Organizational History:

Based in Mysore, Odanadi Seva Samsthe have launched a relentless campaign since 1992 to not only to curb and expose the flesh trade, but also rescue, rehabilitate and empower the victims of sexual exploitation. To date Odanadi busted 37 trafficking networks, rescued 1,230 women and rehabilitated them with alternative livelihoods, freed 650 minors, from the clutches of traffickers in various parts of Karnataka, and as many as 550 children have been reintegrated with their families. The mainstay of Odanadi's approach is its highly successful social policing program. Recognized by both the state and central governments, Odanadi is frequently consulted at the national level on its strategies and the central Human Resource Development Ministry is considering adopting the Odanadi model.

Through its research work "Bodies for A Meal" - 1993, Odanadi strongly felt that rehabilitation of prostituted women is difficult unless their children are protected from the clutches of flesh trade. However, the over dependency of the women on the pimps, clients, gangsters gives birth to unwanted children whose fathers most of the time never recognize as their own blood. If these children are not protected, the rehabilitation of prostituted women will be of no use.

So in 1995, Odanadi executed its concern by taking 20 children at once. At present the number has been increased to 86 both boys and girls. The children who are tuned according to Odanadi's philosophy are really enjoying the

child hood against their past wild nature. At Odanadi, importance has been given to the following matters.

1. A home with protection and freedom of choice.
2. Traditional Counselling.
3. Non-formal and joyful learning
4. Collectivity
5. Health and hygiene
6. Legal Services
7. Psycho-social therapies
8. Recreation
9. Vocational and skill development training
10. Socio-economic independence

Over the years, Odanadi's efforts have been recognized and its appeals for help were heard by a few socially concerned developmental oriented organizations like CRY, ASHA - Chapters, VIBHA etc. and a permanent home for the girls was established and Odanadi could able to launch its many pending dreams into reality.

But as far as the rehabilitation of boys are concerned, the organization could not think of a home of their own so far. As a matter of fact the conditions of rescued boys are not different from the girls. Many of the boys are the children of prostituted who had brought up with the harsh realities of the life. A few of them are rescued from other forms of exploitation such as slavery, beggary, being orphaned etc. So far Odanadi does not have a permanent exclusive rehabilitation home for them. Due to a lot of financial problem the organization is maintaining the rehabilitation of

boys. The lack of financial support towards this goal is discouraging Odanadi to take more boys into the program. The following are immediate needs for the boys rehabilitation.

1. A permanent home for 30 boys:

Odanadi has planned a boys home with the help of the architect Mr. K.T. Shivaprasad. This home can be built on the land (3 acres) at Mandakalli which was allotted by Government of Karnataka in 1999.

According to the plan the total area of the home is 3,268 sqft. and will have the following facilities and it needs Rs. 15,64,800.00 for the completion. Odanadi can mobilize Rs. 5,64,800.00 if you will kindly support us with Rs. Ten lakh for this cause.

2. Day to Day Program:

Similar to the girl's home the separate boys home will be providing the boys the following facilities:

Food, clothing, formal and non-formal education, recreation, health, kitchen utensils, bedding, toys and play materials and other furniture. A male supervisor has to be in charge of the home. If these facilities are provided Odanadi can be able to provide its services to more boys in future and the boys need not change their home very frequently due to the pressures created by the building owners and the surrounding people. A joyful education system can be thought of with the establishment of boys home.
