3. Resource Person Expenses

We had many young people from urban areas coming here as volunteers. These youngsters help our team with certain skills while learning and gaining experience themselves. We feel that we also have a responsibility of raising awareness among urban youth about rural and tribal issues. That is part of our education programme.

We had Sunder from Delhi helping with English classes for eight months, Muthu Chellappan from Coimbatore helping with architecture work and supervision for nine months, Madan and Jaishanker, architecture students from Hosur helping with site work, for three months, Nandini ,a fine art student from Chennai, helping with Art, Ram and Archana from Bangalore helping with teaching and administration etc.

Wealsohadfourteachertrainingworkshops:Two by Purnima, one workshop by Jessica, one by Nikhita. We had a ten day long

dance and music workshop. For the BT course boys we had Perumal come in for electrical and electronic workshops. Some of our teachers are attending a yoga workshop once a month! A group of teacher s and students from Marudam came for two days and planted trees in our land !

We had two groups of students from Marudam visiting Thulir. We could not charge them for food as Marudam paid for our food whenever our group went there.

4. Campus Maintenance:

Major portion of this expense relates to refurbishing of the houses where the school is currently located.
