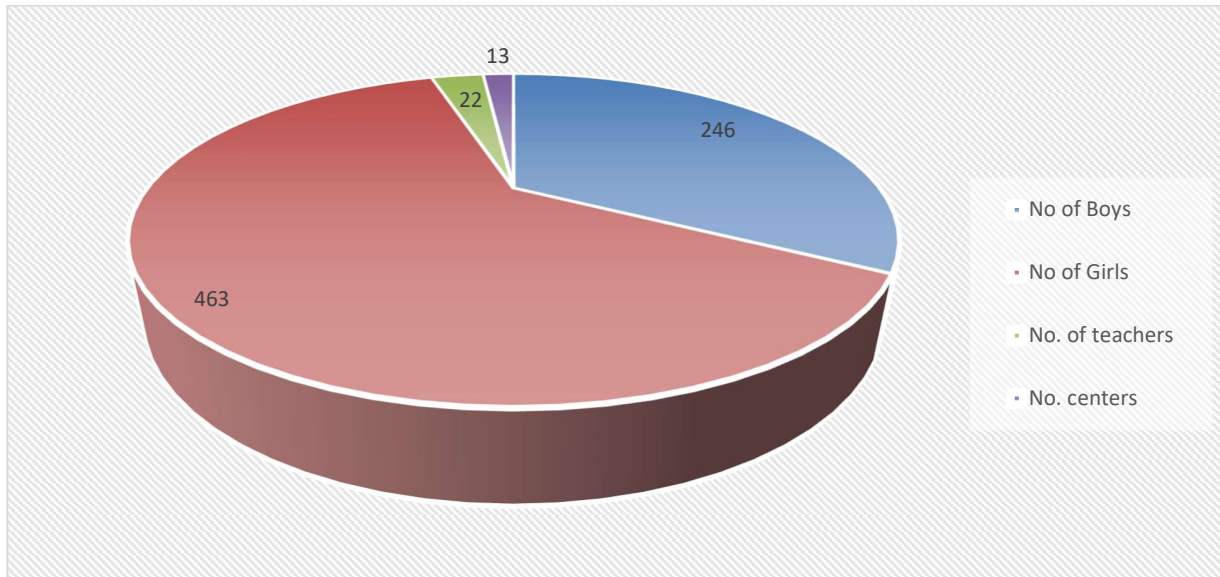

Major activities in school during the pandemic crisis

- Since March 25th 2020, all the schools were closed across the nation due to COVID-19. Therefore, we focussed on distributing ration kits to the families facing financial crisis due to COVID-19 lockdown.
- All the teachers supported the COVID-19 ration packing as well as the examination results of the students and the decoration of the classes.
- Due to financial crisis faced by the families of school children, dry rations were distributed.
- Keeping social distance practice in our mind, we enrolled 70 new students.
- With respect to COVID-19 situation, all the children of the school were called in order and every one of them received a copy, book, pen, pencil, rubber, stationary box and masks.
- After the outbreak of COVID-19, the work of reading and teaching was started by calling children of one class each from July.
- After coming to school, the children were seated in the class room using handwash sanitizer and the children were asked to always use the mask.
- Independence Day and Republic Day were observed following social distancing rules.
- Children were taught through kits play and computer.

- The birth anniversary and tribute meeting of all the great men was celebrated with the children and information was given to the children about all the great men.
- Respecting COVID-19 norms, children were given weekly homework.
- Children's rights were given to the children by the Mirzamurad Police under the Mission Shakti Abhiyan run by the government along with women and school children.
- Art competition with children was organized, along with the awards distribution.
- Plants and flowers were planted in pots and beds with the help of children.
- Parent teacher meetings were held on a time to time basis.
- Regular class of all children was started from the month of January.
- Keeping in mind the social distance rules were taught to all children and two new class rooms were built to make space for the children on the school to respect the COVID-19 norms.
- Online class of English was conducted to the children of class 5 in collaboration with Rahul Pandey ji, which is going very positive.
- Kshitij from Asha USA visited the school on March 2021.
- Conducted annual examination of children keeping in mind COVID-19 norms.

Kishori Sewing Center Program

- Lok Samiti, Asha Trust and N.J.S.S. In order to make the girls aware and self-reliant, 11 sewing embroidery centres are being run in Arajai Line Sevapuri block, at all the centres, the girls are being taught: Max, blouse, petticoat, frock, panty kurti, suit, sewing embroidery at the present time. 286 people are taking training at the centres.
- Keeping in mind Kovid-19, all the sewing centres were opened in the month of July with handwash, sanitizer, masks.
- Every sewing teacher was taught to make masks at every center.
- Around 10,000 masks were made by the sewing centres which were



used by the school children, the girls of the sewing centre, the women of the organization, the daily wage laborers, the youth organization's associates.

