SUMMARY OF THE ANNUAL REPORT 2022-2023

The summer of 2022 started with a couple of interesting and fun workshops at Deenabandhu. In the first week of May, a three-day puppet workshop was organized at the children's home. The children made their own puppets and even performed small plays. At the same time, the Teacher Resource Centre conducted a telescope-making workshop. What set this workshop apart was that participating teachers actively ground and polished the telescopic mirrors.

This year, the Deenabandhu Children's home welcomed 20 new children, with 8 boys and 12 girls. We are pleased to share that many of our children are not only expressing enthusiasm for academics but also actively engaging in extracurricular pursuits such as Bharatanatyam, Music, Dance, and Sports.

The Deenabandhu School started the new academic year on May 15, 2022 with a total enrolment of 429 children. Approximately 90% of our children belong to Below Poverty Line (BPL) families and they receive quality education at a nominal cost. We extend our profound gratitude to Respected Shri. Dr. Krishna Chivukula, Smt. Dr. Jagadamba Chivukula, and the entire Indo-MIM family for their benevolent support to our school. This marks the ninth consecutive year of support from Indo-MIM, and we are truly thankful for their ongoing commitment.

Our commitment to the Government School, Ramasamudra, adopted by us three years ago, is still ongoing, with continued efforts and activities.

Project Shaale, the recent initiative started by the Teacher Resource Centre last year, continues into the current year with the gracious support of many individual donors. Various other activities such as Teacher Workshops and the Science Talent Award for high school students have been successfully conducted.

In August, persistent heavy rains led to waterlogging in the Fun Science Gallery at our Vijnana Loka, causing damage to several exhibits. As a result, the gallery is currently undergoing repairs, leading to a temporary suspension of visits this year. However, Mobile Science Lab visits have resumed and are carrying on with many of the activities conducted at Vijnana Loka.

Our scholarship initiatives, namely the Chandrashekar Desaigoudar Foundation Scholarship program and the Yoga Gives Back Scholarship for Higher Students continues to support numerous students enabling them to pursue and achieve their aspirations.

As we present you this report, we wish to express our deep gratitude to all our donors, well-wishers, and every member of the Deenabandhu family for their consistent and unwavering support.

1.1 Boys' Home

Our boys' home is currently nurturing 35 young boys. All the children are regular with their classes. Here are the details of our boys pursuing higher education:

1. Ravi Parashurama Badigere, completed his 10th standard examination scoring 53%. He has chosen to study ITI at JSS College, Mariyala.
2. Naveen stands as a testament to persistence and accomplishment, having completed a rigorous four-year degree program at Chamarajendra Academy of Visual Arts, Mysore, signifying his dedication to his artistic pursuits. He is now working for an Ad studio in Bangalore.
3. Chandan, after completing his graduation is now pursuing a Bachelor's degree in Physical Education (BPEd) at the esteemed Mysore University. His decision showcases his passion for physical education.
4. Niranjn scored of 67% in his 2nd PUC examinations with the CBSE curriculum at Navodaya Vidyalaya. After which he chose to study BCA at Vidya Vardhaka College, Mysore. It's important to note that Niranjn's educational aspirations have been further facilitated by the generosity of Sri Gundappa Gowda, President of Vidyavardhaka Sangha, who granted him a free seat for his BCA studies. Additionally, Niranjn has found a comfortable and convenient residence at Kabbali Hostel, ensuring that his academic journey is supported with stability and ease.

We also wanted to share with you the heart-warming story of Keerthan, a resilient 7-year-old from our home, underwent a heart surgery at Jayadeva Hospital in Bangalore. He was diagnosed with congenital heart ailments. The financial support necessary for this life-changing procedure was made possible through the compassionate efforts of our President and Rotarian, Dr. Nagarjun, who garnered assistance from the Rotary Clubs of Chamarajanagara and Bangalore. Today, Keerthan is recovering and developing well.

In addition to these educational achievements and inspiring journeys, it's essential to acknowledge that all the other children within the Boys' Home have thrived in terms of their health and well-being throughout the year. Their collective success and vitality reflect the positive environment and care they receive.



1. 2 Girls' Home

Our Girls' Home is currently home to 37 vibrant young girls, each displaying dedication by consistently attending their educational commitments. Furnished below are the educational journey of our girls pursuing higher education:

1. Gayathri and Jagadamba have successfully completed their 10th standard examinations this year. Gayathri scored 79% and is now pursuing commerce in 1st PUC at JSS College, Chamarajanagara. On the other hand, Jagadamba, with a second-class score of 53%, has chosen Arts at the same college.
2. Regrettably, Bhagya encountered academic challenges during her 2nd PUC exams, experiencing setbacks by failing in three subjects. It is of utmost importance that we rally around her, providing the necessary support, guidance, and resources to facilitate her growth and success in her future endeavours.
3. Durga currently is in final year of her Master of Arts in Philosophy at Mysore University, symbolizing her commitment to higher education and the pursuit of knowledge.
4. Vandanda has completed her 1st year Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) program at JSS Women's College and is now in her 2nd year of the course.

Additionally, Jagadamba faced a unique challenge when she was diagnosed with hearing impairment in both ears. Fortunately, following a thorough evaluation at the Speech and Hearing Institution in Mysore, she has been provided with a hearing aid.

