- Slum/street children of Kolkata
- Expanded into Chhatisgarh and Jharkhand
- Variety of projects:

Model school

Open school unit

Computer education etc.

- Goal has been to do anything to enable these children
- Provide extra tuition support to govt. school kids
- Provide vocational training
- Provide health care
- Provide safe living arrangements for needy children
- Try to increase involvement of parents by,
 - putting in some financials commitment if possible
 - helping prepare teaching material, sitting in classes with their kids
 - trying to get more local vols, getting donations like books, if not money
- We fund one of their projects called the Mother Project

- After school coaching, uniforms, books, career counseling etc.
- Everything to supplement their education in the regular schools
- Total # of students is 250

Q: Do all of them stay in the hostel?

A: No, they are taken in on a need basis

Q: How do they decide?

A: They have some way of vetting that the kids do need help, but not sure how they go about that. Not sure if the parents initiate this or if they do.

#s from last year:

- Proposed budget: 7,51,938, sent: 7,48,xxx

- Actual expense: 7,15,341

- Surplus: 32,909

There is a surplus because some students either dropped out or didn't pass to the next grade, or in some cases parents chipped in. (tuition fees, hostel fees etc.)

Class 3-9, everyone passed to next grade

Class 10, 10/12 passed

Class 11, everyone moved on

BA, BCom, everyone passed

Since last year we have been discouraging supporting the Bachelor's students (?)

Q: What do the kids do if we stop supporting them at that level?

A: Well we said we can only support about 50 students, so basically they will get funding from someone else. Asha is not their only source of funding.

Q: When we publish the student details do we include them all?

A: Yes we do

Q: If limit is # of students, why don't we go all the way with the same students instead?

A: Last year there was some discussion about why are we supporting higher education or something like that.

Q: Why not support the same kids to a logical end of their education?

C: Well, the children are more at risk than these, so maybe we prefer to fund those ...

Q: For students who graduated to the next level, how many donors continued by supporting at the higher level?

A: Not sure about that.

C: If the donor does agree to go to the higher level, then doesn't that make more logical sense

C: But it should also be up to us to decide. If we decide that as a chapter we want to support only primary education, the donors will probably pick one or more new kids.

< More discussion without any real logical conclusion? Discussion was based on what happens if TF stops funding the project, etc.>

C: It might be good enough if we make sure we don't pick any new students directly at the Bachelor level. It doesn't look like we have dropped any current students as they went to higher grades
