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SUMMARY OF THE ANNUAL REPORT 2021-2022

The financial year 2021-22 started in the middle of the second wave of Covid. Deenabandhu was in for a shock when couple of our children were tested positive for Covid-19 in the ending weeks of May. It was then that all the children and staff were also tested. Despite all the precautions we took at Deenabandhu, over 50 of our children and staff at home turned out to be positive for Corona in a span of one week. In response, we set up our own Covid care centre at our school to facilitate proper nursing of all the infected children and staff. We appointed two nurses to take care of them. District administration also came to our support and made sure a paediatrician visited this facility every day. All our children and staff recovered from the Covid-19 infection without any complications.

Once we came out of the Corona chaos, many new projects kick-started. Schools were reopened in August and then things started to move back to normal. Since the children were away for a long period of time, it had also caused serious learning gaps. We conducted baseline tests for each child in the school and noticed that the children have lost certain abilities in various concepts, especially in language and mathematics. We are conducting many activities for children in order to reduce these gaps. The children are slowly improving and they are relearning the skills that they had forgotten. We are immensely grateful to Respected Sri Dr. Krishna Chivukula Sir, Smt. Dr. Jagadamba Chivukula Madam and to the whole team of Indo-MIM. The academic year 2021-22 marked the eighth year of support from Indo-MIM to Deenabandhu Primary and High School.

Similar programs and activities were also conducted for the children in the Government Primary School, Ramasamudra, the school adopted by us. Sri Jayachandra Rao, Puttur is financially supporting our activities at this school.

On 30th August 2022, a new tinkering lab was inaugurated by Sri. K. G. Vishwanathan, the Managing Director of Bank Note Paper Mill India Pvt. Ltd. The date also happens to be the birthday of Prof. G. S. Jayadev, the Secretary of Deenabandhu Trust. The Tinkering Lab was established through CSR funds received from Bank Note Paper Mill India Pvt. Ltd.

A newly constructed Computer Lab was inaugurated on January 8th, 2022 at the Deenabandhu Primary and High School. This new hall is dedicated to the memory of Smt. Puttamma & Sri. C. R. Subbarao and was donated by their immediate family.

In February 2022, Honourable Minister of Primary and Secondary Education of Karnataka Government, Shri B. C. Nagesh inaugurated the Fun Science Gallery at Vijnana Loka. Vijnana Loka

is a Science complex situated close to our school comprising of a Science Park and a Fun Science Gallery. Children from over 50 schools visited our Vijnana Loka this year.



This year raising funds for the activities of the Teacher Resource Centre became a challenge. Many companies routed their CSR funds to Covid Crisis management and major changes to the FCRA also affected the funding agencies. But this year, government schools needed all the more support. They were reopening after almost 2 years of lockdown. It was then that we conceptualized "Project Shaale" and invited individuals to financially support a government school each. We were seeking financial support for 40 government schools. Then Mr. Karthik Gopalakrishnan and Mrs Aditi came forward to support 20 schools for a period of two years. Yoga Gives Back supported 8 schools and with the help of a few more individuals, we could support 43 schools in the first year of this project itself.

Both our scholarship programs, Chandrashekar Desaigoudar scholarship and Yoga Gives Back's Scholarship for Higher Education continues this year as well supporting and empowering more students.

Even though the beginning of the year was a bit gloomy, the year ended with many possibilities and newer hopes. We remain ever grateful to all our kind donors and our dedicated staff for making this happen.

1. DEENABANDHU CHILDREN'S HOME

1.1 Boys' Home

There are 33 boys in the Boys' home. This year Shivananda, Guruprasad, Manoj S, Thejas, Gangadhara, Ullasa completed their 10th standard public examinations. Shivananda scored 81% and he opted to study commerce in a Pre-university at Vidya Vikasa College, Chamarajanagara. Manoj S scored 80% and Guru scored 67%, both opted to study Science at Seva Bharathi PU College, Chamarajanagara. Ullasa secured 71% chose Science at Learner's PU College, Mysore. Thejas and Gangadhara joined for Arts at Vidya Vikas College at Chamarajanagara. Chandan after his graduation joined for Bachelors in Physical Education at Mysore University. Naveen is in Final year of his four-year degree course at Chamarajendra Academy of Visual Arts, Mysore.









