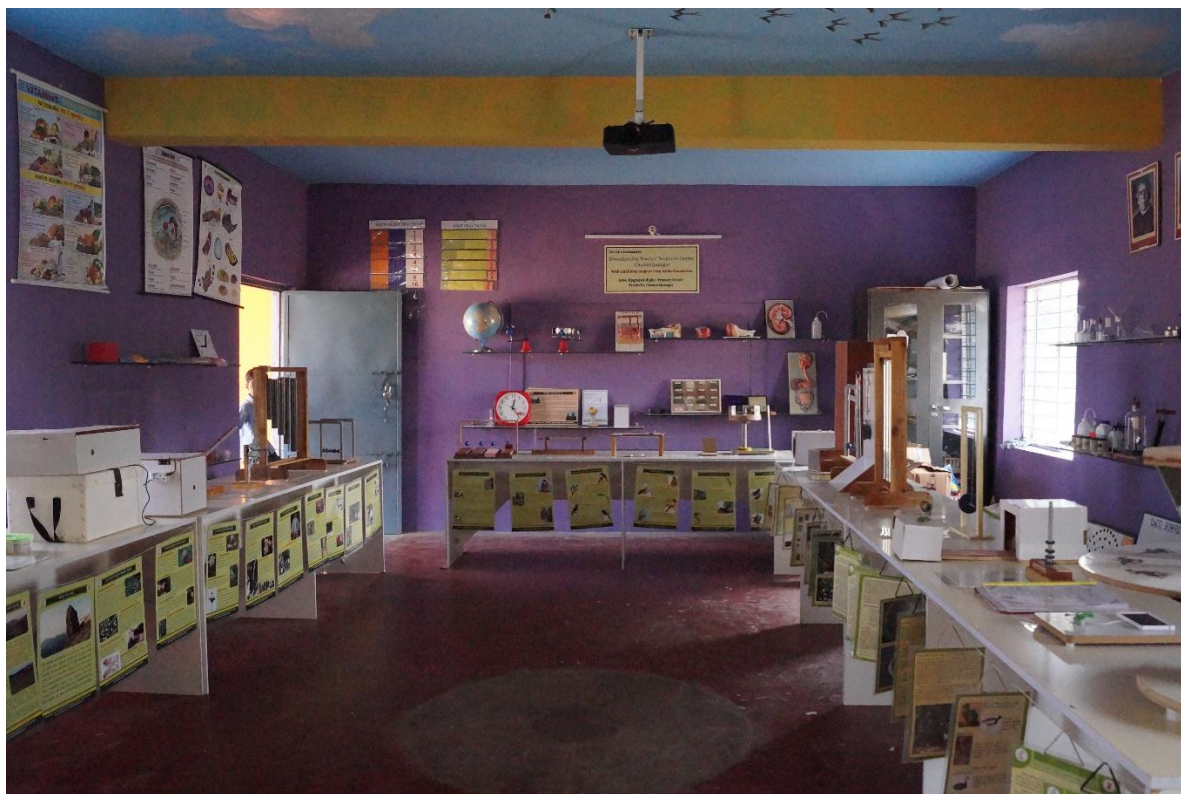


Last year, with support from Asha for Education – Boston, Deenabandhu had established 5 Learning Corners in Hanur block of Chamarajanagara district. In 2018-19, totally 16 Learning Corners were established by Deenabandhu in 2 districts of Karnataka – Chamarajanagara and Davangere.

- 1) 8 Learning Corners in Chamarajanagara district with support from Adobe Foundation
- 2) 8 Learning Corners in Davangere district through the Edu-Impact 2018 contest organised by Asha For Education – Silicon Valley.

An orientation programme was held for science teachers from all LC schools on 28<sup>th</sup> February, 2019 on National Science Day. A session on “Methods of Experiential Teaching” was conducted by Dr. S. M. Shivaprasad, (Director, Karnataka State Higher Educational Academy, Dharwad, and Professor, International Centre for Materials Science, Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research, Bangalore).

Totally, Deenabandhu TRC has so far set up 21 Learning Corners in 2 districts, reaching more than 100 schools and more than 10,000 children.



