## REWARD Trust site visit report - Asha Boston Chapter

On 10 March 2023, I, my mother, and brother attended the SMART (Self Motivation Assessment by Reward Test) prize distribution event organized by REWARD (Rural Education, Welfare and Resource Development Trust). We attended the event in 3 schools run by the Tamilnadu government near Mahabalipuram - Adi Dravida Welfare Higher Secondary School in Nerumbur, Government High School in Sooradimangalan, and Government Middle School (primary), Vittalapuram.

The prizes which included a certificate and a cash amount were distributed in these schools for the SMART test that was conducted in 2019. SMART tests were started in 2011 for classes 6 to 9 in the schools where REWARD teachers work. It is an aptitude test conducted in English comprising questions from 5 subjects (English, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, and Biology). SMART questions (image of the latest question paper below) emphasize the practical application of knowledge and encourage the students to think instead of writing down the memorized answers. The questions were quite challenging and were in the format of a university entrance test. It is a great effort by the REWARD trust to motivate these students and equip them to compete with other students. Prepping the students with these tests early in their secondary schooling will give them a competitive edge later on in their careers.

In the test that was conducted in 2019, there was active participation by students and quite a few students won cash prizes (image below). The event started with a speech from the school headmaster, and REWARD members, a yoga session, followed by the prize distribution. The students enjoyed the yoga session and actively took part in the interactions with the REWARD members. I took part in the distribution and handed over the prizes to a few students. Also, my brother and I were given the opportunity to speak a few words to encourage the students. The students were particularly interested in listening to my brother who is a Lieutenant in the Indian army. His speeches had a profound impact on them, and a few inspired students met with him after the event to ask him more about the selection process.





We also had the opportunity to interact with Dr. Kalavathi, President of REWARD, Smt. Anathi Baskaran, Treasurer of REWARD, the school headmasters, teachers, and the students. Dr. Kalavathi explained to us the efforts by REWARD to conduct monthly training sessions for the teachers. Teachers are regularly monitored and are awarded performance-based incentives. She also explained the process of selecting teachers, sending them to the schools based on its requirement, the expansion of REWARD over the years, and how Asha has supported them throughout the years. We also met an inspirational person, Mr. Durairaj, a student with a similar background as the school students, raised by Dr. Sridhar and Dr. Kalavathi who has worked hard and is now working at the IGCAR, Kalpakkam. He was the perfect example to the students, and his words also motivated the students.

Clearly, the school headmasters highly valued REWARD members and teachers and depended on them to function effectively. In fact, we witnessed the headmaster of Government Middle School in Vittalapuram explaining the shortage of teachers and requesting Dr. Kalavathi for a REWARD teacher as soon as possible. To meet the increasing demand for REWARD teachers and support the trust's rapid expansion, Dr. Kalavathi requested an increase in funding from Asha.




Figure 1: SMART question paper




Figure 2: Prize winners
