In 2014, Asha San Francisco's project was in the Asha-wide Work an Hour campaign. The NGO was Institute of Social Work and the (new, one-time) project was "Protect Girl Children from Risk through Empowerment".

FYI - On a regular basis, our chapter supports ISW for the operation of a formal school (in Barasat) that serves ~300 children from nursery through 7th grade. We have been supporting Barasat school for 3+ years now.

While the total budget raised for the WAH project was Rs. 8,08,000, we were only able to raise Rs. 3,50,000, which has been received by the project earlier last month. ISW was always aware that we may not be able to raise 100% of the funds and were open to revising project's scale accordingly. They have now done that and submitted another budget reflecting the new costs. Much of the project can be successfully implemented with our Rs. 3,50,000, but they are still facing a deficit of Rs 68,000. They have requested Asha SF to consider funding them for this difference, which is about \$1,100.

More details on this WAH 2014 project are as follows:

The goal is "to empower adolescent girls who are in vulnerable situation, through education and skilled development. Especially who are school dropout and not with the main stream education. To make provision for girls so that they can continue their formal education, stop their early marriage and to build up confidence, so that they can stand on their feet by integrated development which also includes cultural awareness, adolescent health, skill development apart from formal education."

The goal is proposed to be achieved through "workshops, seminars, conferences aimed at not just direct

beneficiaries (i.e. adolescent girls) but also groups that directly or indirectly affect and are, in turn, affected by these issues, such as law enforcement, judiciary system, lawyers, other NGOs, Public offices (Child Welfare Committee, District Child Protection Office), local clubs and community leaders."
