#### Details on the school curriculum

The workbooks are contextually relevant and are prepared by the facilitators keeping the state board core curriculum as the benchmark for the lower grades. The students learn Kannada (the vernacular) as the first language, English as the second language, and Hindi as the third language, & Math, Science, & Social Studies as core subjects. The computer is not taught as a separate subject but it is incorporated in to the languages. The 10<sup>th</sup> grade students' curriculum also includes all components of the mainstream state board examination requirement. Beside this formal curriculum, the school has its informal way of creating a learning environment by organizing exposure visits, regular sessions on sports, arts & crafts. The traditional tribal songs, stories, dances, & archery are all focused on by the school. This not only introduces these activities to the younger generations but also preserves the tribal ethnicity. The school conducts adventure camps, nature camps & summer camps to boost the students' confidence, strength & talents. The life skills recommended by WHO are oriented and are inculcating those skills. The school is also focusing on counseling, career guidance and vocational training.

The school also actively endeavors to preserve and encourage tribal art and culture while providing modern education, so that these kids fit into the mainstream while retaining their pride & heritage. VTCL trains its facilitators in teaching methodologies, preparation of teaching - learning materials and provides resource support for both curricular and co-curricular activities.

#### Long-term goals of the project (mention any changes you foresee)

**Goal:** Quality Education, focusing on values, literacy, numeracy and appropriate vocational training through joyful, experiential and child centered learning processes for children in H.D.Kote taluk in the age group of 6 to15, particularly girls.

Integrating basic knowledge and skills related to Agriculture Science, Mechanical, Electrical and Electronics as vocational skills in school curriculum for classes 6th to 10th Standard

#### **Objectives:**

- Providing quality, contextually relevant & contemporary Primary & Secondary education for forest based indigenous tribal children from class 1 to class 10.
- Providing physical & Psycho social care leading to holistic development of children.
- Providing care, guidance & counseling, placement, support & linkage to children graduating from the school.
- Introducing Introduction to Basic Technology [6<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> standard students].
- To inculcate and maintain good health & hygiene by healthy practices.
- To provide hobby class for 50 students.
- To be champions in state & national level sports meet.

• To be champions in competitions & exams.

#### Description of current school facilities (building, equipment etc)

The school presently has the following facilities:

- Well equipped library with 9500 books, 550 CDs & 270 audio cassettes
- Resource room cum Montessori lab
- Computer lab with 15 PCs for 40 students in each batch
- Science laboratories
- Hostel Facility separately for boys and girls
- Classrooms with open, semi-closed & closed structure
- Office
- Staffroom
- Sports materials
- Introduction to Basic Technology Workshop 'Koushalya Kuteera'-
- Residential quarters for staff & guest
- Audio-visual room cum SAATH centre

#### What do you need to improve these facilities?

- We need a room for 7<sup>th</sup> standard as that room is used for SAATH centre & Audiovisual room.
- Access to internet on all computers.
- Montessori educational materials for integrating Montessori Method from 1<sup>st</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> grade.
- The necessary tools & equipments for IBT workshop.
- In-service trainings for staff to enrich refresh & make them competent enough for the modern methodologies & strategies in the facilitation.

#### How do you think the school has improved in the last year?

- In the academic year 2013-14, SSLC board exams commenced on 28<sup>th</sup> March 2013. 43 students appeared for the exam at GHS, Beechanahalli. (16 girls and 27 boys). The SSLC board examinations result was announced on May 13<sup>th</sup> and the school got 65% pass result. 28 students [20 boys & 8 girls] successfully got through the exam with 9 second class & 19 pass.
- The school focused on agriculture particularly organic farming at the kitchen garden in the campus. They grew lot of vegetables, greens and fruits. The students' joy was overwhelmed to grow local and eat local produce. It was a great pride for them.

• Prize-winning participation in competitions conducted by Swaralaya in Kannada essay writing and drawing contest.

- As usual, VTCL students excelled at the HPS Taluk level sports meet held subsequently and they participated in district level. At Zonal level & taluk level, HS students bagged Individual and School Championship award. They represented the Taluk in District level sports meet and excelled in their disciplines. The students also bagged prizes in Dasara & PAICA sports meet.
- Inter-school interaction events organized students to facilitate cultural and creative exchanges, exposure and confidence building involving students of Sri Ramakrishna Vidya Shala, Mysore, Viveka School of Excellence, Sargur, etc.
- The students of high school took Ramayana exam. It is a certificate course conducted by a private agency.
- The students also took competitive exams in Math, Science, & other essay competitions
- The competed in hobli, taluk and district level Prathibha Karanji programs and won many places. This is a government organized program to identify and boost the talents of school children.
- This year 4 students are opted technical courses at Netturu Technical Training Foundation , 5 students joining Central Institute of Plastic Engineering Technology, 1 opted Science course , one commerce and 13 opted art course for 11<sup>th</sup> grade.


#### What are the problems you have faced in the last year?

- Staff recruitment [Office Asst., Care Taker, Resource Manager]


#### How would you rate the overall effectiveness of this project over the past year? Please include information on pass rates.

their health & hygiene at school & hostel, decrease in dropout rates and early marriages, increase in the number of students pursuing higher education, etc





SSLC Performance over the year - 1999-2013