In addition to these educational updates, it's worth noting that the overall health and well-being of the children at Deenabandhu Home remained quite stable throughout the year, with only minor health-related issues reported among a few children.



1.3 Extracurricular achievements of our boys and girls

The majority of our girls are actively engaged in learning Bharatanatyam under the tutelage of Vid Smt Usha Venugopal. Furthermore, four of our girls, Roopa, Vandana, Gayatri and Anusha took Junior Bharatanatyam Examinations, and it's a matter of pride that all four of them excelled with first-class results. Recognizing the musical talents of some of our children, we have also arranged for Hindustani Classical Music training by Vid. Sri Eknath. Additionally, several children are enthusiastically learning to play musical instruments such as the Harmonium, Guitar, and Mandolin, with the guidance of Sri Ajay. Notably, Ajay is also coaching our boys in football, fostering their athletic skills.

This year, our children have once again demonstrated remarkable achievements in extracurricular activities, including Music, Dance, Sports, and Debate competitions. We're delighted to announce the winners of the Deenabandhu at Zone, Taluk, and District levels for the Prathibha Karanji event in the academic year 2022-2023.

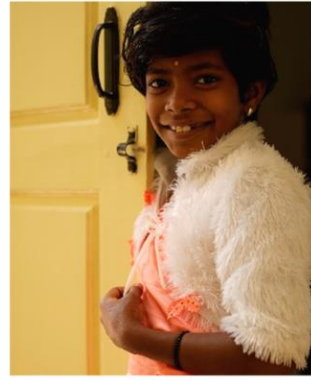

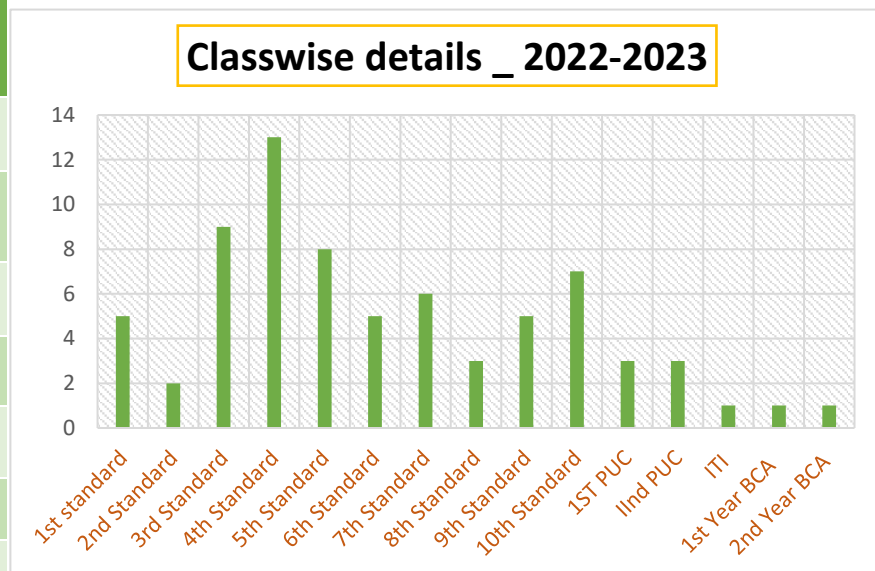

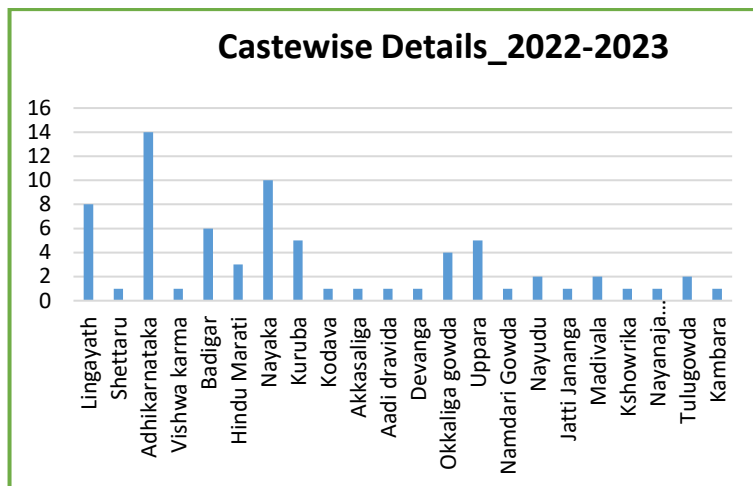

The academic year 2022-23 marked the ninth year of Indo-MIM's unwavering support for Deenabandhu Primary and High School

The students who benefit from Deenabandhu School come from disadvantaged socio-economic backgrounds, with over 90% hailing from Below Poverty Line (BPL) families, and 67% belonging to SC/ST communities. In the 2022-23 academic year, a total of 429 children were enrolled and actively engaged in their studies. The school employs innovative teaching approaches such as activity-based and experiential methods, made possible by the generous assistance from Indo-MIM, which has undeniably enriched the quality of education provided to these young learners.

