Introduction

Srujanavani is founded on the core principles of Truth-seeking, Love, Faith, Drive to Excel, and Righteousness nurturing people towards greater intellect, uniform conduct, values, and social developmental activities.

Srujanavani's commitment to empowering rural communities through education is grounded in the belief that education is a transformative force capable of breaking the cycle of poverty, fostering sustainable development, and unlocking the full potential of individuals and communities.

Our vision is to establish a state-of-the-art learning centre in rural areas that serves as a beacon of opportunity, fostering holistic development, and catalyzing positive transformation within our communities. We envision a future where every individual, regardless of their geographical location, has access to world-class education and skills training.

Our Journey So Far

Srujanavani established a pilot-scale Skill Development Centre in Vaddadi, Visakhapatnam. This initiative has been a beacon of hope, opening doors to a brighter future for the community we serve.

Before construction began, our infrastructure comprised a small hall accommodating 40 students and a small computer lab designed for 10 students, along with a non-conductive asbestos shed used for kitchen and dining. These facilities were insufficient for the expanding requirements of the 500+ students enrolled in our programs each year. Our children faced real hardship sleeping on the floor during residential camps, too few toilets, and no protection from the summer heat, monsoon rains, or winter cold. These conditions were affecting their learning.

Confronted with these realities, Srujanavani resolved to expand and elevate the Skill Development Centre into Unnathi Bhavan, a state-of-the-art Training and Learning Centre to relieve the hardship our students face, and to create a platform where their talents can be discovered and given wings.

Unnathi Bhavan is Srujanavani's ₹2,50,00,000 (₹2.5 Crore) vision for a fully-equipped Training & Learning Centre training halls, a workshop centre, computer lab, library, residential facilities for boys and girls, and a dining hall, serving 500+ students a year. It is being built in two phases: Phase 1, estimated at ₹75,00,000 at project inception, is the training-hall building that is the subject of this proposal; Phase 2, estimated at ₹1,75,00,000, will add the residential and expanded workshop facilities that complete the vision.

Current Activities & Beneficiaries

Even as construction has progressed, our existing programs have continued uninterrupted:

Phase 1 Construction Progress Where We Are Today (August 2026)

Ground was broken for Unnathi Bhavan at a Bhoomi Puja on 12 April 2026, attended by well-wishers and the partners who have made this project possible.

Since then, construction has moved steadily through statutory approvals, site setting-out, and the full foundation package footings, plinth beam, columns, and septic tank all now complete and verified. The building has since progressed into brick masonry and structural frame work.

Milestones 5 and 6 the building's waterproofing, plumbing and electrical first-fix, followed by flooring, doors/windows, painting, sanitary and electrical finishing are both yet to begin. Completion of the ready-for-use facility is targeted for November 2026, an estimated timeline that allows adequate time for the remaining structural, MEP and finishing work once funding is in place we would rather deliver ahead of a conservative date than promise an optimistic one.

Separately, and outside the scope of this request, the Kitchen & Dining block on the Unnathi Bhavan campus is being taken up in association with Octave Technologies, Hyderabad, which has committed ₹28,00,000 towards it, of which ₹10,00,000 has been released to date. That commitment is tracked independently of the Phase 1 (training hall) budget below.

Srujanavani's original Phase 1 estimate, quoted at project inception, was ₹75,00,000. Actual costs have run a little higher than that top-line figure, largely because boundary wall construction (₹6,65,600, shown above) and a portion of site landscaping both originally scoped for Phase 2 were advanced into this phase for construction-logistics reasons. This is a modest, deliberate overlap rather than a cost overrun on the core training-hall scope.

Detailed Cost Estimate to Complete Phase 1

The table below is Srujanavani's internal, site-level cost estimate for the remaining scope of Phase 1 the Unnathi Bhavan training-hall building prepared in August 2026 as construction has progressed:

This Request

With this proposal, Srujanavani Voluntary Association requests a grant of ₹10,00,000 (Rupees Ten Lakh only) from Asha for Education – Silicon Valley Chapter towards completing Phase 1 of Unnathi Bhavan. We are concurrently requesting ₹20,00,000 (Rupees Twenty Lakh only) from Asha for Education – Kansas City Chapter, as a complementary and non-overlapping tranche towards the same funding gap we wanted both chapters to have full visibility of this parallel ask.

Indicative Use of ₹10,00,000

This grant would fund the sanitary fixtures, flooring, doors and windows that make the completed building usable day to day part of the interior finishing work under Milestone 6:

Together, these two grants (₹30,00,000) combined with our current cash balance of ₹21,54,319 would fund ₹51,54,319 of the ₹51,70,000 required to complete Phase 1 of Unnathi Bhavan a residual of just ₹15,681, which Srujanavani will cover directly.
