We began in 2000 with just 40 students who wanted to learn spoken English. By the year 2025, we reached 1100 underprivileged children, women and youth.



Our Approach

- We educate: We offer early childhood education, after school education, special education to underserved children ensuring holistic development through both academics and life skills. We started a digital learning program in 2024 by setting up Community based digital studio.
- We empower: We empower women and youth to be financially independent through skill development courses.
- We employ: We employ resource persons from the community and our alumni as they understand the community and carry the essence of Project WHY.






New Initiatives

- 151 women successfully completed skill courses in tailoring & beauty culture.





- Japanese Delegation (7th Sep): Conducted a science experiment, donated supplies, and distributed food at Yamuna Centre. Students gifted handmade paintings.



GIRI NAGAR Skill Development for women

Cutting and Tailoring Program

Project WHY's Cutting & Tailoring COUrse at the Giri Nagar centre is a six-month program designed to equip women with essential skills for self-employment and financial independence.

Program Highlights:

Beneficiaries: 50 women from the local community. **Trainer:** One dedicated instructor leading the training.

Activities & Achievements:

Certificate Ceremony (September 4): Students celebrated their course completion with certificates, refreshments, music, and dance.

Almost all women who completed course are self employed and have started to earn.

Tailoring Orders Completed:

136 stationery pouches for a school exhibition. 150 cloth bags for the Rotary Club of New Delhi. 60 cloth bags for Enfances Indiennes (France).











Impact story- Giri Nagar

Sunita Devi, a passionate learner, joined Project WHY's Cutting and Tailoring Program on July 21, 2024. Originally from Bihar, she comes from a struggling farming family and had to drop out after 8th standard. Married in 2008, she moved to Delhi in 2011 and finally pursued her passion for stitching. At Project WHY, she learned from Sonia Ma'am, a skilled fashion designer. Sunita now stitches various garments and practices by sewing dresses for community members. Occasionally earning from neighbours, she has transformed from a school dropout to a skilled tailor, proving that determination can overcome any obstacle.



GIRI NAGAR Skill Development for women

Beauty Culture Program

- The Beauty Culture course, also a six-month program at the Giri Nagar center, focuses on enhancing grooming and wellness skills for employment in the beauty industry.
- Program Highlights:
- Beneficiaries: 22 women currently enrolled.
- Trainer: One specialized beauty instructor.
- Activities & Achievements:
 - Teej Celebration: A lively mehendi competition where students showcased their intricate henna designs.
 - Ananda Spa Foundation Visit (September 7): Teachers Neha and Seema accompanied students Ruchika and Roshani to Rishikesh for a free three-month Spa & Therapy course.
 - Almost all women received training are either self employed or working in nearby salons.









Impact Story-Giri Nagar



OKHLA

The Okhla Education Centre, located in the Okhla Industrial Area, serves a community where children once faced severe educational neglect, with over 90% out of school and at risk of exploitation. Established in 2004, it began as a modest initiative, conducting classes under a plastic sheet near a garbage dump. Today, it has evolved into a fully equipped learning hub with modern amenities, providing quality education to 365 students, empowering them with knowledge and opportunity.

OPPORTUNITES

- The Okhla Education Centre empowers children by providing access to education for over 90% of previously unschooled youth.
- It offers them a path to a brighter future, breaking the cycle of street life, theft, and drug involvement, and opening doors to learning, growth, and new opportunities.





Impact Story-Okhla

Sahil, a young boy of 19 years old, joined Project WHY in April 2023. He migrated from Nepal after completing his 10th grade. Encouraged by a relative who had previously taken a basic computer course, Sahil enrolled himself in the Basic Computer and Computer Hardware courses at Project WHY. Initially, he faced communication challenges and took some time to grasp the technical language. However, with perseverance and support from his teachers, he gradually began to understand the concepts and completed his courses within a year.

After completing his training, Sahil applied for jobs in various companies. Finally, in May 2024, he secured a job where he started earning Rs. 10,000/-as a fresher in his field. Sahil expressed his gratitude, saying, "I am grateful to Project WHY and their teachers for polishing me and building my confidence to interact with people.

Impact stories Okhla (contd.)

VIVEK

Vivek, 18, completed 12th at Okhla Centre in 2024. Initially uninterested in studies, he became diligent from the 8th class. He scored 85% in History and 75% in Political Science. A skilled cook, he aspires to be a graphic designer and prepared for the CUET for university admission.

VIJAY

Vijay joined Project WHY in 2022 in 11th class. Struggling academically, he improved significantly, scoring 69% in 12th with 86% in Political Science. With teachers' motivation, he gained interest in studies and now aspires to become an ethical hacker, focusing on building his computer skills.

ANCHAL

Anchal, 17, a bright student at Okhla Centre, excels in academics and extracurriculars. She scored 81% in 10th and chose the science stream to pursue medicine. Passionate about dance, debates, and singing, she comes from a hardworking family in New Sanjay Camp, Delhi.

