Proposed Project Period:

The project is for the duration of COVID-19 pandemic and may need support till complete eradication of the disease from India.

Objective of the Project:

1. To provide protective and treatable medical equipment to the hospitals in Jammu & Kashmir specially treating the COVID-19 affected patients,
2. To spread the messages of Government amongst the people of J&K regarding precautions and treatment of COVID-19,
3. To ensure physical and psychological health of the public of the state,
4. **To prevent the spread of COVID-19**

Direct Beneficiaries:

Treatment of as many as patients affected by COVID-19 and Making the maximum population staying in remote areas of the state aware about the precautions against COVID-19.

- Patients who are suffering from COVID-19
- People who are healthy and not suffering from COVID-19

Indirect Beneficiaries:

- Medical and paramedical staff of hospitals treating COVID-19 patients,
- The state Health Department,
- The general public of the state from remote areas,
- To continue building healthy relations with the common people of the state through this project.

General Presentation and Analysis of the Problem :-

COVID-19 has been playing havoc all over the world and our nation also has been affected by the deadly disease. Our Honourable Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has rightly announced total lockdown in the country to contain and stop the effect of this virus. However due to ignorance and foolhardiness of some individuals there are signs of spreading of the disease. Our Medical and paramedical staff members are working day and night to detect and treat patients of the ailment.

Coming to the state of Jammu and Kashmir, where **Borderless World Foundation has been working for the welfare of the people since more than 20 years.** Statistics shows that there are average **2 ventilators available per about 3000000 population in the state.** This situation may have disastrous consequences in the event of fast spreading of the pandemic in the state. **Protective medical supplies like N95 surgical masks, PPE, syringe pumps etc are severely short of supply due to the diversion to other countries and other reasons.**

Through our services and programs Borderless World Foundation's goal has providing healthcare and awareness to develop and thrive the people of J&K state to give a sense of integration and belongingness to our great nation. It is pertinent to mention that Various organisations in the state are aware of selfless and people-oriented work of Borderless World Foundation in the state of J&K and have appealed to us for help and support in these crucial circumstances. In this regard we have received requests for providing emergency medical apparatus and allied material supplies from the Directorate of Health Services, Kashmir.

The details of emergency medical equipment and material required are placed in preceding paragraphs.

Large number of people of the state live in the far-flung hilly areas where the medical facilities are inadequate. Also, the **general population has been ignorant of the consequences and precautions to be taken to prevent influx of the present pandemic. In this regard the BWF thought to educate and convenience the common people to correct information by means of announcements in local language with help of public address systems mounted on vehicles and distribution of information leaflets.** This would remove doubts in the minds of the people and give them a sense of safety. In view of the above Borderless world Foundation is earnestly seeking donors to come forward with their valuable support and hold our hands to help the people of the state to comprehend and stop this pandemic.



3. The counseling by the NGOs should be done through social media or public address system without assembling of crowds and in any case the messages have to be individual having community effect.
4. The NGO volunteers have to strictly abide by the social distancing norm and also have to follow the personal protection gear code i.e Body cover, Mask, Head Cap, Gloves. There shall be no physical contact what so ever while working in the field.