## Science Chariot

The Science Chariot takes science experiments directly to the doors of rural Government Schools in Chamarajanagara. It is a van filled with various science experiments, models and other resources. The van visits various schools accompanied by a trained resource person who demonstrates the experiments and interacts with the teachers and children. In 2017-18, Asha for Education - Silicon Valley had approved funding for the Science Chariot project





On July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2018, Dr. Melliya Annamalai former President, Asha for Education and Principal Product Manager, Oracle USA formally inaugurated the Science Chariot project. However, in the beginning of the academic year, there were several hurdles from the Education department as well as the Transport Authority about regulations regarding a regular van functioning as an educational van. After sorting out these problems, since August 2018, the Science Chariot began regular visits to the selected 27 schools in Chamarajanagara





### 3.1 Chan Desaigoudar Foundation Science Talent Award 2018:

#### Chan Desaigoudar Science Talent Award Programme

To promote an attitude of research and innovation in Science, the Chan Desaigoudar foundation in collaboration with Deenabandhu, started the Science Talent Award Programme in 2017-18. In 2018-19, 18 schools had submitted proposals to participate in the programme. Among them, 15 schools were selected to participate in the exhibition which was held on 11<sup>th</sup> December 2018. Each of these 15 schools were given Rs 3,000 for preparation of the models. The award ceremony was held on 4<sup>th</sup> February, 2019. The first place, an amount of Rs 55,000, was awarded to Government High School, Megalahundi for their project titled “Pollution of soil and water due to agricultural activities and its effects”. The second place, an amount of Rs 25,000, was awarded to Government High School, Heggotara for their project titled “Seed sowing machine”.



## 4. Scholarship Programme

Deenabandhu has established a corpus fund for awarding scholarships in support of college studies for the students coming from poor rural families. Sri Chandrashekar Desaigoudar is the sole donor of this fund. We are deeply indebted to Desaigoudar Foundation. While he was studying in Stanford University, he was in need of financial support. An anonymous person gave him money and left a note “you need not return this money to me, but help others in need when you start earning”. This incident impressed the young mind of Sri Chandrashekar so much that he has devoted a significant amount of his earnings towards the cause of supporting rural poor but meritorious students. We have selected several schools from all over Karnataka State from Chamarajanagara to Bidar. Totally 977 students are benefited by this scheme.

### 4.1 Chandrashekar Desaigoudar Foundation Scholarship Meet

Chandrashekar Desaigoudar Foundation scholarship meet 2018 was conducted on **19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> of May 2018**. 33 scholarship winners from different parts of Karnataka attended the workshop. Most of them were from Haveri, Hassan, Belgaum, Chamarajnagara and Raichur. All were in the age group of 17-18 years.





Prof. G.S. Jayadev initiated the sessions with his key-note speech explaining the history behind Chan-Desaigoudar Scholarship program. Students were very inspired when they learnt about the story of Sri. Chandrashekar Desaigoudar. The very inspiring story of Sri Desaigoudar getting financial support from an anonymous person while he was studying at Stanford University moved them. They were touched when they learned that the anonymous supporter asked Sri. Chandrashekar Desaigoudar not to try finding who he/she was but to help another student in need when he himself becomes economically stable. They were impressed with Sri. Chandrashekar Desaigoudar and Smt. Aarathi Desaigoudar for initiating this scholarship program.

Later the workshop was inaugurated at 11:00AM by Revered Sri Mokashathmanandaji Maharaj, Ramakrishna Ashrama, Mysore. Sri Bannuru Prakash, Founder of Vivekananda School, Bannur Praksh also graced the occasion as chief guest.





Revered Sri Mokshathmanandhaji Maharaj in his inaugural speech spoke about the values of life in our day to day life with simple examples. He also taught bhajans to all the students. These devotional songs gave an auspicious beginning for the workshop. All the students and parents got involved in singing and enjoyed the inauguration.



The next session started at 12.00 PM. Sri. Bannur Prakash shared several stories from the life of Dr Shivarama Karanth. He added that the true blessing is this blessing of the scholarship which enables the students to achieve their dreams.





At 2.00 PM the first session in the afternoon was conducted by Sri. Veerabhadranayaka, Punarchit Trust, Nagavalli. His session was based on over exploitation of the resources that is happening and how all this is impacting the local environment. He focused

around Chamarajanagara district. He used data collected from many Govt. Institutions and scientists from IISc. He gave a detailed explanation about the impact the environmental mis-management has led to with respect to soil, ground water table, rains and agriculture in different areas of Chamarajanagara with relevant statistics. The session was not just about the global view but rather focused on our environment around. It made the students look at these issues as the needs to be addressed immediately as they are happening all around them.

