

Since time immemorial, the majestic islands of Sunderbans have been subject to brutal attacks from nature, so much so, that the people have become used to the regular natural exigencies that create havoc in their lives. Hundreds of thousands of people are victimized year after year.... Property worth billions are lost every year... Many a young life has been lost.... Still, the tales of woe and anguish continue in those remote villages cornered by rampaging sea and throbbing rivers....!

The entire Sunderban delta, consisting of 54 big islands, numerous small ones and the landmass arouse a wild romanticism in all and sundry. The welcoming greenery, umpteen rivers and creeks, swaying boat rides, adventurous forest lives, delicate shrimps, mouth watering fish, tiger prawn and the Royal Bengal Tiger – what else do one require to lit fire to their imagination. Sunderbans makes poets out of duds and idiots. For the ordinary people from outside, it is the land of great adventure and leisurely boat rides to lay off from the busy world outside.

But for the estimated 4 million people residing today, Sunderbans is their habitat, the land of their birth, their toil and probably their death. For them, their land has been bestowing misery after misery on those hapless souls... never giving a respite from the dangers of natural disasters. Year after year, the story of tears and toils are repeated. Still, the people go on with their lives – for centuries now – with the eternal hope that one day, their miseries will come to and end and they will lead a happy peaceful life.

Project Area of BTS : Demography & Situation

BTS is currently working in 6 villages under one G.P. of Kultali block, Sunderbans. All the villages are riverine, highly remote and underdeveloped with no infrastructure whatsoever. The demographic profile of the villages are given below:

All the villages are riverine, with the only existing communication between the mainland being through river boats. Within the villages too, there are no proper roads and walking is the only mode of transport for the villagers. Diamond Harbour is about 80 kms and Calcutta is about 125 kms from Kultali.

Additionally in the year 2003-04, BTS has initiated post-



flood relief measures alongwith other development efforts in the second island block area-Pathar Pratima which is one of the neibouring block-areas of BTS. Only two villages - Purba Sripatinagar and Paschim Sripatinagar in the Pathar Pratima delta have been included into the project area. Most of the people (85%) are below the poverty line and from the minorities. Prawn-Seed collection from the rivers and tributaries, fishing and netting in the rivers fully infested with Crocodiles, collection of Non-Timber Forest Produces (NTFPs) from the reserved forest areas full of man-eating Royal Bengal Tigers, Vending and Van (Three Wheellers) pulling for carriage of vegetables and others domestic goods. A good number of poor dailywage labourers are being migrated to the urban areas for search of livelihood sources.

