READING ACTIVITIES AT KEMPAPURA





Read alouds at Kempapura in August about the water cycle and the rainbow in connection with a project on the rainy season. The children also shared their memories of the rainy season.

SUPPORTING READERS THROUGH THE PRIMER



From June onwards there have been two classes a week with 3rd,4th and 5th standards at Tarabanahalli school. The children work in four groups according to ability.

These pictures show children using the primer that the FTLC team has prepared. There is a text book and a workbook and also additional materials for games such as matching rhyming words as seen here.

The materials are being piloted in three other schools including in Belagaum and we plan to approach funding agencies to cover the cost of illustration and for printing a limited edition for further trials in schools.








OBSERVATION ACTIVITY OF THE GASAGASE MARA (SINGAPORE CHERRY TREE) AT TARABANAHALLI

GHOSTS, SPIRITS AND WISHES

In September Sarojini and Gousia asked the 4th and 5th standard children at Tarabanahalli which theme they would like to discuss. To our surprise there was a unanimous request to look at *devas*. We began by asking the children to write and draw about stories they had heard and their .dreams. These were shared with enthusiasm both through role play and their owm texts and images. After some discussion we introduced a number of books including "A Kite called Korika". The children then each made a kite and wrote their own wishes which included 'To read well' – 'the loan at home should be settled soon', 'good health for my sister's baby' - a cycle'.









FUTURE PLANS

- Workshops with 3rd,4th and 5th standard children from Tarabanahalli and Kempapura schools to be hosted at the FTLC between November to February.
- Meeting on stories and nature with teachers and educators to be hosted at FTLC in March 2023.
- Project on Night with Kempapura and Tarabanahalli schools in conjunction with NCF.
- Approach organizations to support publishing the Kannada primer materials.