Information about School Strength and Staff

2.2 School program and activities-2022 -2023

- ❖ We celebrated the world Environment day on 06/06/2022 since 05/06/2022 was a Sunday. We invited Sri. Venkatesh, a Chartered tax practitioner, to this program. He plants tree saplings as a hobby and has planted more than 10,000 trees in Chamarajanagara. Prof. G.S. Jayadev, Secretary of Deenabandhu honoured him. He planted a Fig tree sapling in our school premises. Our school 8th and 9th standard students and teachers worked on informative posters and charts. The students gave information to other class students on the importance of environment, types of pollutions, and causes of pollution and conservation of environment.



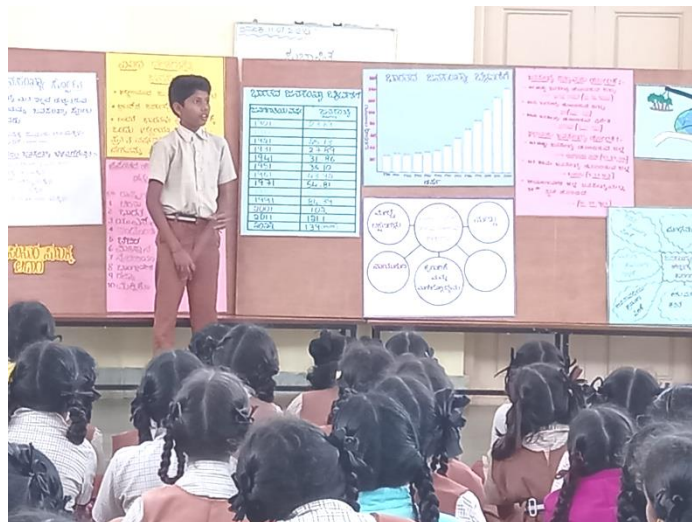
- ❖ We celebrated World Yoga Day on June 21st 2022. Early in the morning at 6 o'clock, 170 children from 6th to 10th standard students participated in this program. Our school physical education teacher Mr. Gurusiddaiah organised yoga activities for these students.



❖ The birthday of Dr. Krishna Chivukula Sir was celebrated by the school with utmost joy. After the birthday celebrations, 69 new students and 5 new teachers were welcomed to the Deenabandhu family with handmade flower bouquets. The whole program was concluded with a special lunch which was served for all the students and staff.



❖ The World Population day was celebrated at Deenabandhu School as a campaign to raise awareness about the issues of increasing global population. The 9th Standard students prepared a project and presented it. They started the project with a mime and a song. The main objective of this program was to make students understand that 'Excess of anything is bad' including population. Later sessions were dedicated to questions and discussions.



❖ We organized an exposure visit to 'Amruth Bhumi Trust' for 8th standard students. This trust is an organic agricultural center. It is run by Smt. Chukki Nanjundaswamy. She is the daughter of Prof. M.D.Nanjundaswamy. He was an eminent Indian farmer leader and an agricultural activist. The staff there gave information about natural farming, organic fertilizer-preparation, conservation of

seeds, planting of seeds and medicinal plants etc. They also served special lunch for our students and teachers.



- ❖ The Independence Day celebrations was initiated with a prayer. The whole program was organized and carried out by the children with minimum guidance from the teachers. Mr.Prakash.V (Member of municipality), Ms.Prajna N.S (Administrative and trustee of Deenabandhu), all teachers and students from 1st standard to 10th standard were present in the program. The flag was hoisted by Sri. Prakash.V. Quiz competitions were organized as part of the celebration. The prizes were distributed during this program. Both children and teachers spoke about the significance of Independence, about our freedom fighters and about their struggle. The program concluded with cultural programs performed by the children. We served special breakfast to all children and staff.



- ❖ School children gave a grand reception to the teachers on the occasion of Teachers' Day. The 10th standard children organized the whole program. They organized many cultural programs as well and gifted flowers to all their teachers. The students also organized events like musical chair and dumb-charade competitions for the teachers. Teachers enjoyed this day of celebrations.



- ❖ World Literacy Day program was organized by 8th standard children. They framed a project which focused on the importance of learning to read and write. They spoke about the problems of illiteracy and how it affects all of us as a society. Many statistics about the world's literacy - country and state wise data were also shared. Later sessions included a lot of discussion around the questions posed by the children. The program concluded with a promise by all children to help provide literacy opportunities to at least one person who is not as fortunate as them.



- ❖ Every year we celebrate Deenabandhu Science day on 30th of August on the occasion of Prof.. G.S. Jayadev's birthday. However, this year, it rained heavily on that day and holidays were announced for all the schools in the district. Hence, we conducted this program on 09/09/2022. Sri.Dr.Nagarjuna (President of Deenabandhu), Prof.D.R.Baluragi (Retired Physics Professor) and Prof.G.S.Jayadeva (Founder of Deenabandhu) graced the occasion as guests. The program was inaugurated by Sri. Prof. D.R.Baluragi with the 'Rail Wheels Model'. Prof. G.S. Jayadeva also addressed the gathering. He expressed his gratitude to Respected Sri Dr. Krishna Chivukula and INDO-MIM for enabling us to reach out to the community.

Over 1000 children and teachers from 25 schools attended this event. Deenabandhu school children, from 4th to 10th standard, had prepared and explained over 100 Science experiments to all the visitors. This year we also invited students from the nearby Government higher primary school, Ramasamudra and gave them an opportunity to explain various mathematics models. The students were happy to be a part of this event and explained the models well. Deenabandhu provides educational support to this school and works closely with them. Lunch was served to all the children/visitors from remote schools.