- Teenagers of all sewing centres took out a rally in protest against the incident of domestic violence.
- A meeting was held with the girls and guardians of the sewing centre for rescue from COVID-19.
- Independence Day and Republic Day were celebrated at all sewing centres keeping in mind COVID-19.
- On Menstrual Day on 28 May, nutritious food and sanitary pads were distributed to adolescent girls of COVID-19.
- Balika Mahotsav was celebrated at all sewing centres keeping in mind COVID-19.

- In the Balika Mahotsav, the teenagers took out an awareness rally in the village and organized cultural programs to meet their demands.
- On the occasion of Nirbhaya Day, hundreds of teenagers took out a vigorous cycle rally from Adarsh Village Nagepur and a memorandum of their seven-point demands S.D.M. Handed over to sir.
- One day training of all the adolescent girls was done at Nagepur office.
- The girls of all the sewing centres participated in the program and cultural programs in support of the women on the occasion of Women's Day.
- Two new sewing centres were inaugurated in the month of March with the help of Aid, in which the first Bhorkala and the second Badaura market were done.

Challenges

- Girls are least allowed to go out of the house.
- Even today the boy is discriminated against in the girl.
- We are evicted from real estate.
- We have less role in family decision.
- People are married without their permission.
- It is difficult to reduce the number of machines at the centre.

Self-Help Groups (SHGs)

- The work of women's organization is going on in 70 villages of Arajline and Sevapuri blocks by the Lok Samiti. Self-help groups work against women violence, sexual violence, child marriage. The main objective of running self-help groups is to make rural women economically and socially self-reliant. Along with this, they have to change their thoughts and make them aware of their rights. Women who could not get out of their home by running self-help groups in earlier days, now, they are coming on the stage and keep their words. One benefit of running a group in the village is that the moneylenders got rid of money lending and paying more interest and women are learning to exchange money among themselves. At present, 110 groups are running in 70 villages of Arajline and Sevapuri blocks, whose details are as follows:

The following programs were organized by the Self Help Group:

- ❖ During COVID-19, ration distribution was distributed among 4000 families to the widows, people with disability, people living in the destitution and the poor families of the group organization. Awareness campaign was carried out regarding the group organization COVID-19, along with distribution of poster, handwash sanitizer and mask to the group, and teaching about the rescue from Corona.
- ❖ A one-day workshop was held by the women of the group organization to preach about women's rights and their savings.
- ❖ Independence Day and Republic Day, plantation drives etc. were organized with the help women of the group.
- ❖ The women were delegated in the making of washing powder along with the training, for empowering women with the employment.



Women's conference

Around 2000 people from the group organization and sewing centres, 70 different villages of Araj Line and Sevapuri block participated in the women's conference organized by Asha Trust and Lok Samiti. The program was organized at Rajatlab Sichai Dak Bungalow. In the program, women and adolescent girls besieged the Rajatalab Tehsil regarding their rights and memorandum of their demands S.D.M. assigned to. After this, all the people participated in the program of the Women's Conference on the Irrigation Post Bungalow and there was a program held to make people aware of putting women perspective view points while adolescent girls were taught about their own responsibilities.

Youth organization

- ❖ A major program is being organized by the youth and labours across 12 villages of Araj Line and Sevapuri blocks for gender equality. Youth is the future of the country. The program is being run mainly to change the attitude and views towards women. At present, about 150 people are involved in the program. Other major events were also organized by the youth organizations and labours.
- ❖ WhatsApp group of equality partners was formed and through this, gender and family planning were discussed and information were circulated.
- ❖ Story was collected as part of safe pregnancy program.
- ❖ Family planning and meeting was held with Asha and Enam sisters.

- ❖ Shramdaan and plantation drive were organized by the youth on International Youth Day.
- ❖ On the occasion of World Population Day, a seminar was held by the youth and media colleagues which focussed on awareness program of family planning.
- ❖ Drought rations were distributed to the families of youth organizations facing COVID-19.
- ❖ In view of family planning, helpdesks have been started in 4 villages Nagepur, Harsos, Virbhanpur and Chakrapanpur. On these help decks, distribution of contraceptives, handwas, masks etc. is being done free of cost.
- ❖ COVID-19 warriors were selected and rewarded.
- ❖ Durga Pooja was organized by the youth and other mass programs were organized in the villages as well.
- ❖ Simultaneous campaign meetings and pamphlets were distributed about gender discrimination.
- ❖ Youth and children discussed gender by watching the film.
- ❖ Gender and non-equality were discussed with the people.
- ❖ A wall writing program was organized in collaboration with the youth.
- ❖ Help Desk is now being operated by the Asha peers on equality.
- ❖ Labour Day was celebrated with daily wage laborers and youth.
- ❖ Survey of daily laborers and service employment of 145 daily laborers were registered in the office.
- ❖ A meeting was held with the youth on gender discrimination as part of a simultaneous campaign.