BTS EFFORTS : A GLIMPSE ON THE PAST

- 1982-1983 Registration of Baikunthapur Tarun Sangha (BTS).
- O nly the Mud Built community Centre was given a new shape constructed and donated by LUTHERAN WORLD SERVICE (LWS), KULTALI PROJECT where a Pre-Primary School (for the poor community students from poor peasants groups and scheduled caste families) was set up.
- 1984-1985 A Feeding Centre was run by the kind support from LWS, Kultali Project. Poor children under acute malnutrition and hunger came from the most helpless families.
- 1986-1988 A Sports Club was established for initiating the physical exercise and sports culture among the rural youth stars.
- A cultural unit Sunderban Sangeet-O-Sanskriti Parishad under the auspices of cultural affairs of BTS and A Music college SUR-O-BANI MUSIC COLLEGE started to promote cultural aspects among rural people, especially among rural youths-boys and girls.
- 1993-1994 National Environmental Awareness Campaign (NEAC) was organised on waste management. Sponsored by the Ministry of Environment and Forests, Govt. of India.
- Awareness Generation Project (AGP) Among Rural Poor Women sponsored by the Central Social Welfare Board was organised alongwith the NEAC on Joint Forest Management.
 - Grain Bank for poor farmers set up to give grain support in their harder days.
- Regional Resource Agency (NEAC) under the Ministry of Environment & Forests, Govt. of India certified our organisation as First Splendid Implementor of NEAC Project on the national theme on "Women and Environment" in West Bengal region.
- 1996-1997 Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India offered our FCR Registration 1996 to receive Foreign supports for welfare & development concerns.
 - Science Seminar on "Environmental Preservation," Sponsored by the Deptt. of Science & Technology, Govt. of West Bengal was organised. Women participants from NGO levels, Mahila Mandals, Gram Panchayat were present to decide future actions relating to Environment Preservation.
 - A Training-cum-production Centre 'SWANIRVAR' was set up. 15 rural poor women have taken sole initiative as a Self-Help Group (SHG) initially to promote its activities for women's self-reliance. Group Savings is under processing stage to be undertaken soon.
- 1997-1998 A Children's Park- "Children's Paradise," has been established with financial assistance of SAHAY, Kolkata through BSSK.
- 1998-1999 A Collaborating project on Sustainable Agriculture (Nutritional Gardening by village Housewives) has been initiated in close collaboration with Development Research Communication & Services Centre (DRCSC) with Funds from Christian Aid (UK)
 - Performed as First among the NEAC 1998 99 implementing organisation in 24 pgs(s) district in West Bengal under "National Environment Awareness Campaign (NEAC) 1998-99" Sponsored by the Ministry of Environment & Forests, Govt. of India.
- 1999-2000 A Child Care Centre, Sishutirtha for 25 infants of rural working mothers was established with financial aid from Central Social Selfare Board (CSWB) through W.B.Social Welfare Advisory Board.
- 2000-2001 Another child centre, Green Buds for 25 infants established with assistance from CSWB.
 - A Condensed Course of Education for Rural Dropout Girls initiated with aid from CSWB, New Delhi.
 - The Cyclone-affected school building of BTS-Path Bhavan (Basic education Prog.) was constructed with financial support from Irish Aid, Embassy of Ireland.
- 2001-2002 Asha for Education (Seattle Chapter-USA) extended their supports towards Promotion of Basic Education for rural children in need.
- An Agro-Equipment-Support Service (AES) Program funded by PPI, USA was initiated for small farmers.



"Sambhab" — Community Health Care Project (CHP)

Healthcare services are the most needed support to the people in Kultali and Patharpratima Development Block. With no health facilities available, it has become an extremely important for the project areas to initiate integrated health care services to reduce over dependence on superstitions and religious practices. Unfortunately, despite its great efforts and keenness, BTS has not been able to do much in the health care sector for want of support and aid. The activities implemented till date has been restricted to Preventive and little bit of Curative services. Pulse-Polio Immunization camps were organized in collaboration with the BMOH of Kultali under the National Pulse Polio Immunization Program.



Indians for Collective Action (ICA)-USA has continued their kind support to take a drive on Community Healthcare in the project area of BTS. Ekjut (USA), L & PND Memorial Trust (Kolkata) and Mr. Anil Chandra (U.P.) have kindly extended their humanitarian supports for the medical care of suffering people.

Kultali is the largest island in Sunderbans, the world famous mangrove delta formed bu the distributories of river Ganaes, Todau, Sunderbans is basking in the glory of its new status as an International Heritage

Site. The world over, people know Sunderbans as the habitat of the Royal Bengal Tiger, a haven of flora and fauna... where nature has poured out is best of creative abilities in abundance. The land of rivers, islands and unlimited adventure and joy...

Though Baikuntapur Tarun Sangha - BTS - has been working in Kultali island for more than twenty one (21) years and Kultali block is considered to be the most underdeveloped blocks of Sunderbans, both the islands are remote and spread out making transport and communication difficult. The excuse of their difficult geographic positioning has become bane to Kultali and Patharpratima's development. As a development organization, we in BTS are very concerned about the state of affairs.

That is why, we still have a dream...!!!

Our dream is to take back Kultali and Patharpratima to their past glory, when nature sang in tune with the people. People were optimally utilizing whatever resources available in Kultali and Patharpratima, without ever encroaching or exploiting unduly. We want to make sure that every child in Kultali and Patharpratima enion their right and freedom as children. We want to ensure that every women has equal rights and enjoys the same status and privilege as their male counterparts. We want that there is no poverty in Kultali and Patharpratima. We want Kultali and Patharpratima to have best or roads, best of irrigation, best of water systems and best of infrastructure. We want Kultali and Patharpratima to be the Model Islands! We want this dream to be met with benevolent supports from our as well as from any national & international supporting organisation!








