We are helping the children to follow the syllabus of main stream formal education classes, so that they can stay at main stream education. We are following the Government school's syllabus.

Moreover, we are stressing on basic literacy of children, so that they can follow easily the syllabus and study at formal classes of Govt. Sponsored Schools.

The parents of these children mainly involved in agricultural work. Some of them are rickshaw puller and casual day labourers. The education level of parents are very low. They could not even passed out from school.

\* It is observed that some of our students occassionally working as a child labour at tea shops and vending fruits.

In addition to education, we are trying to give some psychological support to our children. We have observed that some of the children are depressed with their family situation. In that case they need some guidance and counselling to combat the situation.

We could not provide food though it is very much needed due to shortage of fund.

We are organising health check-up camps for children twice a year.

We are taking care of the children for their development and psychological depression. Keeping track with the family through Home Visit. Involving parents for education of their children. We educate their mothers for their nutrition through Health Check-up Camps. We involve parents to take care of thehealth of their children and parents are also enthusisastic about the matter.

We provide extra curricular activities, games for their children which help the children to develop their interest on study.

\* Other existing school not giving so importance to their extra curricular activities. They only concentrate on school syllabus which sometime make students disinterested.

### 22. Why are the children in your school/s not attending government/other schools in the local area?

We are taking care of the children and accommodate the children according to their capability. Hence the parents feel comfortable to keep their children at our school and teachers are also very particular to take care of the children that is why some of the children prefer to attend our school inspite of Govt. school and other schools exsisted at sourrounding areas.

We are trying to involve the parents in different issues of the children i.e.

- a) Behaviour of the children.
- b) Language using with the children.

We are not involving the parents in setting the syllabus as we have to follow syllabus of Govt. Schools.

### 24. What are your expansion plans for the future (e.g. adding more classes or schools)?

Our plan is to set up a Day Care Centre for these children in future. Because we have observed that the children who are attending our school are very much disturbed with their family situation. When they faced the violence against their mother and other unfavourable situation due to poverty. They do not know how to deal with this situation. Ultimately it effects their study. So we want to keep these children from Morning to Evening for their integrated devolepment.

If we get any scope, we can add more classes in future. But we do not want to set up any school in the long run.

## 25. Do you have any suggestions on how Asha can be a positive influence in changing the education scenario in India?

It is our suggestion Asha can follow up with the organisation who are doing the education project in India whether it has real impact in the community. Asha should be flexible regarding content of education following by the organisation who are carring out Asha Project. The content and objective of the project of education may differ from place to place and situation is not same in all places. So when the organisation will take up any education project, it should be taken up according to the need of the community. There should be a close cooperation and trust with the implementing agency with Asha.

### Asha SF - Additional Q&A relating to ISW Cycle 2 (2013-14) proposal

Phone conversation between steward Namita and ISW project contact Nupur on Jun 28, 2013

### Part A - General Questions

1) How many students in total are supported at the Asha SF-supported Barasat center? What classes/grades do they fall in? What is their age group?

### Answer –

- ~300 students; however in the near future we would also like to support students from nearby govt schools/drop outs with after-school/tuition/support services making the total no to ~400
- Classes Nursery to 7<sup>th</sup> grade
- Age group 4-13 years
- 2) What do these students do after 7<sup>th</sup> grade?

**Answer** – We assist them in joining nearby government schools or open schools from 8<sup>th</sup> standard onwards. At that level, students are more stable and independent and are able to perform well despite quality of government education because their foundational years have been well developed at ISW

3) You say you provide 'formal' education. How do you define this? Are you a government school?

**Answer** – 'Formal' education implied that we adhere to and use government syllabi for all grades. This is done to ensure that students are provided with the most transferable education, which enables them to easily join government schools.

We are not a government school as such. We started about 25 years ago with 30 street children who belonged to families of daily wage laborers/ construction workers. This is the most at-risk community. Over the years, due to our continuous and expanding commitment to the community we have grown and are now till 7<sup>th</sup> grade.

Since we are very well respected by the community, the government's department of education initiated dialogue with us to accredit us with their endorsement, but the minute they expressed their condition that we consider transferring part of our land in the government's name, we refused and terminated discussions. We are very successful on our own and we wish to continue independently.

4) You have mentioned in your budget that the children would benefit significantly from getting some healthy snacks/food items as they appear nutritionally deficient. Why have you not raised a budget for it? Your budget includes only teachers' and other staff salaries.

**Answer** – We did not know we can. Because of very little communication even in the last cycle, we got the feeling that we were putting too much burden on you. That's why we raised budget for the most critical items – teachers' salaries – since we were faced with the possibility of teachers leaving us. For other items, we raised local donations or simply did not implement other essential services since we had no means to. And that's why even in this year, we only raised a budget for teachers' and other staff salaries, we assumed we are only allowed to ask for these items.

Steward comment – ISW was encouraged to raise a budget to include all items that they deem essential for the betterment of students. They have sent a revised budget to include other items, however snacks/food for children is proposed to start from 2014-15 cycle and not the current cycle.

### Part B - About Building Construction

1) Is this building to support children of the center that Asha SF supported in 2012-13? I know we supported children from two centers, but I don't remember the names (do not include Asha Cornell information, only Asha SF. Thank you)

Answer - This is the building to support Children Centre that Asha SF supported in 2012-13 at Barasat (Rural Project).

- 2) Please give some background of this building construction, according to topics below:
  - a) when did the construction start?

Answer - Construction started on January, 2013.

b) what is the purpose of constructing this building? Before this building, how have you been managing?

**Answer** - The purpose of constructing this building is to accommodate the children of the education centre (Asha SF supported project). Before this building, it was a brick wall with tile roof room which was totally broken and risk for the children for accommodation. Hence we are bound to demolish this structure to construct a new building.

how many children will be supported in this building? What kinds of programs will you conduct?

**Answer** - About 400 children will be supported in this building.

We have a plan to conduct the existing programme i.e. Education Centre for Children apart from it we have a plan to start a Day Care Centre for the students who are also studying at other schools for their development because the students after coming back from their school they have to face an uncomfortable situation at their home which is very disturbing for their development. If we can accommodate these students (adolescent) by reading or some extracurricular activities including play and games they will be cheerful which is very important for their future development. This building will also be used for the Workshops of students.

d) where did you receive funds from for the ground construction, and for purchase of land?

Answer - We have raised some funds from local donations to construct the ground and the land was purchased long time back (i.e. 1998) which was supported by the organisation Indian Hilfe (Germany)

e) who will own this building?

**Answer -** The building is owned by Institute of Social Work.

f) if funds are received, how long will it take to complete construction and when will classes/projects start in the building?

**Answer -** If funds are received it will take about 8 to 10 months to complete the construction. The project will start in this building at ground floor from October, 2013 and if we get funds for the 1st floor we will start our programme by February – March, 2014.
