- 1. Approximately how many families live in the area? Students from 6 districts or nearly entire south Gujarat come to Kedi. Criteria is to admit most disadvantaged students who:
- 1. Come from remote areas.
- 2. Not accepted by other schools
- 3. Coming from poor family
- 4. Max 40 students per Standard, 2 classes per Std
- 5. Students come from long distances of 15 KM to 150 KM from Six districts. Students from Narmada & Tapi districts are better as their mother tongue is Gujarati and generally are from second generation school goers. Students of Dharampur and Kaprada are from the border area with Maharsahtra and their mother tongue is a mix of Gujarati & Marathi. Their learning in the primary school is not as good due to the language barrier. They are also generally first generation school goers.

	<i>Comments</i> : Students need intensive teaching as they come from Government schools where learning is poor due to various problems associated with remote Tribal areas.		

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#### 10. Do the children seem to enjoy coming to school?

Yes. They are an enthusiastic bunch. Jyoti & I meet all students in groups of 20-25. They talk about their friends and families, about their aspirations

We have been visiting them every year for the last 11 years. They feel at home to talk with us, especially with Jyoti. We tell them to feel free to tell us about good & bad of the school. Aparnaben generally goes away so that the students can talk freely.

Most of the girls are happy about the school and aware of many opportunities offered by the school. A few grumble about hard work, but then in their innocent, tribal way, also tell us that hard work is good.

Some girls come from very poor families and are required to work on construction site as casual worker during summer holidays. Kedi arranges special classes for such stuudents and they happily return to Kedi for the summer, thereby avoiding backbreaking work.

Vocational training helps them get jobs in the industries after they finish further studies. 90 % of exstudents are working with a good career. It is remarkable in India for so many women to find good jobs.

Resource persons & Volunteers at Kedi

Kedi has been reaching out to well-known people in academics, literature and arts to enrich the learning experiences of students. Kedi is known as an enlightened institution and some very good people respond and visit Kedi to share & teach.

Knowledgeable resource persons can enrich students' mind and enhance knowledge by provoking curiosity and learn to find solutions.

Mahendrabhai Parekh is an Architect and an Artist who teaches Math through Art as a volunteer. He taught at an architecture college in Baltimore before retirement and returning to India.

Dr. Yoginbhai Parikh, a retired surgeon in Illinois, volunteers for about 6 months a year at Kedi, teaching English & science to all students. His 6th and 7th standard students staged two short plays written and translated by them. He stays at our Guest house.

Suryakant Shah, a senior IT person at Pfizer in New York, has retired and has bought a home on ARCH-Kedi campus. He will help with Statistics and Business Management. His wife Bhavnaben will help with various Vocational and Academic subjects.

Dr. Sudarshanbhai Iyengar, retired Vice Chancellor of Gujarat Vidyapeeth, has built his home on Arch-Kedi campus. He is a Trustee and a mentor of Kedi. He is always interacting with students & staff, and guiding them. He may hold Gandhikatha at Kedi for our students and community

Dr. Mahendrabhai Chotalia, retired head of Education dept. at V.V. Univ, visits Kedi once a month for teachers' trainings and reading workshops.

Dr. Hiren Shah, a professor, who holds a Visharad degree in dance and music held 4 workshops. He was quite impressed and happy by students' response and the speed, easy way and interest they showed for classical dance. He has agreed to come once in three months for the same.

Bombay based NGO, Gillo, will hold 2 full day's workshop along with three performances on String Puppetry.

Mr. Sundaram Shubhratanam, an IIT-IIM graduate, had worked with Rishi Valley and was Principal of the well-known Atul Vidyalaya. He visits Kedi for Mathematics teacher's training. This year, 5 teachers will go to Chennai to visit him and other 4 schools in TN for training & sharing.
