Parents participate in the organization's activities by investing their time and labor as follows:

- Monthly guardian meeting is an integral component of the school ecosystem, ensuring guardians' participation and making them accountable for their children's education.
- Parents participate in students' cultural activities and sports events organized by the school.
- Guardians are also actively involved in students' progress tracking and the decision-making process. Through constant engagement, they have developed the ability to assess the progress of the school and their children and put suggestions in the decision-making meetings. Active involvement of guardians in their children's education system creates a learning environment that is conducive to development and supportive of community engagement.

8. **Why did the parents choose this school over the Government School?**

- **Proximity and accessibility:** The school is located close to the local villages, whereas nearby Government schools are farther away and less accessible for young children.
- **Quality of teaching and low student-teacher ratio:** The school maintains a favorable student-teacher ratio, enabling individual attention, regular progress tracking, and additional support for weaker students.

- **Engaging and child-friendly teaching methods:** Use of participatory, activity-based learning, colorful teaching–learning materials, storytelling, and hands-on activities makes learning more effective and enjoyable compared to rote-based instruction in many Government schools.
- **Emphasis on digital education, STEM subjects and English as the medium of teaching:** A new school building funded by Educo, Ireland was inaugurated on January 13, 2026, featuring modern teaching facilities such as a computer lab with eight computers, a smart classroom, and conference rooms. In line with Educo’s guidelines, the school is transitioning to an English-medium model with a strong focus on STEM and digital learning, generating significant interest among students and parents from the village and nearby communities, with enrolment for this academic year nearing 300.
- **Holistic development focus:** Along with academics, the school emphasizes character building, values education, yoga, Bratachari, arts, music, and physical activities, supporting all-round development.
- **Strong parent–teacher engagement:** Regular parent–teacher meetings, home visits, and continuous communication build trust and accountability, which parents value.
- **Supportive services beyond academics:** Provision of educational materials, health check-ups, nutritious food, and co-curricular opportunities reduces the burden on economically disadvantaged families.
- **Safe and nurturing environment:** The school follows a compassionate, non-punitive approach, creating a secure and encouraging learning environment for children.

9. When you visited, how many children were present in the class?

When we visited the school in January 2026, there were around 300 students in the school from Nursery to Grade 5.

10. What is the regular class strength?

Each class had around 20 to 25 students on average, who were taught by 14 teachers (4 male and 10 female) who are supported by 4 additional staff members (computer lab instructor and non-teaching staff). In addition to the regular classes, the school has a library. The computer lab, which started with 4 computers last year, has now been expanded to have 8 computers. The new school building that was inaugurated on January 13, 2026, now has a digital classroom and conference rooms.

11. Do the children seem to enjoy coming to school?

Yes, the students were very enthusiastic about attending the school. We visited a few classes and interacted with the students. They talked about the different subjects like English, Mathematics, Science, Bengali etc. that were being taught at the school. They were also very excited about the Computer lab and the digital classroom. Later in the day, there was a cultural program by the students where they performed dance, song, recitation, elocution and drama.

The teachers are trained on specific subjects as per requirement. A lot of emphasis is being given to digital education and using English as the primary medium of teaching. A new Principal has been

recruited to steer the transition of the school to English Medium as per Educo guidelines. Teachers with Masters and B.Ed degrees are also being recruited, who in turn, are training other teachers.