- ❖ On 07-09-2022, the cluster level Prathibha Karanji (talent show competitions) was conducted by the Department of Education. Our school children participated in the various competitions like folk dance, drawing, poem recitation, pick and speak, rangoli etc. Many students won prizes and got selected to the taluk level Prathibha Karanji programs. Winning students of quiz, rangoli, drawing and bharathnatya competitions participated in the taluk level program.



- ❖ Department of Education, Chamarajanagara had organized inter-school sports competitions for school children. Deenabandhu primary and high school boys and girls participated in the Kabaddi competition at Hobli level to win the first place at the taluk level. After winning the taluk level the boys Kabaddi team represented the school at the district level. Children also participated in Relay, Shot-put and other running competitions and won several prizes. Sagar and Madhusudhan of 7th standard won the 1st place in 600 meter and the 400 meter running race at the taluk level and were

selected to the district level competition. Sagar of 7th standard won the first place in district level at 600 meter race. Hence he also represented the school at the state level.



- ❖ We celebrated Gandhi Jayanthi on 2nd October 2022. All the children from 1st standard to 10th standard joined the celebrations. Many stories from the life of Gandhiji was shared. The stories from his childhood brought smile on the faces of these young children. Discussion continued about the values Gandhiji upheld, about his social concerns and about his fight for freedom. Teachers narrated the various stories of Gandhiji's life from the book 'Gatanegalalli Gandhiji' authored by Prof. Jayadev. A special breakfast was served to all the children and staff.



- ❖ We celebrated Kannada Rajyothsava program on 1st November 2022. Special breakfast was served to all the children and the staff. District level program was organized by the Zilla Panchayat of Chamarajanagara. All the children from 4th standard to 10th standard, totally around 250 children, performed a wonderful dance in the program which was organized in the open stadium at SP office. Sri.V.Somanna, District in-charge Minister, Sri. C. Puttarangashetty, MLA awarded a memento to the school. Mr. Manjunath, DYPC, Department of Education exclusively appreciated the performance of Deenabandhu children.



- ❖ On November 11th Kanakadasa Jayanthi was celebrated in Deenabandhu school premises. The program began with a prayer by the children. Students and teachers spoke about Kanakadasa's books like Haribakthasara, Nalacharithhe, Ramadhanya Charithe. After the speech some students sung poems of 'Kanakadasa'.



- ❖ On 14th November 2022 we celebrated Children's day. Teachers planned a series of special events for all the children. The competitions were structured differently for different age groups. Games like ball in the bucket, Lemon on the spoon, catch the snack, Musical chair, Coin in the glass and cricket were part of the program. Special meals was served for all the students and the staff. The special lunch was arranged by our honorary mathematics voluntary teacher Sri. Venugopal Sir.



- ❖ We organized an exposure visit to Punarchith for 9th standard students. Punarchith is a non-government organization started by Dr.A.R.Vasavi (Trustee of Deenabandhu). It is based in Nagavalli village around 15 km from Deenabandhu. The group has conducted several workshops for rural youth in the area. Punarchith members engage in academic, out-reach and advocacy activities related to education, agriculture, rural well-being, social trends and democracy. Our students visited Angarike Maala, which was a barren land before but converted to fertile land by Punarchith. The Punarchith team explained about the various soil types and the importance of preserving nutrition in the soil. They also distributed snacks for our students and teachers. The visit was very informative for both our students and teachers.



- ❖ On 26th November 2022 the Constitution day was celebrated. This was assigned to 7th Standard students as a project. The students presented their understanding about 'Indian Constitution'. They displayed colourful charts, posters and explained very well. The project included information about Preamble, Features of Constitution, Fundamental Rights, Fundamental duties and Citizenship etc. Children from 4th standard to 9th standard along with all the teachers were present in the program.



- ❖ We celebrated the 24th school day programme on 23rd December 2022. Sri. Dr. R. S. Nagarjun, President of Deenabandhu Trust, Sri. Prof. G.S.Jayadeva, Secretary of Deenabandhu Trust, Sri.Dr.H.N.Muralidhara, Retired Professor of Kannada, Bangalore, Sri. Chananjaiah, Head of Ramasamudra Village and Sri.Venugopal, Volunteer Mathematics teacher were guests for our program. The function was inaugurated by Sri.Dr.H.N.Muralidhara along with all the guests. Dr.H.N.Muralidhara, in his inauguration speech, said that ‘Deenabandhu School is like a home for children, hence they are learning social values in the school. A special learning atmosphere has been created in the school’. Prof.G.S.Jayadeva mentioned that ‘Our school is for financially backward children. Although we do not receive any grant from the government, we are giving all good facilities to the children. This is possible due to support from Indo-MIM’. The theme of “Poets’ Poetries” was chosen for the school day program. All children from L.K.G. to 10th standard performed well in the cultural programs on the stage.



- ❖ We organized a one-day educational tour for 10th standard students and teachers on 30th of December 2022. We visited Chamundi hill, Dariya Daulat, Ranganathittu bird sanctuary, Nimishamba temple, Somanathapura and Talakadu. Students enjoyed the day. Special lunch and snacks were organized for students and staff.