1.2 Girls' Home

There are 33 Girls at our Girls' home. This year Sathya and Varsha completed their 10th standard examinations. Sathya scored Ist class (68%) and opted to study Arts at JSS College, Chamarajanagara. Vandana & Pooja Sharma completed their IInd PUC. Vandana Scored 48% and she is studying BCA degree course at JSS women's college, Chamarajanagara. Pooja Sharma scored 72% and she opted to study BSc (Allied Health Sciences) in Imaging Technologies at Mysore Medical College. Durga completed her BA at Maharani's college, Mysore and she got admission to study MA in Philosophy at Mysore University.





1.3 The second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic!

Despite all the precautions we took at Deenabandhu, our children and staff got infected with Covid-19 during the second wave. In response, we set up our own Covid care center at our school to facilitate proper nursing of all the infected children and staff. We appointed two nurses to take care of them. District administration also supported us and made sure a pediatrician visited this facility every day. Dr. Nagarjuna, our trustee, guided us throughout this ordeal and ensured that every infected person received timely medical interventions. Our alumni, Manoj, Vivek, Arun, Gurudutt, Sachin, Vishwa came from Mysore and managed the kitchen for over 15 days, cooking delicious and nutritious food for everyone. Our staff Vivek, Sunil, Prabhu, Puttaswamy and Prakash managed the logistics, providing medical support, working along with the medical team etc. Guided by Prof. Jayadev, we handled the situation calmly and bravely, together as one family. All our children and staff recovered from the Covid-19 infection without much complications. It was heartening for us to see our community come together, yet once again.



2. DEENABANDHU PRIMARY AND HIGH SCHOOL

We are immensely grateful to Respected Sri Dr. Krishna Chivukula Sir, Smt. Dr. Jagadamba Chivukula Madam and to the whole team of Indo-MIM for the benevolent financial support they are providing to our primary and high school. The academic year 2021-22 marked the eighth year of support from Indo-MIM to Deenabandhu Primary and High School.

The children who attend Deenabandhu School are from weak socio-economical backgrounds. Over 90% of the children are from Below Poverty Line (BPL) families and 67% of them belong to SC/ST communities. In 2021-22, 427 children were enrolled and studying in the school. The school follows activity-based and experiential teaching methodologies. The generous support from Indo-MIM has provided quality education to these children.

During the year 2021, because of the pandemic, the school reopened on August 23rd. But the online classes began in the month of June itself. Though the school was opened in August, children of lower classes started attending school little later. Overall, the school remained open for a total of 7 months this year. Most children were happy and delighted to be back in school. However, we observed certain behavioural issues in some children such as mobile phone addiction, restlessness in classrooms etc. Such children were given extra support to adjust back to school life.

Since the children were away for a long period of time, it has also caused serious learning gaps. We conducted baseline tests for each child in the school and noticed that the children have lost certain abilities in various concepts, especially in language and mathematics. Studies conducted elsewhere have also shown such learning gaps in children in those regions. We conducted many activities for children in order to reduce these gaps. The children are slowly improving and they are relearning the skills that they had forgotten.

2.2 School program and activities-2021 -2022

 On 27-06-2021, we celebrated Respected Sri. Dr. Krishna Chivukula Sir's birthday at Deenabandhu School. Our children wholeheartedly wished Sri. Dr. Krishna Chivukula Sir on his birthday. Special lunch was served for the children and staff.



• On 30-08-2021, a new Tinkering Lab was inaugurated by Sri. K. G. Vishwanathan, the Managing Director of Bank Note Paper Mill India Pvt. Ltd. The date also happens to be the birthday of Prof. G. S. Jayadev, the Secretary of Deenabandhu Trust. The Tinkering Lab was established through CSR funds received from Bank Note Paper Mill India Pvt. Ltd. The Tinkering Lab consists of electronic toolkits, robotics toolkits, computers, 3D-printers and many such accessories to teach children about STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) education. In addition, they also funded a School Bus (a 14-seater Tata Winger), laptops, computers and other materials for our Teacher Resource Center. Speaking on the occasion, Sri. K. G. Vishwanathan praised the educational environment around Deenabandhu. He and his team also visited our Science Park and Fun Science Gallery.



