- ↳ **NGO inception, history:** Adruta Children Home started 25 years ago in 1998 with only one abandoned new-born child. It grew slowly in the beginning to have just about 25 children (girls and boys) over the first few years.

The students from Adruta are excellent in many artforms including Odissi dance, singing, drawing, painting. They participate in various events and exhibitions to bring awareness and opportunity.

Income generation projects and setting up a Corpus fund to ensure future sustainability.

Activities

Today, Adruta has 10 homes at various locations in Odisha. At present, There are 625 children spread across the centers. Bhubaneswar (Boys)- 45, Bhubaneswar (Girls)- 95, Cuttack- 40, Dhenkanal-40, Angul- 130, Sundargarh (Boys)- 55, Kendujhar (Boys) - 55, Baripada (Boys) -60, Bolangir (Boys) - 55, Puri (Boys) - 50

The Homes are duly recognized by Department of Women and Child Welfare under Juvenile Justice Act, Government of Odisha.

Various programs supported by Adruta Homes include Rehabilitation and restoration, Adoption and alternative care, life skill training, infant care, health care, vocational training.

Children go to various local schools and colleges. Beyond school hours they are helped by tutors who ensure their academic excellence. The children commute to their school in Adruta bus/ vehicles.

Children participate in organic farming. They also raise cows in some centers. Children are provided with healthy, hygienic and nutritious vegetarian meals.

Best of available healthcare facilities are provided through tie up with hospitals, nursing homes and individual doctors visit the home from time to time. Health check-up camps are held at regular intervals by specialists who render free services to the children.

Training in Art, Music dance, sports during leisure, suiting to the native inclination under guidance of experts in the field. There are many internationally acclaimed Odissi dancers from Adruta.

Vocational training, Training in Life skill, Self-defense, Yoga, singing, stitching, gardening.

Project Updates

21 children have passed their 12th Board exam in the year 2025, 25 children passed their 10th board exams.

10 children completed their graduation. 28 children completed their ITI from GOVT.ITIs

9 children continuing Diploma in Engineering in C.V. Raman Engineering College. Twelve children got job placement in different sectors after completion of their technical studies.

Padmini & Dipali cleared 12th board exam securing 84.16% (Odissa board) & 75.75% (CBSE board) respectively. Padmini is an accomplished Hindustani classical singer & Odissi dancer. She has performed Odissi & folk dances across the country & abroad too.

Dipali is a good athlete & has represented odissa at National Meets in different events.

Lipon & Sipun from Adruta Children Home, Dhenkanal Chapter for clearing their 10th CBSE BOARD EXAM securing 78% & 77% respectively.

On the Foundation days of various states, Adruta students perform different folk dances at the Governor's office.