- ❖ Savithri Bai Phule Jayanthi was organized on 3rd January. Assistant Teacher Smt. Savitha talked about Savithri Bai Phule. Stories about how Smt. Savithri became British India's first lady teacher, stories of her compassion, of her braveness, of her commitment to give education to girls and socially oppressed classes were also shared.



- ❖ On January 12th 2023 we celebrated the 160th Jayanthi of Swami Vivekananda. Teachers and Students shared inspiring incidences from the life of Swami Vivekananda. Essay and painting competitions were held for our school children. 40 paintings portraying the biographical messages of Swami Vivekananda were presented at school prayer hall.



The 73rd Republic day was celebrated on 26th January 2023. Sri.Dr.R.S. Nagarjun,President of Deenabandhu, Prof.G.S.Jayadeva, Founder of Deenabandhu, Sri.Ketan Devadiga, Coordinator of Deenabandhu Teacher Resource Center, teachers and all students from 1st standard to 10th standard were present in the program. The National Flag was hoisted by Sri. Dr.R.S.Nagarjuna. the teachers and students gave interesting talks about the importance of ‘Republic day’. The speech included information about Preamble, Features of Constitution, Fundamental Rights, Fundamental duties and Citizenship. Stories about Gandhiji and Dr.B.R.Ambedkar were also shared. Cultural programs were performed by children. Special breakfast was served to all children and staff.



- ❖ A social science project was presented by 7th standard students on 10th February 2023. A presentation by children was held on the topic “THE GREAT DISCOVERIES” related to Geography lesson for 7th standard children. Children discussed about Bartolomeu Dias, Amerigo Vespucci, Columbus, Vasco-Da-Gama, Ferdinand Magellan and James Cook and their adventurous stories. They also prepared maps tracking the routes followed by these explorers. Finally many questions were put by the 5th,6th, 8th and 9th students to the 7th standard team. The 7th standard children and teachers answered.



- ❖ We celebrated National Science Day on 28th of February 2023. We invited Ms. Deepa, Scientist in agriculture center of Haradanahalli, for this program. National science day is celebrated in India of February 28 each year to mark the discovery of the Raman Effect by Indian physicist

Sir.C.V.Raman on 28th February 1928. We organized science activities for children. Our school's 6th standard students presented a project on 'Millets'. They displayed colourful charts, posters and explained very well. The project included information about nine types of millets such as Pearl millet, Finger millet, Proso millet, Foxtail millet, Barnyard millet, Little millet and Kodo millet. After the students' presentation Ms. Deepa, scientist very appreciated students and she gave information about millets. After lunch, our Teacher Recourse Center's team and teachers planned science activities for the children. Many science toys and experiments were prepared by our children. Students from 4th standard to 9th standard children participated in these activities.



❖ The Indian Red Cross Society organized World Women's day program at our school on 8th March 2023. Sri.D.S.Ramesh, District Commissioner of Chamaraianagara, Respected. Smt. Nisharani, Additional Judge, Prof.G.S.Jayadev, Founder of Deenabandhu, Dr. G.M.Sanjeev, Director of medical science organization, Dr. Krishnaprasad, District surgeon, Dr.Mahesh, secretary of Red Cross society, Dr.Vishweshwaraiah, District health officer, Dr.Renukadevi and Sri.K.V.Rajanna, Margadarshi organization were guests in the program. Guests spoke about women's rights, freedom, respect and equality. Our school 9th standard student Vasudha gave a speech about Smt. Clara Zetkin. Clara Zetkin was a German Marxist theorist, communist activist and advocate for women's rights. Sri.D.S.Ramesh, District Commissioner distributed 100 hygiene kits for our school from 7th to 10th standard to all girls and all women staff of Deenabandhu. The same day Youth Empowerment and Department of Sports organized cricket matches for below 19 year girls. 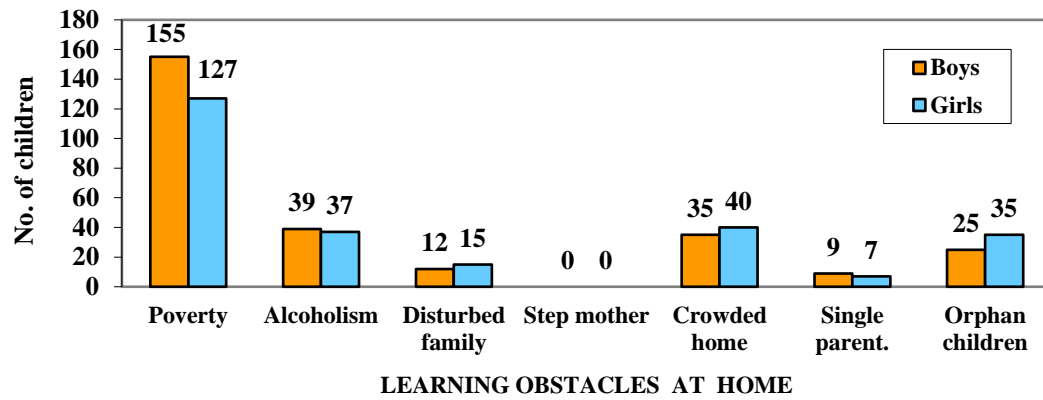
2.3.2 Socio-Economic Survey of the Deenabandhu School Children: 2022-2023

3. GOVERNMENT SCHOOL ADOPTION PROGRAM

Deenabandhu School, backed by Indo-MIM, has gained popularity, with parents, particularly from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, increasingly choosing to enrol their children in our institution. To ensure effective learning for all students, we maintain a class size limit of 35 children per classroom. However, we were determined not to turn away eager students due to classroom constraints.