Livelihood Sources : People at Risky Hazards

Agriculture and related activities are the major occupation for the villagers. Almost 70 percent of the employed people are engaged in agro-related activities. Despite abundant land and water resource, cultivation is done only once in a year. Many farmers have changed farming tracks to pulses and vegetables from grain. There are 2189 ponds (!) in the project area, a vital aspect of irrigation

and fishery, which has never been put to good use. In addition to farming, fishery, prawn seed collection, daily labor, vending vegetables and fish, paddle rickshaw van (goods carriage) pulling, fishing and netting in the rivers and the seas form the other occupations. Working Children/Domestic Child Labor is very high and the unfortunate, poor families are bound to send their sons & daughters to the urban areas for supplimentary income and there repeats the story of frustration and despair. Mainly the girl children get the maximum tragic loss with a heavy heart.

Baikunthapur Tarun Sangha : The Genesis :

In 1978, a group of youngsters, like many other groups elsewhere in the state, started their Club for fun and frolic. The major floods that hit the Kultali island in 1982 made the youngsters to undertake a series of relief measures, physically helping victims to reach safer places, pleading the government and administration for relief support and generally organizing the relief camps. It was the turning point in the history of the Club. The youngsters understood their utility-value to the society and their eyes were opened to the appalling nature of development. They saw poverty in its stark-nudity and total lack of apathy and support from other quarters, including their elected representatives to the government. They resolved then that they will strive to provide better service to their poor brethrens. Thus was Baikunthapur Tarun Sangha born, known in short as BTS. It was registered under the West Bengal Society Registration Act and later received the certification under Foreign Contribution Regulation Act, 1976 of Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India.

Education was the primary weapon to empower people. The groups started to undertake awareness camps and campaigns and soon, a Learning Centre was started in the village of Baikunthapur, which today accommodates about 200 children from nearby villages, and presents a Model School, BTS-Path Bhavan on Basic Education.

However, for the past five years or so, BTS has been able to attract funds and support to its philanthropic missions. Today, BTS is providing integrated development support to the poor disadvantaged people from 6 remote villages in Kultali islands and 2 costal villages in Patharpratima island from education to income generation and health care support. BTS nurtures a dream, a dream to convert Kultali and Patharpratima into the Islands of Joy...!! where people usually strugle for their existance in the midst of natural disasters like flood & cyclone which damage a lot and make people helpless so that they are to go to the urban areas in search jobs to earn their daily breads just leaving their near & dear ones n the hearts of tradic-islands













"BIKALPER SANDHANE" – SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE PROJECT (SAP)

6 years' before BTS entered into a strategic implementation of Sustainable Agricultural Project (SAP). The major objective of the project is to ensure food security among the poor & the marginalized, minimizing the indiscriminate use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides and promoting the use of bio-fertilizers and bio-pesticides under the old agro farming techniques The project gives emphasis on local natural resource optimization. The project has been launched in two phases: Home/Nutrition Gardening by rural poor widows & housewifes and Small Farm Improvement Program for small and marginal farmers in the villages. Through this project, it is expected that the farmers will be able to cultivate fallow lands with residual moisture. Embassy of Ireland, New **Delhi** has funded the project to make it possible through establishment & promotion of an Agro-Resource Centre (ARC) which has been developed with a workshed alongwith some agro-equipments and a demonstration initiatives for the farmers of this island, Kultali. In the project, some trainning and sensitization programmes for the Nutritional Gardeners' Clubs (NGCs) and Farma Resource Clubs (FRCs). A Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) is there to assist the project people with financial loan assistance which can be revoloved for the farmars' Socio Economic Development (SED) efforts. Besides agro-equipments, poor fishermen are being supported with fishing nets. People for Progress in India (PPI), USA is also a part of this project. Poor farmers are being supported with agroequipments at a very affordable price lower than the on-going local market prices. For this, an Agro-Equipment Support (AES) service unit has been developed under the banner of ARC-Vikalper Sandhane.

SISHUTIRTHA & GREEN BUDS are the two Child Care Centers (Creches) for 0-5 age group children under support from VIBHA (USA) & CSWB through West Bengal Social Welfare Advisory Board (WBSWAB). Since majority of the women are engaged in daily work, BTS thought it feasible to offer support to the rural working mothers through the creche support. The centers, while taking care of the children, offer nutritional food and immunization support to the children. All the children are given free medical assistance. Four experienced Creche Motherstake care of the children while the mothers are away. Currently, the center supports 50 children, 25 infants in each centre. Enrollment is restricted by lack of support. There are over 100 children under wait list to be enrolled in the child care project. We need supports for construction of child care centre Building for children's proper accomodation...!