• On 02-10-2021, Gandhi Jayanthi was celebrated at our school. Prof. G. S. Jayadev, the Hon. Secretary of Deenabandhu Trust, Hon. Judge Sadashiva S. Sultanpuri, Principal District and Sessions Court Judge of Chamarajanagara and Mr. Sridhar, Member Secretary of District Legal Services Authority, were the chief guests. Prof. Jayadev gave the keynote address. Some students and teachers spoke about the life and work of Gandhiji and Lal Bahadur Shastri. Few stories were read from Prof. Jayadev's book – 'Ghatanegalalli Gandhiji'. Hon. Judge Sadashiva S. Sultanpuri and Mr. Sridhar spoke to create awareness about law and legal services. Gandhiji and Lal Bahadur Shastri's portraits were drawn by children and they were displayed around the hall.



• The Kannada Rajyothsava was celebrated on 01-11-2021. Several students and teachers talked about Kannada language, its evolution, Kannada poets, and the rulers of Karnataka in the past and the reasons for celebrating Kannada Rajyothsava.

The State government had organized a campaign on this day called "Kannada Geeta Gayana" where 3 famous Kannada songs – 'Barisu Kannada dimdimava', 'Jogada siri belakinalli' and 'Huttidare Kannada nadalli huttabeku' are sung at the same time in Schools/Colleges and other government institutions. Even our school students from 7th to 10th standard had participated in this campaign. Our students had rehearsed for over a week. They sung it on this day and it is uploaded on YouTube.



On 20-11-2021, Valmiki Jayanthi was celebrated at our school. Valmiki Maharshi is the author
of the famous epic Ramayana. On this day, the students and teachers gave talks about Valmiki
Maharshi's biography, his work Ramayana and the lessons that we can learn from Ramayana.



 On 22-11-2021, we celebrated Kanakadasa Jayanthi. The program began with a prayer. Many students spoke about the life and values of Kanakadasa. Our school teacher Ms. Parvathi gave a talk about the works written by Kanakadasa. The song "Kula, kula, kulavendu" was sung by Mr. Prakash, our school Headmaster.



• The Constitution Day was celebrated at our school on 26-11-2021. A week before, 9th standard students are given projects, such as making posters, presentations etc. regarding the constitution. On this day, these students give a presentation of their projects to other students in the school. The projects are on various themes such as: i) Preamble ii) Constitution structure iii) Fundamental duties and rights iv) Government structure v) Judicial system.



 On 22-12-2021, the National Mathematics Day was celebrated at our school. This day is the birth date of the famous Indian mathematician, Srinivasa Ramanujan. The program started with a prayer. A Rangoli competition was organized for 9th and 10th standard students. The students, in teams, had to draw rangoli based on mathematical concepts. The teams were named after famous mathematicians. The winning team was given a prize. All the teams had presented well and hence each one of them were given participation prizes.



A newly constructed Computer Lab was inaugurated on January 8th, 2022 at the Deenabandhu Primary and High School. This new hall is dedicated to the memory of Smt. Puttamma & Sri. C. R. Subbarao and was donated by their immediate family. Smt. Puttamma & Sri. C. R. Subbarao were originally from Chamarajanagara. Their children, grand-children and greatgrand-children now live in different parts of the country and abroad. They all have come together to donate this hall to Deenabandhu. Our heartful gratitude to the Chamarajanagara family for their generous donation.

The hall was inaugurated by Prof. G. S. Jayadeva. The event was attended by the members of the Chamarajanagara family on a Zoom call. They couldn't attend personally due to the pandemic situation. The Deenabandhu children and staff had a fruitful discussion with the family members.





• On 12-01-2022, Swamy Vivekananda Jayanthi was celebrated at our school. Many teachers and students spoke about the importance of life and values of Swami Vivekananda. Posters depicting the thoughts of Vivekananda were displayed in the School hall. The students from 5th to 10th standard read these posters and discussed about it.