Therefore, in 2020, we initiated a close collaboration with a nearby government school. Following discussions with teachers, headmasters, and education department officials, we selected Ramasamudra Government Primary School, which had previously been an all-boys institution. Upon our request, the education department transformed it into a co-education school, where we appointed our own dedicated teachers. We extended access to our school's resources, including the resource center, labs, science parks, and gallery, to benefit the students and educators of this school. Additionally, educational materials developed by us, such as worksheets and assessment sheets, were shared with this school to ensure that the students there receive a learning experience similar to that enjoyed by Deenabandhu students.

With this arrangement in place, children who sought admission to Deenabandhu School but could not be accommodated due to class size limitations were redirected to the collaborating school. Consequently, the student population at this school increased.

We also assigned two of our teachers to work at this school, ensuring that all the educational programs and initiatives implemented at our school were seamlessly integrated into this educational setting. We placed a particular emphasis on developing fundamental literacy and numeracy skills among these students.

We are immensely grateful to Sri Jayachandra Roa from Puttur for his generous support, which benefits the entire school community. In the past, as the school was exclusively for boys, it lacked separate restroom facilities for girls. With the kind assistance of Sri Rajashekar Reddy, we are currently constructing two new sets of toilets, one for boys and one for girls, to meet the basic hygiene needs of all students. Furthermore, we have taken steps to ensure that adequate drinking water facilities are available at this school.

4. DEENABANDHU TEACHER RESOURCE CENTER (TRC)

The Deenabandhu Teacher Resource Center (TRC), since its inception in 2005-06, has been working towards promoting experiential learning in government primary schools in the state of Karnataka.

Last year, the TRC had launched a new project named 'Project Shaale'. Through Project Shaale, we work intensely with 43 government higher primary schools in 4 educational blocks of Chamarajanagara district. This project was continued this year with support from many generous individual donors.

Additionally, many programmes and activities which were stopped due to the Covid-19 pandemic were continued from this academic year.

Project Shaale

In 2018-19, we had established 8 Learning Centers in 8 schools in 4 educational blocks of Chamarajanagara district. Each Learning Center is tagged with 5-6 neighbourhood schools. Through Project Shaale, we closely work with all the 8 Learning Centers along with the tagged schools, thus reaching a total of 43 schools. The table shows the list of 43 schools along with their Learning Centers.

The following activities were conducted for these schools:

- **Teacher Training at Learning Centers:** At each Learning Center, we conducted interaction meetings with teachers on topics related to Science/Mathematics curriculum. The meetings are around 2 hours long and teachers are trained to prepare TLMs which they can use in the classroom. The raw materials required to make the TLMs are also provided to the teachers. The teachers mention that these sessions have helped them to make their classes more interesting.
- **Vijnana Loka and Mobile Science Lab:** Vijnana Loka, located near the Deenabandhu School, consists of a Science park and a Fun Science Galley where children learn through experience and fun. In the first few weeks of the year, we organized Vijnana Loka visits for students of the Project Shaale schools. However, since the Science gallery at Vijnana Loka was water-logged due to heavy rains, these visits were stopped. Instead, we started the Mobile Science Lab visits to these schools.
- **Anubhava:** Anubhava is a monthly newsletter in Kannada consisting of articles on pedagogy, science, mathematics and social sciences. This monthly newsletter is sent to all

the 43 Project Shaale schools. The newsletters help the teachers in planning their classroom interaction.

- **National Science Day:** This special day is celebrated in most schools on the occasion of discovery of Raman Effect by the Indian Scientist Sir. C. V. Raman. The TRC extended its support to schools by providing raw materials and training a few children in conducting experiments and making science toys during the event.

Fun Science Gallery

Chamarajanagara district received unprecedented heavy rains this year due to which the Fun Science gallery at Vijnana Loka was water-logged. Many exhibits were damaged, and the electricity to the building was disconnected due to safety concerns. Hence, the school visits to the Vijnana Loka were stopped. It is planned to shift the exhibits from the ground floor to the top floor. The ground floor will be used as workshop space.

Mobile Science Lab visits

The Mobile Science Lab, launched in 2018-19, is a bus full of experiments which visits schools and engages children in various activities. This project was temporarily suspended due to the pandemic. The Mobile Science Lab visits resumed in early December this year and has visited 31 schools, including several Project Shaale schools.

During the visit, the resource person begins by demonstrating several experiments, mostly related to the science curriculum found in the children's textbooks. Following that, an engaging and colourful chemistry demonstration is presented. In the afternoon session, a workshop is conducted where the children make simple Science toys.

