About Nakkhighat (Meeraghat): This area is very backward, extends from Thana Alaipuri area upto the banks of Varuna river. It falls under Malin Basti, municipal ward no 14J35/31. The population is around 5000. Out of these 60% are Muslim Ansaris (weavers), 20% Rajbhar, 10% Khatik, 10% Pasi, 3-4 houses are of Yadavs, 2 of Pathans etc. A Government primary school started in this area 3 years ago, in which 440 students are enrolled according to the registers. It has only 2 rooms and 4 teachers, which includes trainees (shiksha-mitra?). The school is near the railway line and GT road, located on the outskirts of the neighbourhood, due to which the guardians are wary of sending their children. This area, especially Meeraghat, is prone to floods. Practically all areas next to the Varuna river get flooded. The water from this years flood is yet to recede, creating a

filthy atmosphere. The children play in the filth and in the water all day. The population density is high. Due to the palms around, consumers of toddy and country liquor frequent this area. Hence the teenage girls do not go to school out of fear. All children above the age of 13-14 are uneducated. In the entire population, literacy is not more than 4-5%. Only 2-4 women are educated.

This year during the flood 'Vikan' organized relief work and distributed food grains, clothes, bedding etc. During that time, the local people requested to start an education center. Taking into consideration the needs of the area, the Meeraghat center was set up and started functioning. There are no 'madrasas' in the area.