• The 73rd Republic day was celebrated on 26-01-2022. The program began at 8.00 A.M and started with a prayer. Sri. Ketan Devadiga, the project coordinator of our Teacher Resource Center, did the flag hoisting. Many students and a few teachers gave talks about the importance of constitution, about our fundamental rights and duties and regarding the role of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar in framing the constitution. At the end of the program, all the students and teachers took a pledge and recited the preamble.



• On 28-02-2022, a free eye-check up camp was organized by Vivekananda Sevashrama, Mysore at Deenabandhu School. In addition to our school, 3 neighbouring government schools were also invited. Totally, 456 children were tested on that day. Among them, 11 children from Deenabandhu School were found to have eye-defects and they were provided eye-glasses free of cost. One student of Deenabandhu School from 3rd standard was recommended eye-surgery. The surgery will be done free of cost at Usha Kirana Hospital in Mysore.



• On 14-04-2022, we celebrated Dr. B.R Ambedkar Jayanthi. Children and Teachers shared stories from the life of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar. They narrated the stories from his childhood, about his education and also spoke about his responsibility in framing the Indian Constitution. Few songs and dance about Dr B.R. Ambedkar were also performed by the children and teachers.




The annual exams for 1st to 9th standard were conducted from 23-03-2022 to 30-03-2022. The results were announced for these children on 9-04-2022. For these children, the summer holidays are from 10-04-2022 to 15-05-2022. This year, 34 students from 10th standard appeared for the SSLC public examination. Among them, one student has learning disability and he was certified by the All India Institute of Speech and Hearing (AIISH, Mysore). He will be exempted from writing English and Hindi papers. Department of Education conducted the SSLC public examination from 28-03-2022 to s11-04-2022. On 19th May, 2022 the Department of Education announced the SSLC results. Among the 34 students, 6 of them have attained Distinction and 14 of them have passed with first class. The school has scored 85% result. The school quality percentage is 71.94 and thus it has scored a 'B' grade.

Many schools have reopened after the pandemic and started their syllabus-oriented school activities as usual without considering the difficulties a child may face after the long gap. However, at Deenabandhu, we have followed a child-friendly approach, trying to understand each child and designing our teaching accordingly. It is only through the generous support of Indo-MIM that we are able to create such a child-friendly, creative environment and practice experiential methodology in our school. Once again, we would like to express our sincere gratitude to Indo-MIM for its magnanimous support.







2.3.2 Socio-Economic Survey of the Deenabandhu School Children


Our school teachers conducted the socio-economic survey of all the 427 children of Deenabandhu School. Below are the graphs based on the survey.











3. GOVERNMENT SCHOOL ADOPTION PROGRAM

Deenabandhu School which is supported by Indo-MIM is becoming a popular school. Many parents mostly from economically deprived families are preferring to send their children to Deenabandhu. If we have more than 35 children in a classroom, we will not be able to cater to the learning of all the children. So, we generally restrict the strength to 35 children per class. However, we did not want to send back the children who came forward to join our school just because we cannot accommodate them in the classroom.

Hence, in 2020 we started to work very closely with a nearby government school. After talking to the teachers, headmasters and education department officers, Ramasamudra Government Primary School was chosen. It was a boys only school. After we requested the education department, they changed it to a co-education school. We appointed our own teachers there. All our school resources such as the resource centre, labs, science parks and gallery are kept open to the teachers and children of this school. The education resources created by us such as worksheets and assessment sheets were shared with the school. The idea is to provide the same learning experience enjoyed by Deenabandhu school children to the children of this school.

Once all this was set up, the children who came for admission to Deenabandhu School but could not be accommodated due to the class strength criteria, were directed to this school. Hence the strength in this school also increased.

During the corona lockdown, the children in this school regularly received the recorded online classes and the worksheets that Deenabandhu school children received.

Initially we thought of raising funds for this project through individual donors who can support a child's education here at 10,000 per child per year. However, Sri Jayachandra Roa, Puttur offered to support the whole school completely. We remain grateful to him for the support he offered us and to the children in this school.