Mobile Science Lab visits

Every year, the TRC conducts Science/Mathematics workshops for our 'very interested' group of teachers. This group consists of approximately 200 teachers who are enthusiastic about teaching Science/Mathematics using activity-based methodologies. The workshops are conducted either at Block Resource Centers (BRCs) or occasionally in schools with large rooms. This year, one such workshop was conducted in the month of February at each of the 4 BRCs (Chamarajanagara, Yelanduru, Kollegala, Gundlupete).

Chan-Desaigoudar Science Talent Award

To promote an attitude of research and innovation in Science, the Chan Desaigoudar Foundation in collaboration with Deenabandhu Trust, started the Science Talent Award Programme in 2017-18. This science project competition is organised for rural Government high schools in Chamarajanagara region and an amount of Rs. 1,50,000 is earmarked for this programme each year. The first prize is Rs. 55,000 and the second prize is Rs. 25,000. The competition was organised this year after a break of 2 years due to the pandemic.

We received 40 project proposals this year of which 15 were shortlisted for the exhibition. The exhibition was held on January 25th and the 15 shortlisted schools presented their projects. The projects were evaluated by 4 judges based on certain criteria. Government Morarji Desai Residential School, R S Doddi won the first prize for their project titled “Life cycle of a butterfly” and Government Adarsha Vidyalaya High School, Mudigundam won the second prize for their project “Light Fidelity (Li-Fi)”. The award ceremony was held on February 25th.

Free Eye Check-up camps

In collaboration with Vivekananda Sevashrama, Bangalore, free eye check-up camps were organised in 32 schools in the district. Around 5500 children from these schools attended these camps. Among them 76 were provided spectacles free of cost; 5 students were recommended surgery. The surgery is also offered to be done free of cost at Usha Kirana Hospital in Mysore with support from Vivekananda Ashrama.

Telescope-Making and other Workshops

A telescope making workshop was organised during the first week of May, 2022 for ten government school science teachers as well as Deenabandhu School and TRC staff. Dr. Shashishekar Shivaswamy (former Head of Flight Physics, Airbus) was the facilitator for the workshop. This workshop was funded by a generous donation from Dr. Marc Fischer (Senior VP of Engineering, Airbus).

The participants themselves ground and polished the primary mirrors of the telescopes. Deenabandhu teachers and staff fine-tuned the mirrors, fabricated the mounts and assembled the telescopes. A telescope with such specification comes to around INR 30,000 in the market.

In the workshop, the cost of each telescope came to just INR 10,000. Totally 12 such telescopes were made during the workshop.

The telescope distribution programme was held on July 12th. Sri V. Somanna (State Minister of Housing & the District in-charge minister) distributed the telescopes to the teachers. Ms. Charulatha Somal, the District Commissioner and Smt. K. M. Gayaththi, the CEO were also present during the event.

In the second week of March, 2023, Dr. Shashishekar Shivaswamy conducted another workshop for TRC staff on making low-cost microscopes. The microscope was made using lens from a simple laser light toy and the cost for the entire microscope came to just Rs. 300. He also discussed a design for setting up a radio telescope in our campus and also gave us some ideas on designing citizen science projects involving government schools.

Stone Engravings

Stones engravings with depictions of local history and culture, such as information on notable figures like Muppina Shadakshari, Manteswamy, Sanchi Honnamma, etc., are being crafted on stone with support from Mr. Giri, Director of Biligiri Granites. We intend to install these engravings at sites of historical importance. So far, three of them have been sent for installation. One of them is already installed at Yaragamballi with support from Sri. Duggahatti Veerabhadrapappa and two have been sent to the University campus at Bedarapura for installation.

5. SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

5.1. Chandrashekar Desai goudar Foundation Scholarship

Deenabandhu has established a dedicated corpus fund to provide scholarships that assist students from underprivileged rural backgrounds in pursuing their college education. Notably, Sri Chandrashekar Desai goudar stands as the sole benefactor of this fund. Our heartfelt gratitude extends to the Desai goudar Foundation for their invaluable support.

Sri Chandrashekar Desai goudar's motivation to establish this fund is deeply rooted in his own life experiences. During his time at Stanford University, he found himself in a situation where he required financial assistance. An act of anonymous generosity left a lasting impression on him – a benefactor provided him with money and a simple note that read, "You need not return this money to me, but help others in need when you start earning." This powerful moment left an indelible mark on the young Chandrashekar, inspiring him to dedicate a significant portion of his earnings to the noble cause of supporting deserving students from rural backgrounds who lack financial means.

Deenabandhu's scholarship program, made possible by the Desai goudar Foundation, extends its reach to various schools across Karnataka, spanning from Chamarajanagara to Bidar. As a result, a total of 1205 students have been able to benefit from this heartfelt initiative, allowing them to pursue their dreams of higher education.