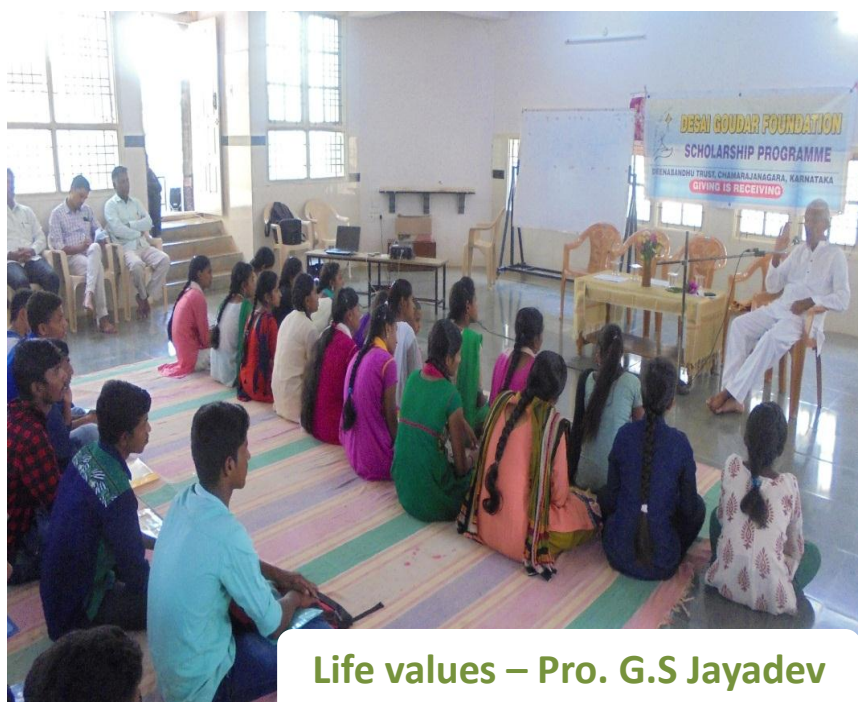
After this session Office Staffs, instructed students about Chan-Desaigoudar scholarship process and gave guidelines for the students as to how to keep in correspondence with us.

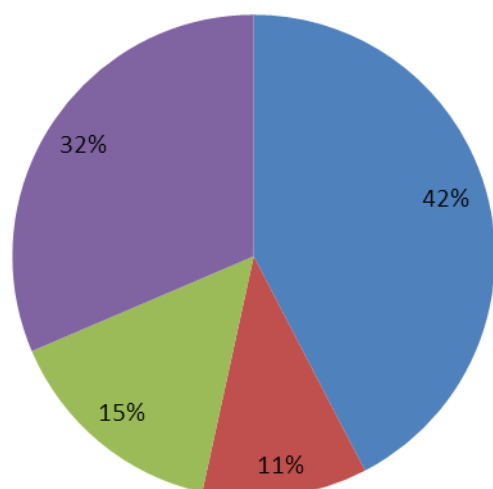

## **5. Rural Development and women empowerment through Gramabandhu Trust**

Gramabandhu is a trust which was registered in the year 2016 to take care of the rural development and women empowering projects. It is because of the vision of Prof. Jayadeva. He wants Deenabandhu to focus on education hence thought of registering another trust for rural development activities. Also rural and women empowering project may start to generate revenue. So it was decided by all the trustees of Deenabandhu to register a different trust to work towards these projects.

### **5.1: Nivedita Training Center for Women**

Nivedita Training Center for women trained more than 20 women this year.

Nivedita Training Center is tied up with Charaka, Heggodu, of Shimoga district. Charaka will send the hand-loomed cut pieces for various designs and sizes of Kurta. Our women at the center will stitch them and the stitched cloths are sent back to Charaka. Charaka in turn will pay a prescribed amount for each dress material stitched. All the money Charaka pays will be given completely to these women and the center is maintained by Deenabandhu from its own sources.

Nivedita training center not just trains women but is now employing them, making them economically independent. The centre is indeed living as per its dream of empowering women not just with the skills but is also making them socially and economically strong. Currently, over than 15 women are employed here.


