1. Name of Project:

A Project Proposal on Enhancing Employability through Vocational and Skill Development Training among Women, Adolescent Girls, and Youth members in Coastal Villages of Vagra block of Bharuch district.

2. Background of the Project Area:

Vagra is one of the blocks of Bharuch district. The Families are mainly depending on farming and daily wages labor work. Literacy rate is poor and it is difficult for them to do any skill work as they are not trained for such work in the area. The cluster of villages are very interior that they are unable to reach even to a nearby market or any institute to develop skills. The families are mostly falls under BPL families. Girls are mostly dropped out after 8th standard. They are not encouraged by family to move further with their studies. Government has not turned its eye for the development of people of these villages. They have to travel a long distance to learn computer coaching, tailoring & beautician classes.

3. Project Period: 1st April 2019 To 31st March 2020.

4. Burning Problems of the Project Site:

1. Average Learning Achievement of the students is not satisfied.
2. Students are ignorant of computer education.
3. Teachers & students are poor in information & technology.
4. Dropped out girls are not allowed by family to learn any vocational course as in tailoring or beautician course.
5. Women and adolescent girls are working as a daily labour in nearby industries and salt pane area.

5. Goal of the project:

‘To enhancing the employability of 200 Nos disadvantaged and poor women, adolescent girls and youth vocational and skill trainings in remote coastal villages of Vagra block of Bharuch district.’

6. Objectives of the Project Propose:

1. To give driver training to the rural youth who dropped out from school for employment opportunity.
2. Provide handy craft, sewing and beautician course to Women, Adolescent Girls & drop out girls.

7. Target Beneficiaries:

The number of direct beneficiaries of this project would be 200 members from coastal villages of Vagra block of Bharuch District. The annual number of indirect beneficiaries would be 200 families. Along with more than 70% jobs to be created through this trained beneficiaries. The beneficiaries belong to below poverty level family, Schedule Caste (SC) and Other Backward Castes in the target villages.

8. Expected outcomes of the Project:

- ✓ 15 No’s community need assessment will done on skill development and vocational trades.
- ✓ 200 No’s women, adolescent girls and youth will be trained on driver training, sewing and embroidery and beauty parlor and at least 70% of the trained youth will be engage in employment / self -employment for income generating

9. Procedure of conduction of the Training courses:

Especially, rural youth, adolescent girls and students will learn the driver training. Local Village Development Committee will support and coordinate the training center. One Local person of the project will be appointed in the Club. The Local person will take care of the center will assist for running the project.

Sewing & embroidery classes and beautician classes will be initiating in our project villages. We have a development activist in the project villages where we could get the potential beneficiaries for the vocational training. Monitoring of the vocational training will also be taken care of by our development activist as well GVT staff on personal basis.

Asha Volunteer Visit Report Feedback on Vocational Training

The Vagra vocational training center has 5 sewing machines and about 15-20 girls per batch. The classes are 2 hrs long and they go on for 2 months. The training center gives primary training compared to 9 months full course but it is enough for the girls to serve the local market. The girls can learn more lately by themselves if they need to. The girls



we saw were from villages' 5-10 kms from the center. They travel using govt. bus for which they have been given subsidized monthly pass by GVT. Most girls present then were 10th and 12th pass or fail students. Some girls were keen on learning beyond 2 months and many were hopeful in getting to earn or at least save money through the training.

We visit 2 girls in Vagra who had received sewing training last year. Taruna is a married woman whose husband is an industry daily wager. She manages to stitch a blouse per day, making around ₹150. This helps her meet all the household and personal expenses. Earlier, the family was barely making the ends meet through only the husband's salary. Taruna was very happy to have been through the training as now she can contribute to family income instead of just sitting and worrying. She gets most of her orders from the neighboring houses.

Raj Mousina Salim, also from Vagra, was from a relatively well to do family. She too went through the sewing classes last year and now she tries new things by herself and teaches other girls around her including her 4 siblings. Trupti went through the beautician training last year and is now doing her business not far from the training center itself. She makes about ₹20,000 per month on an average. The marriage seasons are most profitable. Preparing a bride gets her about ₹7,000 to ₹10,000. She just gave 12th board exam and is waiting for the results. Mr. Ramesh encouraged her to pursue college studies and approach GVT in case she needs financial assistance in doing so.