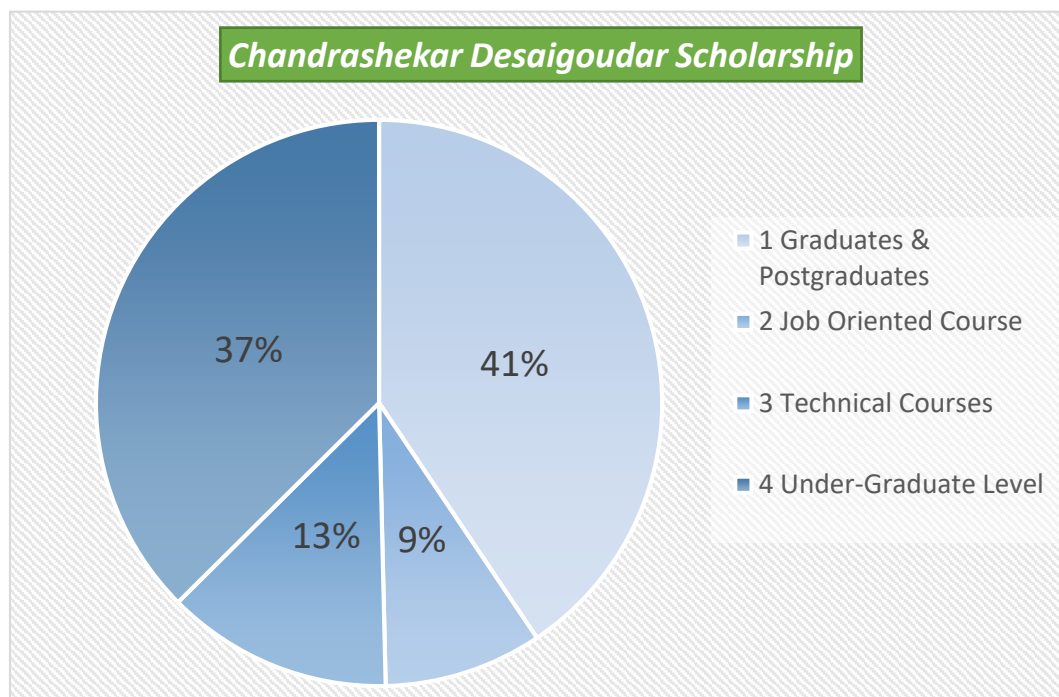

5.2 Scholarship for Higher Education by Yoga Gives Back:

The "Scholarship for Higher Education" program, which was spearheaded by Ms. Kayoko Mitsumatsu of Yoga Gives Back (YGB) in the United States, has extended its support to 106 students during this academic year at Deenabandhu School. This initiative, known as the SHE scholarship, is exclusively available to students who studied at Deenabandhu School.

The SHE scholarship provides valuable financial assistance for a duration of five to seven years, offering support ranging from INR 10,000 to INR 25,000 per student annually. This financial aid can be utilized by the students to cover expenses such as college fees, educational materials, and books. The selection process for this scholarship is meticulous, focusing on deserving students who demonstrate both merit and a need for financial support, ensuring that opportunities for higher education are extended to those who truly deserve it.

6. OTHER ACTIVITIES:

6.1. Tree Planting and Biodiversity

Deenabandhu maintains a close connection with the tribal communities of BR Hills, owing to the dedicated efforts of Prof. Jayadev in the field of tribal development. Notably, Ramegowda, a tribal individual hailing from BR Hills and possessing expertise in seed germination, plays a significant role in this association. Ramegowda specializes in cultivating rare and endangered saplings, which he then supplies to Deenabandhu. These saplings are nurtured at the Deenabandhu nursery, where they grow to heights of 2-4 feet. Engaging the Deenabandhu children in the process of nurturing and maintaining these saplings has evolved into an educational activity that enriches their understanding of environmental conservation.

The nursery, dedicated to rare and endangered plant, tree, and herbaceous species, is situated adjacent to our Girls' home. Over the course of the last five years, in collaboration with Ramegowda, Deenabandhu has successfully raised more than 200,000 saplings of these exceptional BR Hills species. Under the expert guidance of Dr. A. N. Yellappa Reddy, a distinguished environmentalist, these saplings have been thoughtfully planted in various project areas. Additionally, they have been used to enhance the surroundings of our own school, a collective effort involving alumni and teachers.

Our commitment to biodiversity education extends to government schools in Chamarajanagara through our TRC (Teacher Resource Center). This initiative encompasses the distribution of saplings and aims to educate children about the importance of preserving biodiversity. We are fortunate to have the financial support of Dr. Ventakesh Krishnamurthy in carrying out this valuable project.

6. 2 Nivedita Training Center:

6.3 Women's vocational training center and Children's library:

In the Civic Amenities site entrusted to us, we have a comprehensive plan for the establishment of two vital facilities: a Women's Vocational Training Center and a Children's Library.

Chamarajanagara, as a growing district, is witnessing the emergence of numerous employment opportunities, particularly in fields such as computing, designing, driving, and various other skill-based professions. It becomes imperative to equip our women with the relevant skills to enable them to seize these opportunities. Many households in the surrounding villages are confronted with the challenges of alcoholic and abusive fathers and husbands. In these circumstances, women, whether as mothers, wives, or daughters, bear the responsibility of their families. By attaining financial independence through vocational training, women can not only enhance their family's well-being but also provide essential support for their children's education.

Chamarajanagara currently lacks libraries catering to the needs of children. Reading habits have been on the decline among both children and adults in recent years. Cultivating a love for reading from a young age is crucial for a child's cognitive development. Our library is meticulously designed to captivate young readers with colourful books, engaging themes, and playful materials, creating a conducive environment for learning and exploration.

This center serves as a vital resource to address both these pressing needs. Notably, Sri Jayachandra Rao from Puttur has generously offered full financial support for the construction of this center.
