1. INTRODUCTION

The monthly review meeting of Bharati Trust Vidya Kendras was conducted on **01 September 2026** at the Bharati Trust Office. The meeting focused on reviewing centre functioning, student enrolment and attendance, teaching and learning activities, foundational development, FAT preparation, and progress observed during centre visits.

2. VIDYA KENDRA-WISE ACADEMIC STATUS

2.1 Sondekola Vidya Kendra

Total Classes: 1st to 7th Standard **Total Teachers:** 2

Teachers: Parameshwar Sir and Chandrashekar Sir

Total Student Strength: 40 **Regular Attendance:** 26 students

Observation: The centre is functioning with two teachers instead of the earlier three-teacher arrangement. Regular academic activities are being conducted for students from 1st to 7th Standard.

2.2 Thekalavatti Vidya Kendra

Teachers: Jagadish Sir and Pavithra Madam

Classes: Pavithra Madam – 1st to 4th Standard (25 enrolled, 22 attending); Jagadish Sir – 5th to 7th Standard (18 enrolled, 16 attending).

Total Student Strength: 43 **Regular Attendance:** Approximately 40 students

Observation: The centre is functioning regularly, with teachers supporting younger and higher classes.

2.3 Hulluru Vidya Kendra

LKG–3rd: 17 students – Shwetha Madam – basic concepts, two-letter and three-letter words.

4th–5th: 17 students – Shashikala Madam – basic learning and FAT preparation.

6th–7th: 19 students – Priyanka Madam – basic practice and FAT preparation.

Observation: Teachers are focusing on foundational learning and FAT preparation.

2.4 Thekalavatti Gollarahatti Vidya Kendra

Teacher: Yogesh Sir

Academic Activities: Basic concepts are being reinforced; students receive regular practice and FAT preparation.

2.5 Nandipura Vidya Kendra

1st–3rd: 17 students – Lavanya Madam – foundational learning.

4th–7th: 21 students – Archana Madam – Basic Mathematics and other fundamental subjects.

Observation: Special attention is given to basic Mathematics and foundational academic skills.

2.6 Eachaghatta Vidya Kendra

LKG–4th, Convent: 20 students – Vanishree Madam.

LKG–4th, Government School: 25 students – Rangamma Madam.

5th–7th: 25 students – Gauramma Madam.

Observation: The centre supports students from both Convent and Government School backgrounds.

2.7 Nagargatta Vidya Kendra

1st–4th: 25 students – Lingaraj Sir; all 25 attending regularly.

5th–7th: 18 students – Nagaraj Sir.

Observation: Basic concepts are reinforced. During the visit, students were observed making efforts to improve Kannada reading skills.

2.8 Ramenahalli Vidya Kendra

Total Student Strength: 21 **Regular Attendance:** 16 students

Academic Focus: Basic learning and FAT preparation.

2.9 Doddaghatta Vidya Kendra

Total Student Strength: 35 **Regular Attendance:** 34 students **Teacher:** Kavya Madam

Observation: The centre has a very high level of regular attendance.

2.10 Thuppadahalli Vidya Kendra

Total Student Strength: 17 **Teacher:** Thippeswamy N. R.

Observation: Students are attending regularly, with attendance varying according to the day. Regular academic activities are being conducted.

2.11 Halgappanahatti Vidya Kendra

Teacher: Lavanya Madam **Total Student Strength:** 17 **Regular Attendance:** 17 students

Observation: All enrolled students are attending regularly.

2.12 Chitrahalli Tent School

1st–3rd: 20 students – Ratnamma Madam – approximately 18 regular.

4th–8th: 18 students – Veerbhadrappa M – approximately 16–18 regular.

Observation: Additional academic support is being provided to students requiring improvement, including comparatively weaker high-school students.

2.13 Nandanahosuru Gollarahatti Vidya Kendra

Teacher: Ranganatha H. K. **Total Student Strength:** 19 **Regular Attendance:** 18

Visit Date: 19 August 2026

Observation: The centre is functioning regularly, with 18 of 19 enrolled students attending regularly.

- **Mathematics Support:** Basic Mathematics is receiving particular attention where additional support is required.
- **Kannada Learning:** Students are being encouraged to improve Kannada reading and writing skills.
- **Attendance Monitoring:** Attendance is being monitored through centre visits and teacher interaction.
- **Support for Weaker Students:** Academically weaker students are receiving additional attention and practice.
- **Teacher Engagement:** Teachers are actively conducting classes and responding to students' academic needs.

5. FOLLOW-UP PRIORITIES

- Improve regular attendance wherever required.
- Continue foundational learning for younger students.
- Strengthen Mathematics and Kannada skills.
- Continue FAT preparation for eligible students.
- Identify academically weaker students and provide additional practice.
- Conduct regular Vidya Kendra visits and monitor academic progress.
- Maintain updated student attendance and progress records.

6. CONCLUSION

Overall, the Vidya Kendras are functioning regularly, with teachers focusing on foundational education, subject-wise improvement and FAT preparation. Monthly monitoring visits have helped assess attendance, classroom activities and academic needs. Continued monitoring and teacher support will help improve learning outcomes across the Vidya Kendras.
