

Progress Overview of the Org.

Antyodoy Anath Ashram has undertaken a number of initiatives to meet the needs and requirements of the residents as well as the other students of KSSK throughout the pandemic. In the post-covid-19 period, certain developments are going on within the ashram. Starting from covid-19 response kit to the distribution of oxygen concentrators has been carried out by AAA.
As the covid-19 pandemic restrictions eased around the state, the ashram took the initiative to introduce vegetation within the premise for the resident children. Offline classes are conducted through smartphones, where both the residents and non-resident children have started attending classes.









Education













During Lockdown















In the wake of the second pandemic wave, the school (KSSK) was not functioning due to the government-imposed restrictions. Online classes were introduced for nonresidential students, whereas classes were conducted online and offline for residential students. The residential teachers took the offline classes following all the covid-19 protocols, while the nonresidential teachers conducted classes online following the usual yearly schedule. As and when the restrictions were being lifted, it was convenient for the teachers to pay regular visits to the families to check up on their students. Learning materials were provided, and classes were taken individually or in small groups through the Paray Shikshalaya initiative. Some of the students who lived close to the ashram came to attend classes with the resident students. Resident students have received virtual classes through a partnership program with Adore India. Resident KSSK students also get opportunities to participate in cultural programs along with the older residents of the ashram.

Post Lockdown

The school reopened in February 2022 for students of all classes. Precautionary protocols are being followed as well. Along with studies, students are involved in self-development and recreational activities. The students get computer classes every weekend along with regular exercise and yoga taught by a yoga teacher. The students had their exams in April, and presently the classes are off for summer vacation.





Initiatives taken by AAA: 2021 to Present











Oxygen Concentrator Distribution

During the second wave of the coronavirus, AAA took the initiative to distribute oxygen concentrators in 17 hospitals. These hospitals are Bararankua Rural Hospital, Pichhaboni PHC, Nijmaithuna PHC, Hamirpur PHC, Majna BPHC, Nayaput PHC, Kulberiya PHC, Kharipukuria BPHC, Banamalichatta PHC, Heria PHC, Bhagwanpur Rural Hospital, Bibhisanpur PHC, Kajlagarh PHC, Seulipur PHC, Bhupatinagar Mugberia BPHC, Simulia PHC, and Barbaria PHC. A total of 19 oxygen concentrators were distributed in 6 blocks.





Recreational Activities







Children's Day was celebrated in 2021 among the residential children, and they also took part in cultural programs. In order to promote and safeguard the right of all children to live and grow with equity, dignity, security and freedom and ensure that all children have equal opportunities like other children of the society, monthly birthday celebrations are hosted in the ashram. This measure is taken to build up selfconfidence, self-dignity and sensitize all inmates of the ashram by celebrating their birthday for each inmate every month at once.

Sustainable Activities

As a part of the sustainable efforts of Antyodoy Anath Ashram, a kitchen garden has been introduced. This kitchen garden is also a recreational and learning activity for the children of the ashram. Spread across almost 4 acres of land, this garden is filled with vegetable plantations, fruit plantations, flower plantations and a huge pond for breeding fishes. All of these activities are conducted following natural procedures and without chemical products. The vegetation is used for feeding the ashram children and staff. As a measure of selfgrowth, students are allotted a particular area within the garden under their name to grow their own vegetation.

We are hoping to put more effort into developing the future of the children of the ashram. These initiatives taken are necessary for the children's growth but with precaution and following the covid-19 protocol.
