

Awantika Vidhya Bhavan Updates & Funding Proposal:

The school has expanded from a K-Class 10 school to a K-Class 12 school in the last year. The number of children in the school has expanded from 404 students to 476 students, with a ratio of 271 boys to 205 girls. There are currently 18 teachers in the school, with a 30 to 1 student to teacher ratio. The school has an overall attendance rate of 90%. The classes are currently taught in Hindi, but Awantika Vidhya Bhavan is attempting to switch to English. The school is in a rural area, where most of the children are from families of poor farmers and manual laborers. The school has two buses, which they use to transport the children from their neighborhoods to the school. In the last six months, the school has improved in several ways:

1. Cow shed was completed. In one and half months 12 cows were purchased, which are being used by the school as a source of income, and to feed nursery children.
2. Sticking and embroidery classes are in progress. This year diploma in stitching has been given by Usha International. Second batch of ladies and girls will be starting in the month of April 2011.
3. Courtyard has been paved.
4. Cultivation of Vegetables, pulses and flowers is continuing. These produce are purchased by our school staff, and near by villagers.
5. Science laboratory has more equipment, chemical and specimens.
6. From Jan.2011 Awantika Vidhya Bhavan has started music class, more than 100 students are learning music and musical instrument like tabala and harmonium.
7. Agriculture as a subject has been introduced in the school syllabus, classes are in progress. Theory and practical classes are held regularly. Students are learning new farming techniques.
8. Girls who are interested in agriculture are attending agriculture classes, other girls are learning embroidery & stitching.

Currently, the school is requesting money to pay teachers' salaries, accountant salaries, and the Provident Fund.

They could not get nursery, trained teachers as they were demanding more salary.

All the * marked teachers have undergone nursery - Primary training they have been paid Rs. 5000/-

The other trained teachers are also demanding increase in the salary to Rs.5000/- per month

Kindly Sanctioned Accountant salary from April 2011. Rs.3000/- Per Month

As per government Rules they have to pay the provident fund 12% in favor of teachers to the government account.
