Sahanivasa Funding Request

Academic Year 2025-2026

Background:

- In operation since 1985, supported by Asha since 2000.
- Sahanivasa works to empower the marginalized Dalits, Adivasis, farmers, women and children.
- Educates them with skills & knowledge to own their future.
- Asha support is towards childrens' supplemental education in 10 high schools & 15 primary schools impacting 1820 students this AY.
- All teachers are from the same locality, with 18 out of the 45 for this AY being old students of these same centers!
- Funding consideration here is for this academic year (to the end of March 2026). Proposal for 2025-2027 available on the project page here.
- Requesting INR 27,09,825/- (rounding up to 27,10,000/-) which includes starting a computer education center for the post 10th std students.

Out of 479 students who took the 10th standard exams, 119 students failed initially, translating to only a 75.15% pass rate. This was very disappointing, particularly since the previous year had seen an initial 96% pass rate while also transitioning to English medium. It appears that there was interference from a political donor who owns schools causing many students to be failed deliberately. A reevaluation found that 60% of the students who had originally been declared to have failed had actually passed! After this reevaluation and retaking the exam, the final pass rate is 98.2%, with 3 girls and 5 boys failing and 2 being absent, i.e., 469 students passed.

Computer Education Center

An earlier discussion about prospects for children after successfully completing 10th class showed:

- About 35% of these students still encounter challenges in advancing to higher studies
- Some students simply cannot afford the "luxury" of higher studies and have to start employment.
- Students who do pursue college feel disadvantaged over their lack of computer skills

This proposal is to set up a Computer Education Center to help address above issues.