- ❖ Participated in the meeting of District Forum and the program of District Gender Hub.
- ❖ MIYS report was sent under simultaneous campaign.

Asha Knowledge Library



❖ Asha Knowledge Library, run by Asha Trust and Public Committee, runs a library for poor and helpless children in Nagepur, in which about 479 children have been registered from 12 villages of the region, every Sunday from 10 am to 2 pm. Books are distributed to these children.

❖ Books are distributed every Sunday

keeping in mind COVID-19.

- ❖ Masks were distributed to all the students from the library.
- ❖ Books were distributed to the children during the pandemic crisis.
- ❖ Drought rations were distributed to the children of the family struggling with the economic conditions due to lockdown.

- ❖ Due to the closure of work due to COVID-19, needy children were given goods of copy and stationary items.
- ❖ Career workshop for the students was organized by BHU students.
- ❖ Registered students of classes 10 and 12 were rewarded after their board exams.
- ❖ Former members were working in government jobs who also helped during the COVID-19 epidemic.
- ❖ Awareness rally was organized by the registered students of the library on the occasion Girl's Day.
- ❖ Sufficient books were compiled for the library in collaboration with the ASHA Trust.



Major programs conducted by ASHA Trust and Public Committee during COVID-19

- ❖ Dry rations were distributed to about 4000 families of poor, destitute, handicapped, widow, families of Arajline and Sevapuri blocks on April, May, and June, especially during onset of drought and COVID-19 pandemic.
- ❖ Dry non-fruits and water were distributed to approximately 10,000 resident passers on National Highway 2 (Grand Trunk Road) to the migrant labours coming from outside during the lockdown period.
- ❖ Asha Trust and all the members of the Lok Samiti collaborated in COVID-19. During the COVID-19, daily wage laborers were surveyed and masks were distributed to protect them from COVID.
- ❖ About 1500 people were supported and furthermore, masks were distributed to the migrant workers.
- ❖ COVID-19 paid homage to the martyred labours at the time of their return home.
- ❖ About 20 lakh rupees was received from the corporation in COVID-19, which was used for the relief work cooperation in the corona epidemic.
- ❖ Keeping in mind COVID-19, the work of sanitization between the ashram and the activists continued in the middle.
- ❖ Support was gathered around from the youths during our relief camp.

Major programs conducted by Asha Trust and Lok Samiti

- ❖ On the day of Ground water, a workshop was organized at Nagepur where plant saplings were sowed, and the workshop was organized on a legal basis with the support from teachers and staffs.
- ❖ Mirzamurad police station and Rajatalab tehsil were sieged to support the woman against domestic violence.
- ❖ A candle march and a silent procession was organized in the village to protest against the violence of women.
- ❖ Protests were held against the incident of hathras.
- ❖ A 16-day campaign was organized in different villages of Araj Line and Sevapuri blocks in which people were made aware through film shows, street plays, torch processions, cycle rally.
- ❖ A plantation program was done to celebrate the birth day and martyrdom day of great men.
- ❖ Many family and land-related disputes in the village were compromised through mutual negotiations.
- ❖ Solicitation of mutual dispute between husband and wife was done and insolvency writing was done on social issues.
- ❖ Village to village protests were held over the rising cost of electricity bill of weavers.
- ❖ A protest was held in Varanasi and a memorandum was given to protest against the electricity bill.



- ❖ People were made aware in support of farmer movement.
- ❖ A copy of the three black laws bill was lit and protests were held in support of the farmers.
- ❖ Paying tribute to the farmers who lost their lives in support of the farmers movement.
- ❖ The dummy of the three anti-government black laws was burnt. Police on top of 41 associates of village and Lok Samiti, F. I. R. Has registered.
- ❖ Voters public awareness rally organized in 70 villages of Arajli Line and Sevapuri blocks and public awareness programs were organized in the voters through street plays and meetings.
- ❖ In Uttar Pradesh, women of Arajli Line and Sevapuri blocks submitted a memorandum to the government regarding the implementation of liquor ban.
- ❖ Nukkar Natak Sabha meeting and distribution of slips were implemented to aware the voters about Panchayat elections.
- ❖ To make voters aware, they were made aware through ballot paper stamp.