Once the school reopened, we conducted base-line analysis of all the children to understand the gap created in Kannada literacy and basic numeracy skills since the schools were locked for over 18 to 20 months. Later many programs and activities were designed to fill in these gaps. This has been ongoing and children are slowing catching up with the age specific academics capabilities. Two of our own teachers are been appointed in this school.

As it was a boys only school before, the school did not have a separate girls' toilets. With the kind support from Sri Rajashekar Reddy, we are constructing two new toilets for both boys and girls. We are also trying to ensure that proper drinking water facilities are also are setup at this school.

4. DEENABANDHU TEACHER RESOURCE CENTER (TRC)

The Deenabandhu Teacher Resource Center (TRC), since its inception in 2005-06, has been working towards promoting experiential learning in government primary schools in the state of Karnataka. TRC is also involved in designing science learning environments. It provides consultation for the development of science galleries and science parks in various parts of Karnataka.

In 2021-22, we had established a Fun Science Gallery in a new building near our Science Park. The entire space is now named as 'Vijnana Loka'.

On 06-02-2022, the Honourable Minister of Primary and Secondary Education, Sri B. C. Nagesh inaugurated the Fun Science Gallery at Vijnana Loka. Vijnana Loka is a Science complex situated close to our school comprising of a Science Park and a Fun Science Gallery. Prof. G. S. Jayadev, Secretary of Deenabandhu Trust, Pujya Sri Swami Muktidanandaji, President of Sri Ramakrishna Ashrama, Mysore, Sri. Puttarangashetty, MLA, Chamarajanagara, Sri. Jayaram, Trustee of Deenabandhu Trust were the chief guests of the program. Officers of the Education Department, Teachers and other staff and children of Deenabandhu were also present in the program. The Education Minister praised the school and opined that, in addition to knowledge, Deenabandhu School is also inculcating social values in children. It is also providing skill-based education. He stated that the educational practice at Deenabandhu, the Science labs and the teaching methodology is exemplary and this experiential method will also be adopted by the Department of Education.







During this academic year, i.e. 2021-22, the TRC launched a new project named 'Project Shaale'. Through the core program of Project Shaale, we work intensely with 43 government higher primary schools in 4 educational blocks of Chamarajanagara district. This year, the students from Project Shaale schools also visited the 'Vijnana Loka'

Additionally, we conducted Science/Mathematics workshops for 200 teachers in the district and organized eye check camps for around 2000 students.

Project Shaale – Core Programme

Four years ago, in 2018-19, we had established 8 Learning Centers in 8 schools in 4 educational blocks of Chamarajanagara district. The Learning Center is a room filled with Teaching Learning Materials (TLMs) on Science and Mathematics. Each Learning Center is tagged with 5-6 neighbourhood schools. The Learning Center acts as a resource library as well as a platform to discuss about subject matters.

Through the core program of Project Shaale, we closely work with all the 8 Learning Centers along with the tagged schools, thus reaching a total of 43 schools. The lockdown situation caused due to the covid-19 crisis has resulted in serious learning gaps. Hence, this year, we decided to focus on fundamentals of Science and Mathematics.

The following activities were conducted for these schools:

• Teacher Training at Learning Centers: At each Learning Center, we conducted 2 meetings per month on topics related to the syllabus being taught that month. The meetings are around 2 hours long and teachers are trained to prepare TLMs that help them in teaching that particular topic. Totally 10 such meetings were conducted this year. The teachers from the Learning Center School and the tagged schools attend these meetings. The teachers appreciated the support provided through these meetings.

- **Vijnana Loka visits:** Students from the Learning Centers and tagged schools started visiting Vijnana Loka from December 20th, 2021. We had arranged two vehicles to pick up and drop the students. Around 30-35 students from each school would come around 10.00 AM in the morning. Two resource persons would take them around the park and gallery in 2 batches explaining each exhibit. Then, they would see a magic chemistry show with various colourful experiments along with the explanation behind it. After lunch, the children, in groups, would take part in a workshop where they prepare science toys.
- Anubhava: Anubhava is a monthly newsletter in Kannada consisting of articles on pedagogy, Science, mathematics and social sciences. This monthly newsletter is sent to all the 43 Project Shaale schools. The newsletters help the teachers in planning their classroom interaction. Its readers also include eminent authors, educationists, teachers and education officers.













