OUR JOURNEY

The Sri Ram Goburdhun Charitable Trust addressed the “WHYs” of the community under its flagship program **Project WHY**.

We began ***in 2000***, with just 40 students wanting to learn spoken English. Today we reach 1100 underprivileged children per year. We have trained 2000 women and created 50 job opportunities for people from the community.

ACHIEVEMENTS TILL 2020

Providing 1100 children education support every year free of cost.

90% of our resource persons are from the community.

2000 women trained at the Project WHY centers.

80% women trained at Project WHY are gainfully employed.



Our Approach

- **We Educate:** We believe in quality education that is not only academics but other lifeskills too.
- **We Employ:** We employ all staff from within the community as they understand the community better.
- **We empower:** We empower women to be independent and they empower the community.

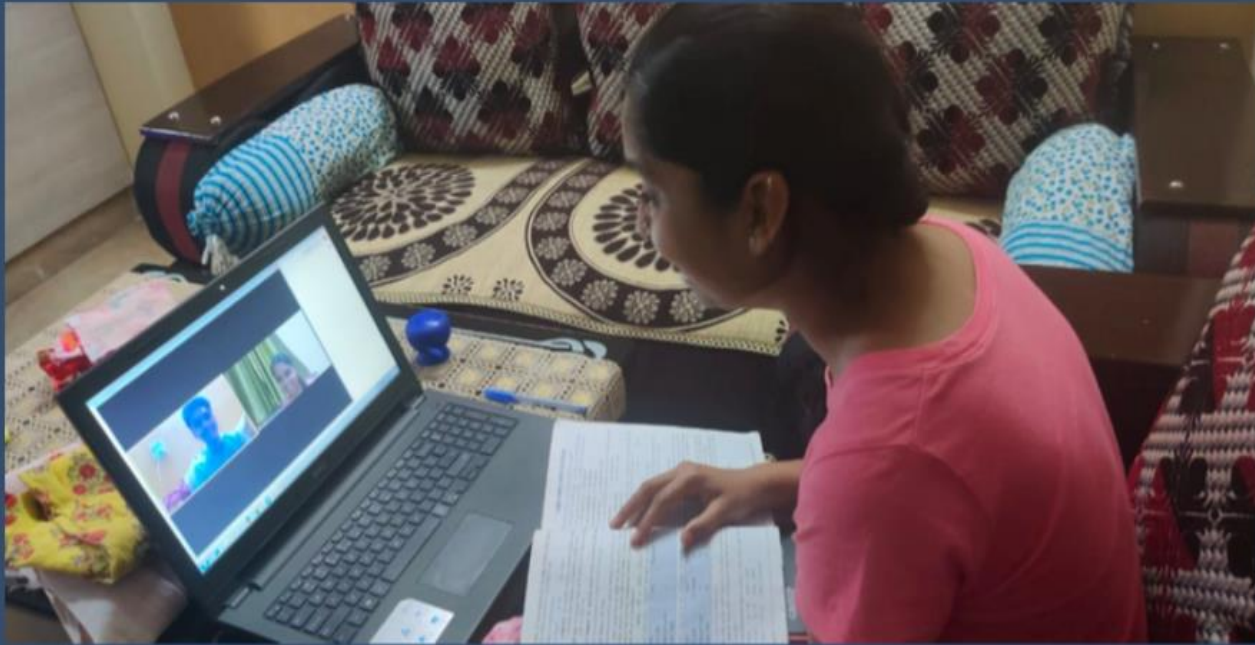
Project WHY during Covid- 19

- We reached out to over 500 needy families to distribute food and rations.
- We provided 1000 hot lunches for a period of 2 months.

Online classes: During the lockdown, we took online classes for about 500 children till the month of December .



Project WHY during Covid-19

Return of children: -In December , children returned to the centers in small groups mainting Covid regulations.

-At Yamuna center due to children not having phones, Project WHY teachers conducted door to door teaching.



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Progress 2020-2021

- Due to Covid 19, the centers were closed for 3 months.
- In the month of June, we resumed online classes .
- In December, classes resumed in small groups of secondary class in the centers.
- We explained the importance of education and online classes to the parents.
