### 2. When was the group established?

### 3. Briefly describe the motivation for starting this group.

Immediately after the Bengal famine in 1943, the Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama at the instance of Swami Lokeswarananda first served as a Student's Home in North Kolkata (Pathuriaghata). The Ashrama is a branch centre of Raqmakrishna Mission, Belur Math. Started with a Home for the poor and needy students and with the development of the local 'Dom' Community. The Ashrama Campus was then shifted to Narendrapur and in the year 1956. Lokasiksha Parishad was constituted as a development wing of the Ashrama. The Lokasiksha Parishad initially started with Adult Education coupled with Child Development Programme.

### 4. Briefly describe the aims of your group.

Initially the Parishad was engaged in providing education to the children and adult alike in a non-formal way. Lokasiksha Parishad then expanded its activities from education to other activities pertaining to rural development through its affiliated village level organisations for the implementation of its activities entrusted to them. The various other activities undertaken by the Lokasiksha Parishad are Rural Development, Running of Pre-primary education for the children in the form of Vivekananda Child Development Programme, Vocational and Life Skill Education and Entrepreneurial Development Programme. Human Resource Development in the form of Adult Night High School and Rabindra Mukta Vidyalaya. Besides education, the Parishad also undertook various development activities like Water and Sanitation, Joint forest Management, ICDS, Chalaman Bahini (a peripatetic troupe), Health and Family Welfare and Animal Husbandry.

## 5. Does your group have any religious or political affiliation? If yes, please describe the type of affiliation and the reason for its.

Ramakrishna Mission Lokasiksha Parishad is the development wing of Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama, Narendrapur which in turn is the branch centre of Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math.

### 6. What non education-related community development activities is your group involved in?

Vocational and life skill education and entrepreneurial Development of the rural youths (both men and women), Water and Sanitation, Joint Forest Management, ICDS Chalaman Bahini for the over all development of the rural children in the age group of 6 to 14 yrs., Animal Husbandry.

Presently we are running 123 Pre-primary Schools for the rural area children, living in remote villages, of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  to below 6 years of age under Vivekananda Child Development Programme (VCDP). The Centres are distributed in the following districts: East Midnapore-44, West Midnapure-32, South 24-Parganas-25, Murshidabad-9, Burdwan-2, Howrah-2, Hooghly-1, Purulia-8.

### 10. Please tell us about your teaching techniques (conventional vs. alternative).

Though few books have been prescribed, education is not restricted to books only and are provided in a joyful manner involving the nature surrounding them. Teaching and learning materials are used to create a playful ambience in the class room situation to involve the children in the process of learning.

The centres are spread over 8 districts of West Bengal in 123 Villages. As such the literacy rate in the locality of 123 is not readily available.

## 12. Describe the socio-economic background of the children and their parents (e.g. education, occupational). If any of your students are employed, please tell us about that as well.

The children under the VCDP Programme mostly come from the families whose main occupation is based on agriculture. The parents are mostly agricultural labourers and few are rickshaw pullers, masons, small trader, weaver etc.

## 13. In addition to education, does your group provide any other services to the children in your schools (e.g. food, health care, clothing, etc.)?

Occasionally Puja dresses are provided to the children to quite a few VCDP centres depending upon availability of fund. Food is provided only to the children of 8 centres in Purulia district where the children are mostly from the tribal community. Health Care is provided in the form of awareness among the mothers on Nutrition education, immunization, Pre-natal and post natal care by mothers, care of adolescent children. Mothers meetings are held every month at each of the VCDP Centres.

## 18. How many children have gone through your programme in the past five years and what are they doing currently? Please tell us about their future education and employment possibilities.

Nearly 9000 children have been admitted in the primary schools during the last five years.

## 19. Do you help your students with their future education efforts after they have passed out of your school?

The pre-primary schools have two stages - Phase-I and Phase-II. After going through the Phase-II stage and after attaining the age of 6 years, the children are helped out through their parents to get admitted in Class-I in the Government run primary schools for main streaming.

20. Are there any other schools (Kindergarten/Balwadi, Elementary school, High school) in the area? If so, please list the schools and the range of classes each of them offers. In the neighbourhood of our Pre-Primary Schools (VCDP Centres) there are no other schools to provide Pre-primary education except a few ICDS Centres though a bit for off.

### 21. Is your program different from that provided at these schools? Please explain.

The children are taught in our VCDP Centres in a joyful and playful environment in the lap of nature surrounding them. In our centres, the average number of children is 40 only and they are looked after by two trained lady teachers all the time during school hours which lasts for  $3\frac{1}{2}$  hrs. These children have made their marks after mainstreaming in formal Govt. Primary Schools.

## 22. Why are the children in your school/s not attending government/other schools in the local area?

In our VCDP Centres the children are in the age of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  yrs. to below 6 yrs. and are made ready for mainstreaming in formal Govt. Schools (Primary). Whereas in the Govt. Primary Schools, the minimum age for admission in Class-I is 6 yrs. and above.

## 23. Do you try to involve the parents of the children in the running of the school (e.g. in setting the syllabus etc.)? Please specify.

The parents suggestions, if any, are taken into consideration in setting syllabus.

# 24. What are your expansion plans for the future (e.g. adding more classes or schools)? There is no provision for adding more classes at the Pre-primary stage i.e. children below 6 yrs. of age. Presently there is no plan to increase number of schools.

## 25. Do you have any suggestions on how Asha can be a positive influence in changing the education scenario in India?

Asha can have a positive influence in changing the education scenario of West Bengal by extending their support to the rural children in remote villages.