Teacher Workshops

Every year, the TRC conducts Science/Mathematics workshops for our 'very interested' group of teachers. The workshops are conducted either at Block Resource Centers or occasionally in schools with larger rooms. This year, two such workshops were conducted. Around 180 teachers attended these workshops reaching around 11,000+ students.



Free Eye Check-up camps

In collaboration with Vivekananda Sevashrama, Bangalore, three eye check-up camps were organised in schools in Kollegala, Yelanduru and Chamarajanagara blocks. Around 1400 children from 8 government schools and 450 children from Deenabandhu School attended these camps. Among them 18 were provided specs free of cost; 4 students were recommended surgery. The surgery will also be done free of cost at Usha Kirana Hospital in Mysore with support from Vivekananda Ashrama.



5. SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

5.1. Chandrashekar Desaigoudar Foundation Scholarship

Deenabandhu has established a corpus fund for awarding scholarships to support college studies for the students coming from poor rural families. Sri Chandrashekar Desaigoudar is the sole donor of this fund. We are deeply indebted to Desaigoudar Foundation. While he was studying in Stanford University, he was in need of financial support. An anonymous person gave him money and left a note "you need not return this money to me, but help others in need when you start earning". This incident impressed the young mind of Sri Chandrashekar so much that he has devoted a significant amount of his earnings towards the cause of supporting rural poor but meritorious students. We have selected several schools from all over Karnataka State from Chamarajanagara to Bidar. Totally 1129 students are benefited by this scheme.



5.2 Scholarship for Higher Education by Yoga Gives Back:

Scholarship for higher education, a project initiated by Ms. Kayoko Mitsumatsu, Yoga Gives Back (YGB), USA, at Deenabandhu School has provided scholarship to 106 students this academic year. SHE scholarship is awarded to the children who studied at Deenabandhu School. SHE scholarship covers the student for five to seven years and provides financial assistance from INR 10,000/- up to INR 25,000/- per year per student. Scholarship amount can be used by the students towards college fee, books and other educational requirements. Very deserving students are selected for the scholarship based on their merit and economical background.

YGB also supports sponsorship of 33 children at Deenabandhu children's home through Sister-Aid project

6. OTHER ACTIVITIES:

6.1. Tree Planting and Biodiversity

Deenabandhu is closely associated with tribal peoples of BR Hills as Prof. Jayadev had worked for tribal development. Ramegowda, a tribal man from BR Hills and an expert in seed biology, raises rare and endangered saplings and provides it to Deenabandhu. These saplings are raised at the Deenabandhu nursery to a height of 2-4 ft. Deenabandhu children are also involved in maintaining, raising and taking care of the saplings. It has become an educational activity for them. This nursery of rare and endangered plant/tree/herbaceous species is located next to our Girls' home. Over the past five years, with help from Ramegowda, Deenabandhu has raised over 2,00,000 saplings of such rare species of BR Hills. These species have been planted in various project areas under the guidance of Dr. A. N. Yellappa Reddy, an eminent environmentalist. These saplings were also planted around our own school surroundings with the help of old students and teachers.

Over 15 women are employed at Nivedita Center through ThinkTac Company, Mysore.

6.3 Women's vocational training center and Children's library:

In the Civic Amenities site leased to us, we have planned construction of a Women's vocational training center and a children's library.

Chamarajanagara is a developing district and many job opportunities are opening up, especially in computer, designing, driving and other such skills. It becomes important to train our women with appropriate skills so that they can use these opportunities. Many homes in villages have alcoholic and abusive fathers and husbands. The families are completely under the care of women, either mother, wife or daughter. With financial independence, a woman will be able to take better care of her family and support the education of her children.

There are no libraries in Chamarajanagara to cater to the needs of children. Reading habits in children, and even among adults, has been declining in the past few years. Inculcating reading habits at a very young age is crucial for the overall cognitive development of the child. This library will be designed to attract young children with colourful books, colourful themes, play materials etc.

This centre will cater to both these needs.

Sri Jayachandra Rao, Puttur has offered complete financial support towards the construction of this centre.
