## SITE VISIT REPORT

(A.Ramakoteswara Rao and Lakshmi Prasanna) As requested by Priya Mocherla on 23rd January 2018)

We visited Sri Vikas Bharati School Bandlaguda run by M/s Kamalakar Memorial Trust on 23rd January 2018. We were warmly welcomed by the principal and the students. We did a school tour and sat down with the Principal to discuss.

The school budget and the expenses statements presented at the time of inspection were reviewed. Currently the school has a strength of 170 students and runs classes from LKG to 10th standard. The fees payments made by these students for the period June 17 to September 17 is informed as Rs46,300/- however on enquiry, it is understood that school the fee payments is not regular. Salaries are paid to the teachers for 11 months in an year and for the all the 12 months for 2 support staff and a driver. There are 11 students in 10th class this year and the last. Last year all the 11 students who appeared for 10th standard passed with good grades. The highest was 85% and the lowest being 65%.



### Interaction with the teachers:

We interacted with the teachers on how they plan for their lesson and teaching. What we found is that most of the teachers have not much lesson planning experience and they need continuous monitoring and guidance for teaching the content better.

#### Observations on Teachers and students:

There are totally 11 Teachers out of whom there are 3 teachers who have B.Ed qualification.Out of these two teachers are working on part time basis. Due to insufficient number of teachers, some of the classes are clubbed. The school management looks to be constrained with finance to recruit some more teachers. We had detailed interaction with the teachers and students to understand about their academics & extra curricular activities. Students are trying to cope up well with their studies without much support from their uneducated parents.

#### What is needed:

Currently the school is not using the library time effectively. They looked to be crunched for time to finish syllabus. The school needs to provide separate study periods in the time table to effectively utilize the library. Upon suggesting this the principal took the advice and promised to implement the same in the coming academic year.



# Various programs organised during the academic year:

The extra curricular programmes organised by the school during 2017-18 are as follows.

1. Participation in Planting trees at various places by the students to promote green belt. Ten students got prizes

- 2. Competitions conducted on the occasion of Sri Pingali Venkayya's 135 Jayanti.
- 3. On the occasion of Independence day the students Performing Burrakatha on the life of a journalist.
- 4. On the occasion of Ganesh Chaturthi Telangana state pollution control Board conducted a clay ganesha workshop and the many students participated and made clay idols and distributed to the entire community. They got the certificates.



- 5.Performing Bhuvana Vijayam on the occasion of Teachers day.

  Besides these the students participated in running competition,
- 6. One student from 10th grade got 1st prize in Recitation of Bhagavad Gita slokas.

#### Overall observation:

Considering the location of the school and the students served who come from very poor families struggling to earn their daily bread, support for this school needs to be continued. Copies of all the documents gathered from the site visit & are attached.