SUNITA

Sunita, a longtime Project WHY student, rejoined in 9th after a break and completed 12th in 2024. She scored 89% in History but struggled with English. Inspired by her teachers, she dreams of becoming an educator. She aims to study at Delhi University through the CUET.

MUSKAN

Muskan, originally from Bihar, joined Project WHY in 5th class. Initially shy, she gained confidence over time. She topped her centre with 71% in 10th and now studies science in 11th. Passionate about fashion, she excels in a stitching course, creating unique designs.









GOVINDPURI

The Govindpuri Centre serves 167 children in an area with crowded living conditions and a high population of migrant families seeking work. It provides education and social support to underprivileged children, addressing limited access to basic amenities and creating opportunities for differently-abled students in the community.

OPPORTUNITES

- Started on roadside in 2001 for children who lost access to education, the
 centre now provides after-school support, digital learning, early
 education, and special needs care.
- It fosters an inclusive environment, ensuring equal opportunities for special needs children by equipping them with life and vocational skills tailored to their abilities.



Impact Story-GovindPuri

Umang joined Project WHY on **September 3, 2023**, as a **4th-grade student** and now studies in **5th grade** at the **Govindpuri Centre**. Originally from **Uttar Pradesh**, she moved to Delhi with her extended family after her **mother passed away**. She comes from a large family with **one brother and five sisters** and previously attended a government school.

Her father, a farmer, earns ₹8000 per month, supporting the family in a rented home. Umang helps her elder sisters with household chores, striving to maintain their home as their mother once did. Despite initial struggles, they learned to balance studies and responsibilities.

Initially an average student, Umang has shown remarkable improvement under Project WHY's guidance. She is regular in class, quick to grasp lessons, and benefits from the love and encouragement of her teachers. Her enthusiasm extends beyond academics. She actively participates in activities, completes homework diligently, and enjoys art, craft, and dance.

Her favourite sport is football, and she dreams of financial independence to support her father in the future. With determination and talent, Umang is steadily building a brighter future for herself and her family.





KHADAR

Established in 2007, the centre provides after-school education and computer classes for children while offering six-month tailoring courses for women. Graduates receive certification and a manual for self-employment, empowering them and improving their families' well-being. The centre impacts 333 beneficiaries annually.

OPPORTUNITES

• The Khadar Centre transforms lives by providing educational support to 293 children and empowering 40 women with skill development. Beyond academics, it serves as a hub of empowerment, equipping individuals with practical skills that foster employment opportunities and community growth.



Impact Story-Khadar

Swati, a **Class 11 humanities student** at Project WHY Khadar Centre, has been part of the program since **Class 4**. Living in Delhi since **2017**, she comes from a small family with her parents and brother. While her brother received more support, Swati has navigated challenges independently.

A passionate **cricket lover**, Swati once trained through an **NGO coaching program**, but family constraints forced her to quit. Despite financial struggles, she remained committed to her studies, often **borrowing books from friends**. When she faced difficulties obtaining **Class 11 textbooks**, Project WHY stepped in to provide them, ensuring uninterrupted learning.

Beyond academics, Swati excels in creative arts, dance, and sports. She actively participates in classroom events and celebrations, showcasing her artistic skills. This Diwali, she sculpted Goddess Laxmi and Lord Ganesh, impressing teachers and peers.

Project WHY has been a **pillar of support**, nurturing her education, talents, and aspirations. Swati dreams of achieving **financial independence** and supporting her family, using her **creativity and resilience** to shape a brighter future.





YAMUNA

The Yamuna Centre, established in 2015, supports 91 children of agricultural laborers, often excluded from mainstream education. Operating in an adapted cowshed near the polluted Yamuna River, it offers a holistic curriculum to integrate students into the National Open School system. Beyond academics, the centre provides co-curricular activities and nutritious meals, creating a nurturing and educational space for these children.

OPPORTUNITES

- Bridging Educational Gaps: Provides essential educational services to underserved communities.
- Holistic Learning: Integrates academics with co-curricular activities for wellrounded development.
- Educational Inclusion: Supports mainstreaming children into formal schools and the National Open School system for long-term learning opportunities.

Academics



Solar system

- Secondary classes have a 15-minute quiz at the end of each session, and 5th-grade students participated in a General Knowledge quiz competition.
- Teachers are actively teaching the syllabus, preparing students for unit tests and internal assessments.
- Students Centre practice daily newspaper and textbook reading to improve their reading and writing skills.
- Internal assessments were conducted at the start of the academic session to evaluate students' strengths and weaknesses for targeted support.
- Students learned about electric current, plant types, and their functions.
- Students explored day and night cycles and weather changes.
- Students learned state capitals, mountain ranges, and rivers using an atlas.