People for Progress in India (PPI), U.S.A. extended their kind & benevolent supports by which one Power Tiller, two nos. of Pump sets for irregational advantage, five paddy threshers have been managed to purchase and thus we are developped a Agro-Eqipment Supportservice for the promotion of Farma-Resource-Club (FRC) activities in the island areas. FRC members are getting Agro-Equipment Supports at a cheaper rate much lower then that of the market. Embassy of Ireland, New Delhi has extended their kind support to set up a portion of an Agro-Resource Centre (ARC) along with equipping the Agro Equipment Centre with modern Agro Machineries & a Revolving

Community Grain Bank (Dharmagola) Program :

The above programm is the result of the mutual understanding of our community people so as to combat the hard days, the days of natural calamities like devastating flood and cyclone, which is very common and regular to the islands....!

In this grain bank programm, their are enough stock of paddy as food grains and seed grains what the co-operative members use to take as loans with a condition to repay the same in due date so as to have scope for the next year. Present stock of foodgrains (Paddy) is 2500 kg. and the number of community members involved is 130.

Jeevan Sanchay Prakalpo (JSP) : Savings & Micro-Credit Ventures

To empower rural women, particularly the housewives and the unemployed girls, Widows & Tiger Widows, BTS has taken a special initiative towards socio economic upliftment of women. Computer Literacy Program (CLP) : A Way to Self Reliance

Computer Literacy is a very important part in life in Rural areas like Sunderban. Most of the places do not have any scope to provide computer learning to the Rural Children & the Youth...that is due to the absence of electricity and absence of proper idea of learning computer and its importants.

This year BTS initiates at its best to make arrangements for setting up a Computer Lab as a BTS has been gifted some used computers from FOYM - USA. Having those computers, BTS plants to start a Computer Literacy Program in collaboration with Asha For Education, USA. Nearabout 36 students & youths are their to have weekly classes & demonstration on computer application.

Junior Scholarship Program (JSP) : A Boom to poor briliants

BTS has started a very popular and needful program for the poor & meritorious students at fourth level. As soon as completing the fourth level of education under West Bengal Primary Education Board, the interested & qualified children are allowed to sit for the for the scholarship program & awarded a Certificate of Merit along with a trophy & Rs.1,000/- per successful candidates. In the year 2003-2004, BTS has organised the program where 65 briliant students from 11 Govt. Aided basic schools & 2 private schools including BTS Path Bhavan have participated. Out of 65 only 15 qualified students who secured 70% marks in the competition have been awarded the JSP incentives.

BTS Rural Library : A Community Service in need

There are no Rural Library to serve the community people including the Rural Youths as well as the school goers. BTS was trying to start a Community Library at BTS campus. With supports from Raja Ram Mohan Roy Library Foundation, Kolkata under the auspices of Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India BTS has started a Rural Library where can be found some resource books and a reading arrangements with Audio Visual interest. BTS is trying to develop the Rural Library into a Rural Community Resource Centre with supports from Asha for Education, USA through WAH-2004.

School Infrastructure Development for Govt. Aided basic schools in one Local Self-Govt. (Panchayat) area in Kultali. 11 schools have been selected as per basic survey and thorough discussion with the donor organisation, Asha for Education, USA.

Disaster Mitigation & Emergency Relief Services :

Most of the places of Sunderban are under the prey of natural disaster like Flood & Cyclone. Frequently many parts & portion of this zone are hit by natural calamities which destroy not only the lives of our people but damage the crops and vegetables causing a deplorable situation without food & shelter.

To mitigate the distressing situation of the area, BTS has initiated a need based activity on Disaster Mitigation & Emergency Relief Services to the helpless community in need. Community Sensitization along with emergency services are allowed to go on for the betterment of the coastal people in need

This year a massive flood & cyclone due to heavy rain dmaged a lot including the huts of the poor-the only shelter for their loving ones. Palli Unnoyan Samiti-Baruipur, a Christian organisation & Asha for Education has extended supports for the flood victims who have been provided with Rice, Dal, Coocking Oil, Blankets etc. at an emergency need.
