Asha Impressions

Asha Impressions is a competition on Digital Literacy and Computer Science held every year. This is the first year we were holding it in UP, involving schools from both Rajatalab and our other UP Project, Mirzapur. Projects were carried out by teams of 3 to 4 in different schools and submitted for evaluation. Shortlisted projects were called for the Asha Impressions event where the students presented the projects to a jury consisting of Asha Volunteers and external members from local institutions. A total of about 60 students from 18 projects took part in the final event. Three projects were selected in each of the two categories and awarded prizes. The event was a grand success and provided great exposure for the students
